

A Year Worth Remembering

His name was Leo Baekeland. He was born in 1863 in Belgium. He was gifted in the field of physics and chemistry. After a brief stint teaching in the university, he immigrated to America.

Baekeland worked at first as a photographic chemist and in 1891 he opened his own laboratory. In 1893 he began to manufacture a photographic paper, and six

years later his company was bought out by the Kodak Corporation. Financially independent, Baekeland returned to Europe to continue his studies in chemistry.

Baekeland's studies lead to a discovery. He created a substance which had a hard amberlike resin, which could be cast and machined. Not only that, the substance possessed durability and electrical properties. To put it simply, Baekeland discovered the first generation of plastics which he called Bakelite.

It's hard to imagine our world without plastics. When I look at my desk, I see plastics everywhere. My phone, computer keyboard, pens, and even the paperweight on my desk come from plastics. He made 1909 a year worth remembering.

As we enter into a new year of ministry, let's ask ourselves a question. How can we make 2024 a year worth remembering at Bethany Lutheran Church?

Just like Baekeland, I hope people remember what we produce. What is our product? It's love. We are people who share Christ's love. It's my desire that our sharing of Christ's love will be so compelling, faithful and clear that 2024 will be unforgettable.

As your pastor, I see signs of this around us. I see our people living generously with time, talent and treasure. I see our program ministry faithfully and creatively meeting the spiritual needs of our community. I see our leaders supporting and facilitating the work of Christ in Rice Lake and beyond. No ministry is perfect, including ours. There is always room for improvement. But on a daily basis, I see that we are a community of faith that is rooted in love.

I don't know what 2024 will bring. I don't know what joys and sorrows, what happiness and hardships will come our way in the world, in America or Rice Lake this year -- but I know this. Epiphany

Epiphany. The startling reality of something absolutely out of this world, full of amazement and awe. An overwhelming feeling of recognition and divine understanding taking hold.

Epiphany is a word used to describe the visit of the Magi, the three Wise Men, to the young Christ child, not long after his miraculous birth. A time we celebrate on

January 6th, just after the notable 12 days of Christmas.

Epiphany is a season that the secular world hardly recognizes. While it is a season of light, most households have removed the brightly colored Christmas lights and the nights again take on the darkness of winter. Epiphany is a season of celebration we recognize after Christmas, after the miraculous birth of Jesus took place. The three wise men, known as the Magi, visited the child they had heard about. They brought gifts and presented them to Jesus' parents at the end of their long journey. They gazed upon the face of a young child, a baby king, that was sent straight from the hand of God, through His Holy Spirit. The joy each Wise Man, perhaps a king in their own right, must have felt, as the stark realization hit, that THIS is the chosen one, the Christ child, the Savior come to heal this very broken world and bridge the gap between a sinful humanity and God the Father's perfect, all-encompassing love.

Epiphany. It happened then, at Jesus' birth. It happens now, in the heart of every Christian when they come to know Jesus, not only as the miraculous baby born hundreds of years ago, but as God with us. A divine Savior. As we consider the realization the Magi discovered when they met the young Christ child, may we also realize, each and every day, the spirit of the most high, that dwells inside the heart of each of us. Thank you to Eric Roethel and the Property Committee team for all their work over the last month to diagnose, research, and keep our boilers going.

The Council approved hiring Rock & Tait Exteriors out of Chippewa Falls to handle our roofing project. The roofs at Bethany were severely damaged in the July hailstorm and need to be replaced. This project will take place in May or June when the weather improves.
