

# DISCUSSION GUIDE December 31, 2023

### **COVERING**

PSdIII 32.1
1. Carefully read Psalm 32. What lessons within the psalm stand out to which you must pay attention?
2. The word "blessed" in Psalm 32:1 means "abundant joy or happiness" and "wonderful blessedness." What can it look like for you, as one forgiven because of the work of Jesus, to embody the meaning behind the word "blessed"? How will others benefit from their experience with you?
3. Using Psalm 32:1 practice sharing the good news (the gospel) of Jesus with a friend. See Romans 5 and Hebrews 9:11–15 for further insight.
4. Quoting from Psalm 32, the Apostle Paul builds a case that salvation through Jesus is for "many nations" (Romans 4:17, 18). How does the Lord's heart for the nations inform your intentional connection to the different ethnicities (from the biblical word for "nations") and cultures crossing your path?
