Lectio Divina

Before you begin, find a comfortable position and take a few moments to clear your mind.

1. READ

Read the scripture passage you have selected slowly, either silently or aloud, letting the words sink into your heart. As you are reading, listen for a word or phrase that stands out for you. It's important not to force things, but wait patiently for God to give gentle guidance.

2. REFLECT

Read the scripture passage a second time and listen for a word or phrase that reflects what Christ is saying to you today. It could be the same phrase or a different one. It is to focus further on the points you became aware of during the first reading. Try not to analyze the passage.

3. RESPOND

What do I want to say to God about this text? You can journal it down or respond in prayer, too, which gives us the opportunity for a conversation with God. What do I want to do, based on my prayer? Prayer should move us to action, even if it simply makes us want to be more compassionate and faithful.

4. REST

This isn't a time of prayer or meditation — I just sit quietly and allow God to work. When my mind starts to wander and dart here and there, I bring it gently back to stillness again. It is your time to "savor" the text and dwell in it. You can also use this time expressing your gratitude toward God for this experience.

SENIOR PASTOR
CALL COMMITTEE
*Nomination Deadline: **June 30***

The pastoral call process is God's activity, but God works through the congregation, church council, pastors, and synod staff to call a pastor to serve Roseville Lutheran Congregation. The decision to call a pastor belongs to the congregation.

The transition team is actively working to prepare the Ministry Site Profile which provides an assessment of the congregation's needs and priorities as related to the position of Senior Pastor. The profile is used by the synod to match potential candidates with Roseville Lutheran. As the transition team completes their work, the council is seeking members who might be interested in serving on the Call Committee.

The role of the Call Committee is to canvas, interview and assess pastoral candidates that are recommended by the synod. These candidates will be contacted by the synod to determine if they wish to be interviewed by the Call Committee.

The council's intent is that the call committee will represent the breadth and diversity of the congregation. The committee will consist of six voting members, as required by the constitution. We expect that there will be significant interest in the committee, and the council will not be able to honor all of those expressing interest. Nominations are being accepted until June 30, 2024.
