The pastoral call process is God's activity, but God works through the congregation, church council, pastors, and synod staff to call a pastor to serve Roseville Lutheran Congregation. The decision to call a pastor belongs to the congregation.

The transition team is actively working to prepare the Ministry Site Profile which provides an assessment of the congregation's needs and priorities as related to the position of Senior Pastor. The profile is used by the synod to match potential candidates with Roseville Lutheran. As the transition team completes their work, the council is seeking members who might be interested in serving on the Call Committee.

The role of the Call Committee is to canvas, interview and assess pastoral candidates that are recommended by the synod. These candidates will be contacted by the synod to determine if they wish to be interviewed by the Call Committee.

The council's intent is that the call committee will represent the breadth and diversity of the congregation. The committee will consist of six voting members, as required by the constitution. We expect that there will be significant interest in the committee, and the council will not be able to honor all of those expressing interest. Nominations are being accepted until **TODAY**, June 30, 2024.
