1. A free mobile app is available in the Apple® App Store and the Google Play™ Store. Search for "Instant Church Directory" to download. Important: Your email address must be listed in the directory before you can log in. This is for your phone, kindle or iPad.

2. To access the directory on your computer, go to https://members.instantchurchdirectory.com/ and enter your email address as listed in the directory. Click on "Send Secure Sign-In Link." Then check your email and click on the "Log in to Instant Church Directory" button found in your email.

If you have difficulty logging in, please contact Peg Burns at kpcburns@gmail.com for assistance. You must have a valid email address on file with the church office to be able to log in to the new directory.

We will have Tech Help Sundays on September 21 and September 28 between services to help you download the app to your phone, iPad, Kindle, or other mobile devices.

The directory is designed so that you can add (and change!) your picture at any time. There are 2 ways to do that:

- 1. Upload your own favorite photo using the mobile app or website. Under the menu setting, you will find an option to "Edit My Family". This is where you can upload a photo, correct directory information, add additional information and make phone numbers or email addresses private.
- 2. Send a favorite family photo via email or text to Peg Burns at kpcburns@gmail.com or (616) 901-0960. It doesn't have to be a formal picture just one that you love of your family or yourself!
