- Strong inter-personal skills with the ability to recruit, train, and equip musicians and volunteers. •
- Self-starter with strong work ethic, organizational, communication, and time-management skills. ٠

- Responsible and dependable with details, information, and tasks. •

RESPONSIBILITIES - Worship

- Lead/participate on Worship Team to create experiences that foster connection with God and formation by Him into Christlikeness.
- Plan/provide direction for selection of music, Scripture, prayers, and other media to create thematically integrated worship experiences in collaboration with Worship and/or Preaching Team.
- Oversee the recruitment/auditioning, scheduling, and training of all Worship and Tech Team members. ٠
- Lead rehearsals with both musical and pastoral emphasis. •
- Oversee Sunday Ministry Teams including: welcome, refreshments, technology and sound, communion, • and prayer, in collaboration with Community Life Administrator.
- Assure completion of all administrative tasks including: band music, Proclaim slides (lyrics, • announcements, sermon graphics), and sound/tech support.
- Administrate web elements, including posting sermons post-service and managing livestream. •
- Planning and coordination of special events (ie. annual meeting, special services, etc.) •
- Meet regularly with worship and tech team members for discipleship and connection. •

RESPONSIBILITIES – Formation

- Serve as vital partner to Senior Pastor in supporting the teaching, formation, pastoral care, or community life aspects of the church, depending on gifts, training, abilities, and interests.
- Preach several times/year, serve on Preaching Team, and potentially assist in developing sermon series. ٠
- Meet regularly with congregants for connection, mentoring, prayer, and care support.

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PHILOSOPHY OF WORSHIP

This philosophy of worship reflects City Church's commitment to biblically faithful, theologically rich, and spiritually formative worship that glorifies God and equips believers to live lives of worship in every context.

Foundations of Worship

1. Worship as Our Created Purpose

Humanity is created in the image of God (Genesis 1:27) and designed to find ultimate fulfillment in worshiping Him. Worship is not confined to music or specific acts but encompasses every aspect of life lived in communion with God.

2. Worship as God-Defined

God Himself has established the means and object of worship. From the Tabernacle and Temple (Exodus 25–31) to worship through Christ (Hebrews 9–10), true worship is always a response to God's initiative, shaped by His revelation rather than human preference.

3. Worship as a Response to Grace

Worship flows out of gratitude for God's redemptive work. Through Christ, believers are invited to worship in spirit and truth, offering their lives as living sacrifices (John 4:23-24; Romans 12:1). Worship glorifies God and transforms the worshiper, drawing them into deeper communion with Him.

Core Values in Worship

1. Celebrating God

Worship is centered on celebrating God's attributes, actions, and redemptive work. Every element of worship—songs, prayers, scripture, and even the use of physical space—should point to God's glory and draw hearts to Him (Psalm 96; Revelation 5:9-14).

2. Forming Christlike Disciples

Worship shapes believers, conforming them to the image of Christ. This formation happens through scripture, biblically faithful preaching, and gospel-centered prayers that encourage obedience and trust in God (2 Timothy 3:16-17).

3. Extending Worship Beyond the Church

Worship is not limited to Sunday gatherings but is expressed in every aspect of life. Believers are called to live as living sacrifices, demonstrating devotion to God in their homes, workplaces, and communities (Romans 12:1). Corporate worship equips the church for this whole-life expression of faith.

Practical Implementation

1. Gospel-Centered Worship

Worship at City Church reflects the narrative of the gospel—creation, fall, redemption, and restoration. Songs, prayers, and scripture readings are chosen intentionally to tell this story and to remind the congregation of God's grace and faithfulness.

2. Thematic Unity

Worship is designed to align with the preached Word. Themes from the sermon text guide the selection of songs, prayers, and other elements, creating a cohesive and spiritually rich worship experience.

3. Embracing Diversity

Recognizing the multi-generational nature of the congregation, City Church incorporates a variety of musical styles and traditions. This approach values both the historic practices of the faith and fresh, creative expressions that resonate with newer generations.

4. Balancing Celebration and Lament

Worship reflects the full range of human experience, including both joy and sorrow. Space is given for lament, acknowledging life's struggles while pointing to the hope found in Christ (Psalm 13; Philippians 4:4-7).

5. Equipping for Everyday Worship

The conclusion of each service is a launching point for believers to carry worship into their daily lives. Through a gospel-centered benediction, the congregation is reminded that worship continues as they live out their faith in the world.

Worship in Music

1. Theological Depth

The content of worship songs must prioritize theological richness over stylistic preferences. Songs are selected for their ability to reveal truths about God and humanity's relationship with Him (Colossians 3:16-17).

2. Stylistic Variety

Worship incorporates a diversity of musical forms, from hymns to contemporary songs, reflecting the unity and diversity of the body of Christ. Music should engage the heart, mind, and emotions, aligning with the lyrical themes of worship.

3. Honesty Before God

Worship includes space for authenticity, allowing congregants to express both their praise and their pain. Honest worship—whether in celebration or lament—honors God and invites His comfort and renewal (Psalm 13; Isaiah 61:3).
