Special Offering for Empty Bowls & One Great Hour of Sharing – Sunday, June 8

On Sunday June 8, there will a special offering for Empty Bowls and One Great Hour of Sharing. **Empty Bowls** is a fundraiser for Food Rescue which rescues, harvests, repacks, and distributes 2 million pounds of food annually in NW Michigan — that's \$3.34 million worth of food! 100% of donations this year go to the **Farm2Neighbor** program. This program purchases fresh fruits and vegetables from local farmers and distributes them to hungry neighbors through local pantries and meal sites which includes 7 food pantries in Antrim County. Food pantries participating in the **Farm2Neighbor** program have reported a 39% increase food pantry visits.

Every gift to **One Great Hour of Sharing** supports efforts to relieve hunger through the Presbyterian Hunger Program, promote development through the Presbyterian Committee on the Self-Development of People, and assist in areas of disaster through Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. All three programs work in different ways to serve individuals and communities in need. From initial disaster response to ongoing community development, their work fits together to provide people with safety, sustenance, and hope. The Outreach Ministry Team will match all giving up to \$1,000 for this special offering for Empty Bowls and One Great Hour of Sharing on Sunday, June 8.
