DISCUSSION GUIDE December 24, 2023

WEARY WORLD, REJOICE: JOY Luke 2:10

1.	In Luke 2:10 the angel speaks of "good news of great joy." How is it possible to have joy in a weary world? See 1 Peter 1:8–9, Nehemiah 8:10 and John 16:20–22 for further understanding.
2.	The angel found it necessary to speak of "good news of great joy that will be for all the people" (Luke 2:10). In your thinking, what is the full scope of "all the people" and how does this inform the way you express Jesus' love to others?
3.	Carefully read the words of the Apostle Paul in Philippians 4:4–9. What choices do you need to make for Paul's vision to be reflected in your life? How will Paul's words motivate you to serve someone else?
4.	You have opportunity to share the "good news" with the people in your life. What do you say? Consider Luke 2:16–18 as a helpful example.
