Building a Future with Hope

Reese Fosdick (Contemporary Service)

After growing up attending Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, and youth groups, I have grown my own faith and deepened the faith of others. During the youth trip to Alaska, I got to meet so many people and organizations that contribute to their community and it was so fun to be a part of that....I'd like to thank everyone who has given not only money but their time and service to provide ways for not only youth but all of our members to get more involved and deepen their faith.

Halle Misico (Traditional Service)

I have attended this church since I was born. This year I became a member through confirmation. Confirmation class was awesome. I will become a Deacon in January! ...Being out of town and attending other churches makes me understand just how much it feels like home here. The people, community and families are unique and special. I know how special this church is, and I feel blessed to be a part of it.

Lynne Sheldon (Traditional Service)

I've always believed that God puts you where you need to be ,and He puts people in your life that you need. ...The Deacons had a very busy year serving at six funerals. It's an honor and a privilege to organize luncheons and help families going through difficult times. ...We have a great team - women, men, young and not so young – who all work together efficiently.
