

NEW! COMPOSTING AT BETHEL HIGHLANDS CAMPUS BATHROOMS

We are excited to introduce composting of paper towels in our bathrooms at Highlands. This is part of our effort to reduce Bethel's contribution to landfills and greenhouse gas emissions. Soon, you will notice the addition of a receptacle and signage in the Highlands bathrooms that will direct you to place your used paper towels (only) in a composting bin, and everything else in a trash bin. We need your help – please read the signs, and place your paper towels in the appropriate bin. Everything else goes in the trash bin. Help your children and grandchildren learn this new routine. We'll form this habit together, in no time.

Early in 2023, the Creation Care Team began helping the congregation compost paper products and food waste at Lenten Suppers and other Bethel events. When we do this, only butter packets and creamer cups go in the trash. For example, at the final Lenten Supper of 2024, we collected about one gallon of trash destined for the landfill. And, we collected about 120 gallons of compostable waste headed for the composting site in Hastings. Composting paper towels used in the Highlands bathrooms will expand these efforts less for the landfill and more soil for farms and gardens!

If we can recruit additional volunteer composting coaches, we can expand composting at Bethel even more. Would you be interested in volunteering once every month or two at a Bethel event, to gently guide Bethel members in placing their trash in the appropriate bin? Or, would you be willing to drive bags of compost to Hastings? Training will be provided to all volunteers! 
