Outreach and Mission Ministry Team Volunteer Opportunities

According to Food Rescue: "35% of households struggle with access to healthy food and 40% of good food goes to waste." **Gleaning** - to gather leftover produce after a harvest that would otherwise go to waste, is one way to alleviate this issue.

There are currently opportunities to glean fruit and vegetables both locally and in the surrounding areas. Food Rescue's Healthy Harvest program works to reduce food waste and address food insecurity. Do A Little Good is in contact with many local farmers to obtain dates when gleaning is available. All of the produce gleaned is given to area food pantries. You and your family can help make a difference by participating in gleaning fruits and vegetables that would otherwise go to waste.

Unfortunately, there is often only a 1-2 day notice of these opportunities. We are compiling a list of people who would be interested in participating in gleaning.
