

Tonight's communion service marks the beginning of the season of Lent. It marks a season of preparation, preceding the celebration of Easter, in which we focus on repentance.

To repent means to make a Godcentered change in our attitudes, words, and living. As sixteenthcentury reformer Martin Luther taught, the whole Christian life is a life of repentance. Beginning when we first trust Christ, and continuing throughout our lives, the Holy Spirit enables us more and more to turn away from sin and self-centeredness, and toward our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

This service will be an opportunity to worship God in light of the grace He gives in enabling His people to repent and trust Christ alone.

In this next hour, give the Savior glory: meditate on your mortality, long to be conformed to Christ's likeness, and remember with confidence and gratitude that Jesus has conquered sin and death. By these, we testify to the power and beauty of our union with Christ and to the daily dying and rising in which He leads His people.

CALL TO WORSHIP

BASED ON THE HEIDELBERG CATECHISM 88-90

:: Congregation, please rise if you are able. ::

Genuine repentance involves two things:
the dying-away of the old self

SCRIPTURE

JOEL 2:1-2, 12-18

¹Blow a trumpet in Zion; sound an alarm on my holy mountain!

Let all the inhabitants of the land tremble,
for the day of the LORD is coming; it is near,

²a day of darkness and gloom, a day of clouds and thick darkness!

Like blackness there is spread upon the mountains
a great and powerful people; their like has never been before,
nor will be again after them through the years of all generations...

12"Yet even now," declares the LORD, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; 13 and rend your hearts and not your garments." 

WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT

Psalm 103:8-14

THE SACRAMENT OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

West End Presbyterian Church welcomes all baptized Christians who actively trust in Jesus Christ for salvation, who are willing to forsake their sin and heart-idols, and who are members of congregations that proclaim the Gospel, to participate in the sacrament of the Lord's Supper with us. The Elders presiding over the Supper are praying for you as the congregation participates in the sacrament.

At the center aisle station, wine and grape juice with gluten-free wafers are available in double cups. The gluten-free wafer is found in the bottom cup. Juice is in the purple cup. Wine is in the clear cup. At all the other stations, grape juice is in purple cups, wine is in the clear cups on the outer ring of the tray, and gluten-free bread is served alongside.
