The Sixth Sunday in Lent: Palm Sunday

Today we move toward the conclusion of the season of Lent known as Passion Week-a recounting of the final days of the earthly ministry of Jesus Christ. It begins on Palm Sunday with the entry of Christ into Jerusalem, and includes both Maundy Thursday (the institution of the Lord's Supper) and Good Friday (the crucifixion of our Lord). It follows Jesus through His betrayal, trial, and death on a cross. It culminates in His resurrection on Easter Sunday. We use this week to reflect on the amazing truth of the Church's participation in the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Each Sunday this Lent, we will sing "Have Mercy on Me" and hear stories of how Jesus is leading us to repent to trust Him, becoming like Him in His death, and attaining His resurrection (Phil. 3:10-11).

Scripture Reading

³⁵But someone will ask, "How are the dead raised? With what kind of body do they come?" ³⁶You foolish person! What you sow does not come to life unless it dies. ³⁷And what you sow is not the body that is to be, but a bare kernel, perhaps of wheat or of some other grain. 38But God gives it a body as he has chosen, and to each kind of seed its own body. 39For not all flesh is the same, but there is one kind for humans, another for animals, another for birds, and another for fish. ⁴⁰There are heavenly bodies and earthly bodies, but the glory of the heavenly is of one kind, and the glory of the earthly is of another. ⁴¹There is one glory of the sun, and another glory of the moon, and another glory of the stars; for star differs from star in glory. 42So is it with the resurrection of the dead. 
Confession of Sin

Confession & Encouragement
Often we find that our hearts
worship something other than
God. In confessing our sins, the
Holy Spirit probes our hearts and
minds and graciously shows us
what we mistakenly believe will
give us life. Jesus is good to lead
us from sorrow over our sin to the
sweetness of His grace.

Our heavenly Father, forgive us our transgressions against You. We have sought a home and salvation among the perishable, and have wanted little from You. We became people of dust, and lost sight of the future promised through Your conquering Son. We coddle our secret sins, and have relinquished the hope of glory. Instead of hearing Your Good News, we have been captivated by a voice that leads to death. Lord Jesus, Son of the Living God, our only hope is in Your finished work. You lived the life we should have lived. You died the death we should have died: in our place, as our substitute, to make atonement for our sins. You rose again, victorious over sin and death, that we might inherit the Kingdom of God. Renew us by Your Holy Spirit, who leads us through death to resurrection life.

West End Presbyterian Church welcomes all baptized Christians who actively trust in Jesus Christ for salvation, who are willing to forsake their sin and heart-idols, and who are members of congregations that proclaim the Gospel, to participate in the sacrament of the Lord's Supper with us. The Elders presiding over the Supper are praying for you as the congregation participates in the sacrament.

At the center aisle station, wine and grape juice with gluten-free wafers are available in double cups. The gluten-free wafer is found in the bottom cup. Juice is in the purple cup. Wine is in the clear cup. At all the other stations, grape juice is in purple cups, wine is in the clear cups on the outer ring of the tray, and gluten-free bread is served alongside. The season of Lent began on Ash Wednesday, February 14, and ends on the Saturday before Easter, March 30. Lent, a tradition from the early centuries of church history, is a season of preparation preceding the celebration of Easter, focused on repentance. Speaking biblically, to repent means to make a change in our attitudes, words, and lifestyle. Those who follow Jesus must learn that we must die before we rise. Beginning when we first trust Christ, and continuing throughout our lives, we turn more and more away from sin and self-centeredness and instead turn more and more to our Lord and Savior lesus Christ.
