### Vestry approves co-rector model of leadership Creating a new leadership model at Holy Spirit

At their March meeting the Vestry voted to approve a new model of ministry for Holy Spirit. Rev. Terri and Rev. Gretchen will become corectors, and the change will be official by mid-April. New letters of agreement will be drawn up, and their new job descriptions, dividing all of the rector duties in half, will be clarified and put in writing.

The spark that set this change in motion was our growing deficit. Rev. Terri recognized it was time to do things differently. She boldly suggested that she might cut back to half time. And then she invited Rev. Gretchen to transition out of her (half time) role as the assistant and to share the rector position with her. So both at half time, together they will share the rector responsibilities. This will eliminate one half time position and help to reduce our deficit. Rev. Gretchen will continue her role as rector at St. Paul's in Hamilton. Rev. Terri may seek additional employment as well.

All of this means our staffing will be leaner, but we hope, pray and trust that it will also enable our clergy to continue in their work, healthy and strong, and that it will refresh our vision of ministry, increase our sense of fun and continue the momentum that we experienced during our sabbatical time. Please pray for Holy Spirit, for our clergy, and for our laity, as we all engage this time of change.

## Join us at our Spring Blood Drive set for April 4 **Roll up your sleeves and help save lives**

Holy Spirit Parsh will host its annual spring blood drive on Thursday, April 4, from 1:00 – 6:00 p.m. in the Parish Hall.

People donate blood for a variety of reasons. Some of us give blood because we were asked by a friend. Some know that a family member or a friend might someday need blood. Some believe it is the right thing to do. Some may do it for the cookies and juice. Everyone enjoys the feeling of helping save lives! Whatever your reason, we thank you for signing up to make a donation.

The American Red Cross offers the following suggestions to help you prepare for your blood donation.

**Between donations:** Eat plenty of iron-rich foods to help replace the iron lost when giving blood. Foods rich in iron include red meat, fish, poultry, beans, broccoli, spinach, raisins, prunes, iron-fortified cereal. Also, foods rich in vitamin C (such as citrus fruit) help your body absorb the iron you eat.

**Before donation:** Get a good night's sleep, eat a good breakfast or lunch, and make sure you are feeling well.

**Day of donation:** Drink extra water and other fluids before and after your appointment. Eat foods containing lean proteins or complex carbohydrates, such as bread, cereal, fruit and lean meat, but avoid fatty foods. After your donation, spend 10-15 minutes at the hospitality table. Have a drink and a snack to rejuvenate yourself. Avoid any heavy lifting or strenuous exercise for the rest of the day.

#### For your appointment:

- Be sure to bring your donor card or government issued photo I.D.
- Wear sleeves that can be raised above the elbow.







## Join us for Centering Prayer on April 16

All are welcome to a circle of silent prayer. Centering Prayer is a meditation process that invites us to an inner sacred space to quiet our minds, open our hearts and take rest in the Love of God.

We begin by sitting in a circle in an attitude of openness of mind and heart. A leader will direct the circle to breathe deeply and to open one's heart and mind for the presence of God. A reading will be given, a chime will be rung, and the silence begins. We sit in this Holy silence for 20 to 25 minutes, and then another chime will ring, calling us quietly to return to the presence of others. The leader will offer a closing prayer or reading. At this point, some will choose to leave in silence. Others may remain for the rest of our time to ask auestions or offer their experience of "sitting" in this Holy silence. We then leave at 5pm.

We meet in the Guild Room at Holy Spirit. We gather at <u>4pm</u> <u>and leave at 5pm every third</u> <u>Tuesday</u> of the month. **We will meet on Tuesday, April 16.**

# The Spring Market 2024 is just weeks away!



## From the Holy Spirit Memorial Foundation An introduction to Planned Giving

Planned giving is sometimes called the "how "of giving. It naturally follows the "why" – the motivation or reason we want to give to a cause in the first place. As Episcopalians we all have our own personal reasons for wanting to make a planned gift to support the organizations and ministries that are meaningful to us.

Throughout Holy Spirit's history, caring parishioners have provided support beyond annual pledge offerings with planned gifts. These gifts, large and small, reflect each parishioner's life values and dedication to supporting Holy Spirit Parish and our ministries. These planned gifts are also investments that can sustain our community of faith and service well into the future.

In future editions of the *Paraclete* and the online *Spirited Times* we will share the different ways you can participate in planned giving to our Parish through immediate, deferred or life income gifts.
