

#### PSALM PRAYER

May our prayers come before you, O God, as incense, and may your presence surround and fill us, so that in union with all creation, we might sing your praise and your love in our lives.

#### Invitation to Observe a Lenten Discipline

#### Siblings in Christ:

Every year at Easter we celebrate with joy our redemption and renewal through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

The season of Lent is a time to prepare for this celebration and to make room in our lives for the Spirit of God to renew us in this mystery.

We begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance and our need for the love and forgiveness shown to us in Jesus Christ. I invite you, therefore, in the name of Christ, to observe a Holy Lent, by self-examination and penitence, by prayer and fasting, by practicing works of love, and by reading and reflecting on God's holy Word.

Let us begin our Lenten journey together in prayer, confessing our sins, and seeking the forgiveness and new life that is promised to us in Christ Jesus.

#### PRAYER OF CONFESSION

We bring our burdens and our sins to you, O Christ, who bears the heavy load for us.

We place upon you our excuses, our shortcomings, our anger and our desire; knowing that you can remove these sins from us and restore us to life.

We confess that we have gone astray.
We confess that we have not loved you fully and have not loved our neighbor as ourselves.
We confess that we have not fully loved even our very selves.

Forgive us of our sins.
Help us to turn back to you.
Restore what has been broken,
transform what has been twisted,
find what has been lost,
so we may be the living, loving image of you in creation.
In your precious name we pray.
Amen


