The 13 members of the Bethany Lutheran Church Council are seated in the Conference Room, addressing agenda items pertinent to the parishioners – things like upkeep of the stained-glass windows, building maintenance, liturgical decorations, and missional outreach projects. At the head of the table, Council President Mike Diercks presides. “Maintaining order is important to me,” Mike said. “Worship matters are central to the church council, and the business aspects of running the church are another thing entirely. Balancing those two sides is a delicate undertaking.”

He should know. Mike held the office of Mayor of Rice Lake from 2016 to 2022. And he has also served on the Bethany Church Council twice, where he now serves as President. Working hard is something that Mike has always done. He was born in Red Wing, Minnesota, raised Lutheran, and attended Sunday School and other church events growing up. He moved to Rice Lake on

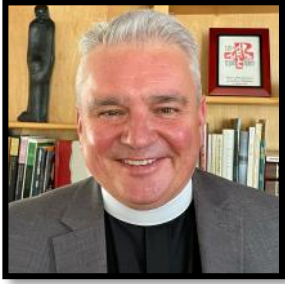
July 4, 1976, and he has been married twice and raised three children.

Mike was an Assistant Store Manager at Market Place Grocery Store in Rice Lake and has been a member of Bethany Lutheran Church for many years. His church family has stood with him during good times and bad, and God has been his strength on more than one occasion.

“On Memorial Weekend in 2006, my daughter Brenda was killed in a car accident,” Mike said. “She was 26 years old.” Brenda lived in Hudson, where she was an Evening Manager at the Super Value store. She had a medical condition that caused her to lose control of her vehicle on that dark night. It was a devastating loss. “My belief in God got me through it,” Mike said. “Only faith in Him helped me get through those difficult days.” And God has guided his life throughout subsequent years as well. A proponent of serving the public and lifelong learning experiences, Mike also spends his free time with family and friends – many of them from Bethany. At home, he likes to watch educational programs on the History Channel and he enjoys comedies as well.



Hungry Hearts by Rev. Dr. Arthur Bergren, Lead Pastor



Alfred Lord Tennyson penned the poem, *Ulysses*. The poem is about the human soul. The poem reminds us that life is an adventure. Although Ulysses is aging, he remains “strong in will” and is driven to push onward relentlessly. The closing line of the poem is a call to arms, “To strive, to seek, to find, and not to yield.”

Tennyson is addressing the human soul. Early in the poem Tennyson writes, “For always roaming with a hungry heart.” Bruce Springsteen, an American song writer and performer, took notice of this phrase and wrote a classic rock tune.

A hungry heart is part of the human condition and the adventure of life. Everyone has a hungry heart. We all have empty spaces within our lives that cry out to be filled. If that’s the situation then question is what are we to do about it? How do we feed our hungry hearts?

Only God can satisfy our hungry hearts. When we find our hearts filled and rooted in God, it’s then and only then can we fully appreciate all that God has given us. When we place God first, all of life falls into place. Make no mistake, the best place to find God is the Church.

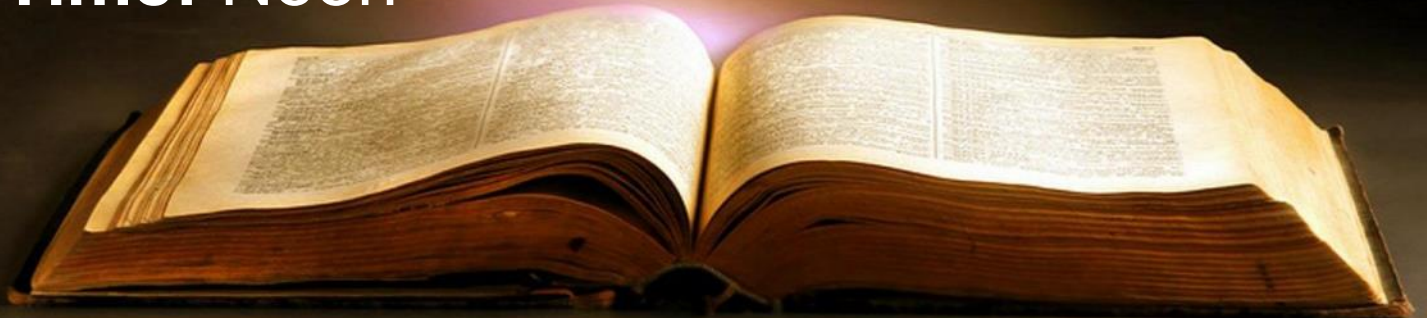

Northwest Synod of Wisconsin Synod Assembly: *Bishop Election*



This Synod Assembly was a special one for the ELCA churches in the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin. Once every 6 years there is an opportunity for an election of a Bishop in our Synod and on June 7 & 8 a new Bishop was elected. The Rev. Martin R. Halom, Bloomer, WI, was elected June 8 to serve a six-year term as bishop of the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The election took place during the synod assembly, June 7-8 at the W.R. Davies Student Center of the University of Wisconsin–Eau Claire.

Halom was elected on the fourth ballot, with 241 votes. The Rev. Karen Behling, pastor of Our Saviour's Lutheran Church in Chippewa Falls, Wis., received 57 votes. The bishop-elect has served as pastor of St. John's Lutheran Church in Bloomer since 2012. Previously he was associate campus pastor of University Lutheran Church in East Lansing, Mich. (2003-2012), and associate pastor of American Lutheran Church in Rantoul, Ill. (1999-2003). Halom earned his Bachelor of Arts in economics from Luther College, Decorah, Iowa, in 1993, and a Master of Divinity from Luther

Seminary, St. Paul, Minn., in 1999. Luther College is one of 26 ELCA colleges and universities; Luther Seminary is one of seven ELCA seminaries. He will be installed Sept. 15 (location to be determined). For more: <https://nswsi.org/synod-assembly-2024>

Green? by Rev. Sue Eidahl, Visitation Pastor



I don't know about you, but I sure am enjoying the beauty of this summer. While we probably have had more rain than we think necessary, it has provided us with lush green lawns and fields. As I've been driving around enjoying the countryside, a question came to mind about green color, so I did some research.

Our eyes are designed to see green more than any other color. Perhaps evolution led us to this adaptation to distinguish our food or to avoid getting lost in forests and jungles. There are around 300 shades of green, but I think they can be endless, since in nature, the colors depend not only on the tonality they reflect, but also on the quality and quantity of light. The golden, reddish, or pastel tones of

sunrise and sunset transform leaves' green colors.

My research got me thinking about Creation Psalms. Many of our Psalms include thanksgiving for creation. Let me share a couple.

Psalm 8: where, in considering the heavens that God has made, David asked what are human's significance? The answer is firmly based in creation, in that God made humans just a little lower than the heavenly beings, yet he has made humans the crown of creation, with glory and honor.

Psalm 148: This psalm contains the most detailed call for all creation to praise God. It starts with an appeal to the heavenly realms and to the sun, moon, and stars. In the psalms, this is always the order in which creation is presented. Heaven and things relating to heaven are mentioned first, followed by the earth. Praise always begins with a look at the sky, and the heavens are the first "telling of the glory of God."

Has the natural world lost some of its wonder in your eyes? Have you started to take for granted things God himself literally breathed into existence and sustains with his whispers? Does anything God made still quiet you?

Nothing we encounter is purposeless, or glory less, or truly "natural." We may notice the purpose and glory more in the grander aspects of creation, like oceans, lions, or mountains, but as Scripture teaches, even birds and lilies teach us about God. I think green can too!

So take time this summer to let yourself stop, and watch, and listen a little longer before something God has made, and expect to see something supernatural.

The Secret to Stewardship

"Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." (2 Cor. 9:7)

So, what's the secret to proper stewardship? Start with your heart, not your head. Paul says in our verse today, "Give what you decided in your heart to give." True stewardship is a faith thing, not a reason and logical thing. God calls us to move as our heart tells us to move and not as our logical minds might move. Second, he tells us "Not to give reluctantly or under compulsion." We need to freely give in such a way that the left hand doesn't want to pull out of the offering plate what the right hand just put in. We need to give as the Lord is moving us to give. It ought to be as freely given and God's grace is freely given to us. Last, Paul tells us to be "cheerful" givers. Stewardship should be an opportunity, not an obstacle. We ought to be giving God back some of the time, talents and treasures He has given us in a spirit of joy. We ought to be thankful that the Lord provides us the opportunity to thank Him in this awesome way.

May the secrets of stewardship move us to be cheerful givers!

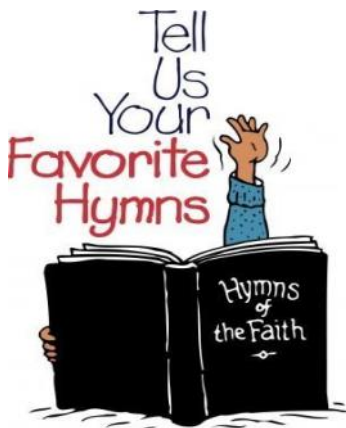

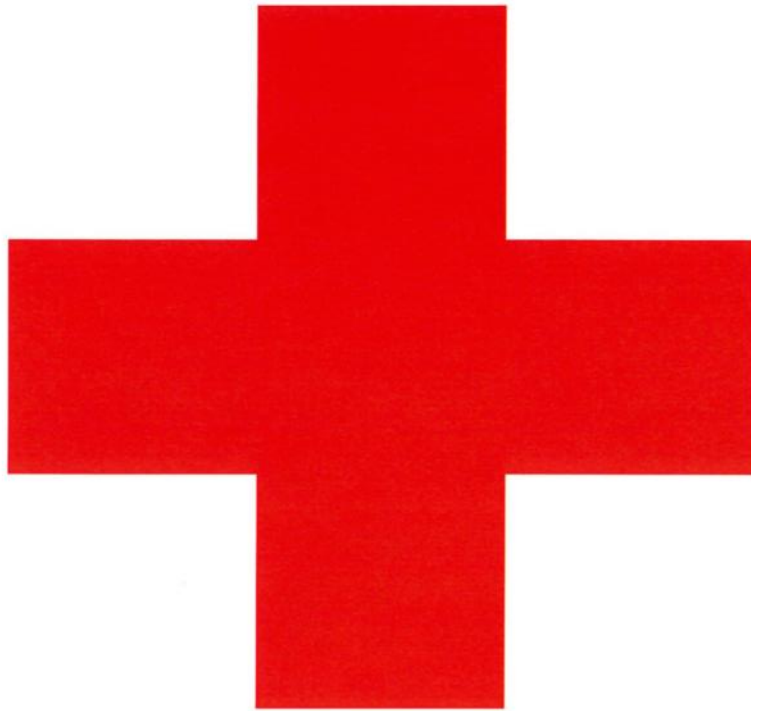
