Worship Insights

The Seventh Sunday after Pentecost

Jesus does great deeds of power and gives his disciples authority over demons. Yet none of this power is unilateral; it all must be received by faith. Jesus asks his disciples to go out without money or supplies, so that they will be dependent on how others receive them. When we are sent from the assembly to witness and to heal, we are asked to be vulnerable, to be dependent on the reception of others. The Spirit always operates in the "between": between Jesus and his Abba, between Jesus and us, between you and me, between us and those to whom we are sent.

Today's Readings

First Reading: Ezekiel 2:1-5 *In 597 BCE, the priest Ezekiel was removed into exile in Babylon. While there, he received a vision of God appearing majestically on a chariot throne. Today's reading recounts God's commissioning of Ezekiel during this vision. The prophet is to speak God's word to a people unwilling to hear.*

Psalm: Psalm 123 *Our eyes look to you, O God, until you show us your mercy.*

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 12:3-10 *Christians do* not boast of their own accomplishments. Rather, Christian boasting focuses attention on how the power of Christ is present in our lives, especially in times of weakness and vulnerability. No matter what our circumstances in life, Christ's grace is sufficient for us.

Today's Gospel Lesson

Gospel: Mark 6:1-13 At home and abroad, Jesus and his disciples encounter resistance as they seek to proclaim God's word and relieve affliction.

Sermon Reflection

When we encounter hard things in life, we have a choice to make. First, rise above the hard situation and live a full and positive life, knocking the dust off our sandals or second sink into the hard situation and live an empty and negative life allowing the dust to settle on our feet. What is your typical response when life gets hard? What course correction do you need to make?
