

Sermon Discussion Guide

March 23, 2025

Use this discussion guide with your small group or by yourself, to dig into the text and theme of Sunday's message.

Key Point: Jesus gave himself, so we do too. Life Sharing: (answer one)

- 1. What were your family's rules about washing your hands or keeping yourself clean?
- 2. What do you do to prepare for a busy and/or stressful week?

Transition / Open in prayer

3. Describe a time you sacrificed something important for someone else, or when someone did that for you.

Life Examination:

READ John 18:4-18

- 4. What do you make of the back and forth in verses 4-9? (The repeated "I am He", the crowd drawing back and falling to the ground, the explanation of verse 9)
- 5. Peter shifted from grabbing a sword to denying Jesus. Why do you think that happened?
- 6. What is the "cup" Jesus refers to in verse 11?
- 7. Caiaphas' words from John 11:49-53 are referenced by John in this passage. Why was a death required, from Caiaphas' perspective and from a spiritual perspective?

READ Hebrews 9:11-17

- 8. Why is Jesus' sacrifice greater than the Old Testament sacrificial system? How did the old system prepare people for what Jesus would do?
- 9. Verse 15 uses the words "mediator" and "ransom" to describe Jesus. What do these words mean?
- 10. Why does the author of Hebrews bring up wills in verses 16-17?

Life Application:

- 11. Imagine being in the garden with Jesus when he was arrested. How would you have reacted? What would you have done?
- 12. When is it hard to speak openly and/or boldly for our faith?
- 13. What is a "cup" that you feel God has given you to bear?
- 14. Besides the sacrifice of Jesus, what are the ways people try to make themselves right with our Creator God?
- 15. If you left a spiritual "will" for your friends and family, what would you hope to leave them to remember you by?

Life Prayers: Pray for one another and ask God to help each of you live out the new life Jesus welcomes you into.
