Exodus 24:1-8

A Covenant Gift

Grace and God's Initiative

1. The sermon emphasizes that God initiates grace—we don't decide to come to Him; He invites us. How does this understanding of God's initiative change the way you view your own salvation?
2. Pastor Clint said, "We don't bring anything to our salvation except the sin that makes it necessary." Does this comfort you or challenge you? Why?
3. What are some practical ways God has pursued you in your life? Looking back, where do you see His grace at work to bring you to this point?

Our Need for an Intercessor

1. Exodus 24:2 shows that only Moses could come near to God on behalf of the people. How does this Old Testament picture deepen your appreciation for Jesus as our intercessor?
2. The sermon lists several roles Jesus fills: substitute, example, champion, intercessor, coming King. Which of these do you most need to focus on right now, and why?

Response and Commitment

1. Twice in this passage (verses 3 and 7), the people say, "All that the Lord has spoken, we will do." Yet we know they failed. What's the difference between sincere intention and lasting commitment?
2. Is there an area of your life where you've outwardly claimed faith but inwardly compromised? What would true surrender look like for you?

The Bible

1. Pastor Clint describes God's Word using multiple metaphors: food, water, lamp, sword, mirror, seed. Which metaphor best describes what you need from Scripture right now?
2. How consistently are you reading and studying the Bible? What practical step could you take this week to engage more deeply with God's Word?

Peace and Forgiveness

1. The sermon points to the bloody covenant ceremony and says, "Without the shedding of blood, there is no forgiveness of sins." Why is the blood of Jesus central to the gospel and not just a symbolic detail?
2. Where in your life do you most need God's peace right now? How does knowing that "Christ himself is our peace" (Ephesians 2:14) speak to that need?

Application

1. If you were to summarize today's sermon in one sentence to share with someone who wasn't here, what would you say?
2. What is one specific action you will take this week in response to what God has shown you through this message?
