



WHO MAKES OUR PRODUCTS?

WAR, Int'l. has worked with partners in over 51 countries, including Uganda, Sudan, India, Thailand, Nepal, Pakistan, Kosovo, the Dominican Republic, the United States, and many other countries.

Not all of our partnerships involve product. Product comes primarily from three types of programs: micro-enterprises, vocational training centers, and safe houses. Micro-enterprises and vocational training centers are generally formed around product creation, providing employment and skills training.

Some of our products are made by at-risk women and some by rescued women. Some of our products are even made by at-risk or rescued men. We also carry a few items that are not made by those at risk but are sold in support of them, like books. Our products fall into three categories based on the types of programs that produce them:

PREVENTATIVE

Preventative programs focus on those at risk, striving to "rescue" vulnerable women, men and children from exploitation before it escalates.

CURATIVE

Curative programs provide therapeutic communities in which those who were trafficked, abused, or abandoned can find safety, comfort, and healing.

SUPPORTIVE

Supportive programs help to maintain and expand WAR's projects. Supportive products include items like books, necklace extenders, and Pray for WAR Babies bracelets.

WHERE DO THE PROFITS GO?

As mandated by the WAR Int'l board, at least ninety percent of the profit from product sales goes back into the programs.

HOW ARE THEY PAID?

The women and men are paid 100% of what they are promised, by the piece or by the hour.

Pay varies from one program to the next, as each program is adjusted to the needs of the women and men it serves and the values of the culture.

Many of our partners calculate wages based on the average salary of local elementary school teachers, placing the women's income level well above what is normally earned by similar artisans and crafters in their countries.

In addition, she or he also receives "benefits" such as child care, medical care, and vocational scholarships.

ARE ANY PRODUCTS MADE IN THE U.S.?

Yes! In the case of the domestically trafficked, WAR Int'l does partner with multiple safe houses in the U.S.

We have also started our own non-residential program in West Michigan, the U.S. Training Center, which provides counseling and vocational training within a safe and nurturing environment.
