Pr. Eric's Council Report

April 2024

Pondering

The people of Israel would often affirm before the Lord God, "A wandering Aramean was my ancestor, and he went down to Egypt and lived there as a foreigner with a household few in number, but there he became a great, powerful, and numerous people. (Dtr. 26:5)

I think this verse might be a verse that we want to uplift in this time of transition for Roseville Lutheran. We are in transition at many different levels of our life together as God's people. Transition is fun for some and terrifying for others. Some of us will be looking forward as we anticipate the future God has in store for us. Some of us will cling to the past in fear of forgetting where we have been. Some of us will set new expectations as God reveals all things new. Some of us will cling to old expectations because they are what we know. Some of us will offer helpful insight and some of us will not.

The thing we need to remember is that our spiritual ancestors were "wandering Aramens". They spent a lot of time in a foreign place before they became a great people. 20 years worth of time! This interim will not last 20 years but it might feel that way for some. Especially those who do not understand the need for an interim. A moment of time in our congregational history when we create enough space between the previous pastor and the next pastor so that the next pastor can thrive. And this is what should happen!

Notice the last half of the verse above. The wandering Aramean (Jacob) lived in a strange place with a household few in numbers but there that household became a great, powerful and numerous people. This is the end that awaits us in this strange space we call interim.

So I close with one of my favorite prayers from Evening Prayer. Perhaps, like the verse above, this prayer might be an important one for us to pray in this time of transition. The prayer reads: "O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord"

Wondering

The Transition Team has started working on the Ministry Site Profile (MSP). Different parts of the MSP are being reviewed and revised by various members of the team. We still need to designate a chair for the team. Will work on this at our next meeting on April 23rd.

I hope to begin reviewing staff job descriptions with each staff member during the month of May. I recommend that this is done every May. That way you have the summer to make changes that might arise before Fall programming begins. I like to focus on the following questions, 1) What is working and why. 2)What is not working and why? 3)How in the next year will we continue what is working well? 4)How in the next year will we change what is not working well?

I can already see some necessary ministry tasks for your next Senior Pastor. Others will weigh in on this later in the process. What I see so far include Administration (staff encouragement and development), Strategic Planning, Financial Management, Preaching/Leading worship, and Stewardship. It will be interesting to see what others see moving forward.

Another thing to think about as you move forward in the call process is the title for the next pastor. Some congregations use "Lead Pastor" and some use Senior Pastor. We had an interesting conversation at St. John's in Lakeville about what title to use. That council chose "Senior Pastor" because this title implies collaborative work among staff, council and congregation.

"Lead Pastor" implies a leader casting a vision that everyone else follows. In very large churches this model works just because of the size of the staff and congregation. So, something to think about as we move forward.

Highlight results of key programs or activities from the last 30 days. Share major lessons learned or concerns.

- -Tours for both Preschool and Childcare are in full swing. We do still have openings in preschool for fall 2024, so we need to get the word out, especially for our afternoon portion of our day. Our Childcare is continuing to increase in numbers with delayed starts for the end of the school year to late summer.
- -Refreshed the preschool with carpeting in the hallway, paint on 2 hallway walls, and a new shelf unit at the top of the ramp under the RLC Preschool/Child care sign. Families are definitely noticing and have thanked me (and the church) for the updates. On dad stated, "Looks nice, I guess we're moving up in the world!".
- -The Lively Landscapers shared in seed planting with our preschool class on both Wednesday, April 3rd and Thursday, April 4th. This was a great experience to have our two Roseville Lutheran Church groups come together. All of the plantings are in the windows on the ramp up to the preschool. We have also posted pictures of the event. Be sure to take a moment to stop by and check out all of the fun that the preschoolers and landscapers had together. Pictures are posted on the walls of the ramp. We have also posted our Mystery Readers books and our Star Students!
- -Gertens Online Plant Fundraiser Closed with final sales lower than last years. 2023 totals \$4733.50. 2024 totaled 3194.18.
- -Collaborated with Jenna for the Good Friday Family Service. There were 5 preschool/childcare families in attendance.

- -Continuing to work with the Eagle Scout on the bench outside of the preschool entrance.
- -Continuing to refresh, clean and update our preschool spaces.
- Posting an early educator position for the 2024-2025 preschool year.
- Looking into becoming a Parent Aware program. This is something that I believe both the preschool and the childcare will need to do. In July 2024, all non-Parent Aware programs will be given ONE STAR. Parent Aware is a rating program for families to determine what program they want for their children. It is a 4-star rating. I will be going to a zoom training on Wednesday, April 24th to learn more about what it takes to obtain a 3- or 4-star rating. This process will take a huge portion of my time to get our programs rated higher than one star.

I would love to be able to have yard signs stating "We Love RLC Preschool and Childcare" with our new logo and a QR code to direction them to the Roseville Lutheran Church website. It would be great to have them available for preschool / childcare families and members of our congregation. The cost for the signs is approximately \$150 for 10 signs. These would be signs that could be up throughout the year to get the word out. Many of the families that have been touring have mentioned that they had no idea that we have <u>both</u> a preschool and a childcare. These are families that have somehow *stumbled* upon us, interested in one program or the other, and then when corresponding and touring with them, that's when they tell me they had no idea that we had both programs.

Roseville Lutheran Church Restricted Gift Policy

Roseville Lutheran Church (hereafter referred to as "RLC") depends on the generosity of financial gifts to carry out our mission. These gifts are accepted with gratitude. Often these gifts from members and friends are given for a specific purpose, and are referred to as Restricted Funds. RLC is committed to honoring the intent of the gift and at the same time remaining faithful to our mission.

Acceptance of Restricted Funds

Restricted Funds are given by a donor for a specific purpose or ministry. Establishment of new Restricted Funds shall be approved by the RLC Council prior to acceptance of any gifts to that new fund to ensure that they align with the ministry and plans of RLC.

Funds gifted in this category should be accompanied with written designation by the donor; for example, written in the memo line of the check.

RLC will only accept and pass funds to organizations or ministries that hold a nonprofit status. No designations to individuals will be accepted.

Memorial funds given at the time of a death should be designated for specific Restricted Funds as soon as possible but within 90 days of the gift, otherwise they will be released to the Operating Fund.

Release of Restricted Funds

Restricted Funds will be released to the Operating Fund as costs are incurred for the intended purposes.

If the original restriction of the gift cannot or is not expected to be fulfilled, and if the donors can be identified, RLC should contact and ask if they would like to change the designation of their gift to be used for another purpose, or if the restriction can be released. The donor's decision should be in writing, if possible, in order to avoid any misunderstandings.

In the event that the donor cannot be contacted, or if the need for such a program or project has been met or cannot be completed for any reason, the restriction may be removed and transfer the Restricted Fund to the Operating Fund as determined appropriate by the Finance Committee.

Notice to Donor

To avoid being precluded from using restricted funds if a project is overfunded, completed or if the designation cannot be met, the following clause should be made known to the prospective donor:

Spending of restricted funds is confined to official Council approved programs and projects. Each contribution directed toward an approved program or project will be used as restricted with the understanding that when the need for such a program or project has been met or cannot be completed for any reason as determined by RLC Council, the remaining restricted contributions will be used where most needed.

Accounting for Restricted Funds

Accounting for restricted fund activity will occur within the accounting system to track the contributions and the costs incurred to release the restrictions. The monthly financial reports to the Finance Committee will show the activity within the restricted and designated funds separate from the undesignated funds or operating portions of the budget.

RLC will avoid using restricted funds for budgeted or unbudgeted operating expenses. However, when necessary, these fund asset balances may be used to pay for operating expenses, with proper fund tracking to ensure that the restricted balances are accounted for and the intent that the funds will be used for the donor intended purposes, or released in accordance with policy above.

This policy was updated and approved by the RLC Council on April 18, 2024.

- Fundraising: as of 2/28/24 = \$795,295.59 or 94% (146 donors)
 - Pennies for Pipes (2/15-3/18): \$22.90; total pennies for pipes = \$278.42
 - The family of RLC member Ada Kirscher suggested memorials be given to the Organ Fund
 - o Kathy Arveson is contact until Finance Director position filled.
- 4/8/24 Meet the Organ Builder recap
 - New pipe organ design was explained and revealed. Renderings have been added to the organ poster in the commons and near the office.
 - o Over 70 attendees; lots of positive, enthusiastic comments after the event
 - 9 RLC volunteers helped make the event successful (provided sound, recording, slide management and refreshments for the reception after the event)
 - the Meet the Builder presentation with slides is posted on the organ webpage and has received 70 views.
 - The organ builder, J.F. Nordlie, and RLC's organ consultant, Dr. Gregory Peterson, have worked on numerous organ projects. Both thanked the Organ Project Team for their transparent communication, outreach to all ages of the congregation, project management, and flexibility. Both commented they wished all committees they've worked with had similar strengths.

- The Organ Project Team will step back from active fundraising during pRAISE and FMSC. With \$56,052 remaining, the team will focus onto continue by building project awareness via ongoing congregational communication and organ related events such as:
 - May 4, 9:30 am Build a Pipe Organ (all ages): Nordlie will loan RLC a 2-octave traveling wooden pipe organ kit; all ages can learn how pipe organs are built, help assemble the 133-piece kit and play the organ with hand-pumped bellows. OPT would also like to use the kit with RLC kids.
 - April 29 at 6:30 pm Community-wide Hymn Sing. This is a pRAISE event that the Organ Project Team will help coordinate (promote the event to ~20 neighboring churches, requested ice-cream donation, work with Will on reception and help greet and serve sundaes).
 - May 4, 9:30 am Build a Pipe Organ (all ages): Nordlie has loaned RLC a 2-octave traveling wooden pipe organ kit; all ages can learn how pipe organs are built, help assemble the 133-piece kit and play the organ with hand-pumped bellows.OPT has reached out to Jenna and Sher to possibly demo it for RLC kids and the preschool.

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Organ Project Team Report to Council

 May 21: additional volunteers may be needed to help remove and pack 85 pipes from RLC's organ to be shipped to Ohio for refurbishing, and provide and serve lunch to the work crew May 21-22. 10 RLC volunteers going to Birmingham will be involved. Note: RLC's organ will remain usable until the entire organ is removed in January 2025.
