

# Welcome Project Update

April 2024

# **Construction Continues!**

As we celebrate our past during this 150<sup>th</sup> year, we continue to build toward the future by starting construction on the Welcome Project! Here's the latest:

 Construction continues with the demolition of the existing lift and the removal of the front doors and windows. Please continue to follow the access directions provided below.

#### Changes to Access to First Presbyterian during Construction:

- The main entrance is closed and walled off inside to limit the noise and disruption to the main Church facility. Access to the administrative offices is through the choir robe room.
- Access for mobility challenged individuals is on the NORTH SIDE (Chippewa Street) of the building through the door into the library. The ramp accommodates walkers, wheelchairs, electric scooters, strollers, etc. There are 10 parking spaces available there that are reserved for those with mobility issues. If necessary, parking assistance may be provided to those who request it.
- Access for all other church members is through the door from the WEST parking lot up the stairs into the Fellowship Hall.
- If you would like to help welcome visitors, VOLUNTEER AS AN USHER it's an easy way to get involved and we need more help while this project disrupts our normal entryway.
- Members or guests visiting the church during the week will need to call the office number to be let into
  one of the locked doors. We appreciate your patience and understanding of these changes to protect
  staff and provide limited access to the building during work hours.

## **Financial Update:**

- Thank You for Your Support--As construction begins, we marvel at the support and enthusiasm our congregation has shown for this important project. As of February 18, 2024, we have already received \$375,701 in paid pledges toward the project, and have \$184,167 in pledges yet to come. We are so grateful for those pledges and for the faithful payments to fulfill them. The faster we receive the contributions, the less we will need to borrow (and pay interest on) to pay our builders as construction begins until pledge payments are received.
- Closing The Gap Despite the amazing support, we still have a gap between the total project cost and pledges and cash received to date Help us close the gap! The table below reflects only new pledges or new cash gifts; not cash paid against existing pledges.
