Lenten sermons this year will begin on Sunday, March 9 and include 6 lessons. Pastor Jim and the Adult Education ministry team have been working together to coordinate the opportunities for deepening our faith during Lent. Pastor Jim will be basing his sermons on the book Entering the Passion of Jesus-A Beginner's Guide to Holy Week by Amy Jill (AJ) Levine. Ms. Levine is a Bible scholar who has concentrated her studies on the New Testament. She brings a scholarly in-depth and yet totally readable approach to Jesus' last week on earth. As a Jew she is able to intertwine the Jewish holidays and traditions that Jesus was honoring and helps us to understand more fully all the opposing powers that were at work.

Did you know your Safety/Security Team has lifesaving medical equipment on hand?

The main first aid station is located on the first floor by the ladies restroom and includes:

- A.E.D defibrillator (1 in the Lighthouse)
- Fully stocked first aid kit (2 in Lighthouse and 1 in every main church room and nursery)
- EpiPens (used for allergic reaction 2 in Lighthouse)
- Tourniquets for severe wounds (2 in Lighthouse)
- Ambu bag used for respiration assist in CPR (infant ambu bag in nursery)
- Hot/cold packs (1 in Lighthouse)
- Narcan used in accidental overdose (1 in Lighthouse)
- CPR masks used in breathing assist during CPR
- Life Vac used in food choking victims (adult/infant units in main kitchen, Lighthouse, and nursery)
- Panic alarms in main office and nursery if activated, alarms go directly to Safety team member's phone for quick response.
- Main first aid station for Lighthouse is located by the main entrances first floor.
- All Safety/Security members certified in CPR from infant to adults nursery also certified, all properly instructed in the proper use of the A.E.D, and first aid. Again, including the nursery personnel.
