CAFÉ DISCUSSION GUIDE

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LEVITICUS 23:22; 1 CORINTHIANS 12:14-26

As you gather, read the other side of this page about the topic for today. Once gathered, spend a few minutes introducing everyone. Say this prayer or one of your choosing:

Dear God,

The problem of climate change seems overwhelming. Melt the hearts of those who turn their backs on the problem and lead us all to find solutions together. Give us courage to speak out and change our own lives when we need to, in big ways and small.

Amen.

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Watch the YouTube video "Self Sustainable Zero Waste Productive Home in Melbourne Demonstrates Future—Gardening Australia" (bit.ly/FMZeroWaste, 8:54). Discuss:

- The interviewer says the place gives us a glimpse of what is possible. What did you see that you wish were more possible?
- The owner said that the world has reached a place where we have to do something. What do you think that something is?

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Read "Summary of the Practice" on the other side of this page and discuss how this session title "Share the Planet" is both a statement of fact and a plea to those with resources to do something. Read "Finding the Practice in the Bible" on the other side of this page. Read Leviticus 23:22 and 1 Corinthians 12:14–26. Spend a few minutes in silence and write ways your life and actions impact people in other parts of the

world in positive and negative ways.

SUMMARY OF THE PRACTICE

As far as we know, there is only one planet like earth in the universe. God provided it with precious but limited resources. That may seem like common knowledge to us today, but it was not in the minds of previous generations. We now know that some resources, like coal and gas, are nonrenewable, or finite, and will run out. In addition, when we burn them, we have known for some time that air quality deteriorates, affecting everyone.

This third aspect—Share the Planet—is a statement and also either a plea or a challenge, depending on where one sits in terms of access to resources and power. It is a statement because it is fact. We all share one planet, one creation. We can decide to live together in harmony or fight each other to our peril. For most of the world, it is a plea to those with power—governments, businesses, those with wealth—to use resources wisely and share rather than hoard and misuse them. For those with resources, it is a challenge in multiple ways. It is a challenge to take only what they need, to share what they have, and to make policies so that a more equitable and sustainable lifestyle may be enjoyed by all God's children.

FINDING THE PRACTICE IN THE BIBLE

The book of Leviticus has some very specific instructions about sharing land and resources. Leviticus 23:22 was very practical for those living in previous times when most people with land were farmers and rural life was the norm for most people. The larger structural practice of Jubilee described in Leviticus 25 was impactful in that it regularly freed those enslaved, forgave debt accumulated, and returned property to those who lost it, so that, theoretically, no one would be permanently relegated to poverty. This sharing of resources on a societal level was designed to help prevent massive income inequality.

In 1 Corinthians 12:14–26, Paul reflects on the nature of the body of Christ. There is one body, he says, but many members, each with an important role to play and gifts to offer. When we recognize that we are all connected because we are all part of God's creation, we think differently about how our actions impact people in other parts of the world. If we are all part of one body, everything we do has implications for the rest of the body.

FINDING THE PRACTICE THEN AND NOW

- Church World Service (cwsglobal.org) responds to communities devastated by natural disasters all over the world, an occurrence that happens more frequently as climate change worsens. They also work with refugee resettlement, an increasing need as more and more people are displaced due to a changing climate.
- Wesley United Methodist Church in Phoenix, Arizona, converted an unused preschool into a place where local people and their pets who are struggling with homelessness and poverty can come and get food, shower, do laundry, and get connected with social services.
