## April 2026 A People of the Resurrection

My Dear Friend,

Walking down memory lane, I recall the gentle slope of the road leading to my grandparents' home and the hill beyond. Those cherished summer vacations in their welcoming house in Mangalore, India, remain vivid in my mind—the sprawling grounds, the little hill behind, the large, deep open well, and the abundance of home-grown guavas, mangoes, pineapples, and cashews. Mangoes nestled in beds of hay were placed beneath most cots in the home, and oh, how I remember the sweet aroma as they ripened! I think back to moments spent in my grandfather's study, and of admiring his strength as he lifted heavy weights during his daily exercise times. I can close my eyes and still hear the voice of my sweet, godly grandmother, Kamala, singing hymns in the evening. These memories are treasures I carry with me—and nostalgia is never far behind.

Time has moved on. My grandparents have passed on. I am no longer the little boy I used to be – but the memories remain, reminding me of the enduring legacy of love and faith across generations (2 Timothy 1:5).

The season of Lent is a powerful reminder to remember. It is a call to walk down memory lane with Jesus, the Savior of the world. The Via Dolorosa—meaning "Way of Suffering"—is a path in Jerusalem believed to trace Jesus' final journey to His crucifixion. Marked by fourteen Stations of the Cross, each station recalls a profound moment from Jesus' journey to Calvary (see Luke 23:26-49). Today, pilgrims walk this route in devotion, reflecting on Christ's ultimate sacrifice for the sins of the world.

As we enter another Easter season, we are reminded that Jesus' journey did not end at the cross—the story continues at the empty tomb and the triumph of resurrection morning. The universal proclamation of faith resounds: “Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!” (Matthew 28:6; 1 Corinthians 15:20) Through the ages, this truth has echoed, offering hope and renewal to all who believe.

As you journeyed through our Lenten series, “Faces on the Way to the Cross,” was there a character who resonated deeply with you? Was there a moment when the gospel stirred your heart to joy, conviction, or a call to mission? When God speaks, our best response is obedience (John 14:23). I pray you experience the joy of being a doer of God's Word (James 1:22).

As we begin our new series, “A People of the Resurrection,” let us earnestly pray for the grace to be obedient to the One who gave everything for us, so that we may give ourselves wholly to Him (Romans 12:1).

**WHEN LIFE NEEDS A RESTART** by Jamie Bream, Contemporary Worship Leader

*Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for His compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is Your faithfulness.* Lamentations 3:22-23 (NIV)

I store most of my digital files, including all my Tidings articles, on an external hard drive because my computer has limited storage. While sitting down to write this piece, the drive's indicator light was on, yet it wouldn't show up on my computer. After several fruitless attempts to resolve the issue, I finally restarted my computer for the first time in weeks. Upon logging back in, the computer recognized the drive immediately, as if the connection had never been lost.

Last November, my life accelerated as extra work, basketball officiating, and Christmas events were added to an already busy schedule. Running to a different place every night took its toll; before long, I was overworked and under-rested, often falling asleep on the couch immediately after getting home. I crashed into Christmas Eve like an airplane without wings and hit the bed like a sack of bricks, convinced I could sleep straight into 2026. However, after a few days of rest, I was ready to dive back into work and life with newfound energy.

What is the similarity between these two stories? In both cases, a simple reset resolved a significant struggle. Just as a reboot clears a computer's errors, God offers us a spiritual restart. We often try to power through our own 'glitches' or 'system failures', forgetting that we weren't designed to run indefinitely without a pause. This is clearly seen in Isaiah 40:31: 'But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint.' As grateful as I am for physical resets, I am even more grateful for the spiritual reset God offers me every day - I know I need it!

No matter how crashed or 'unresponsive' our lives may feel, God offers a daily reset that ensures we will walk and not be faint, and by choosing to stop and reboot in His presence, we find the strength we cannot create on our own. As we embrace His mercies that are new every morning, we are empowered to soar on wings like eagles into whatever challenges lie ahead.

**NOTES FROM THE ORGAN BENCH** by Andrew Meade, Organist & Director of Traditional Music

The Apostles' Creed includes the line, "I believe in the holy universal Church". I recently had a conversation with the pastor about the broad and deep cultural heritage that we are able to draw from when selecting music for worship. That our faith is connected with people of many cultures across the centuries and around the world is an incredible thing. It is amazing that our Sunday worship may sometimes involve a piece of music being heard for the first time - ever - and other times we may be singing something that the Church has sung in various languages and locations for a thousand years! With that in mind, I hope you will take time to explore and appreciate the heritage of some of the music used at Trinity during Lent, Holy Week, and Easter this year.

**"Christ the Lord Is Risen Today"** TEXT: Charles Wesley, England, 1739; MUSIC: Anonymous, first published in England, 1708. A prolific hymn writer and founder of Methodism, Charles Wesley wrote this text, which was paired with various tunes in its early years. It eventually became indelibly linked to the tune "Easter Hymn", which had its first known publication 40 years BEFORE Wesley wrote the words.

**"Hosanna!"** TEXT & MUSIC: Carl Tuttle, California, 1985. Born in Massachusetts, Tuttle was a pioneer in the development of contemporary Christian music and an influential worship leader who spent much of his career working for a charismatic ministry in California. Tuttle passed away in 2025.

**"The Doxology"** TEXT: Thomas Ken, England, 1674; MUSIC: Louis Bourgeois, French, working in Switzerland, mid-1500s. We call this tune "OLD 100th" because of its common association with an English version of Psalm 100 from the late 1500s. Even earlier, the tune was used for Psalm 134 in John Calvin's Genevan Psalter. The tune later became popular among German reformers and has been used by many composers over the years, including J.S. Bach in the 1700s, Mendelssohn in the 1800s, and Vaughan Williams for the 1953 coronation of Queen Elizabeth II. These brief eight bars of music have nearly five centuries of history that passes through France, Switzerland, England, and Germany before arriving in New Cumberland, PA!

**"Carillon of Praise"** MUSIC: Cathy Mocklebust, South Dakota, 2018. This handbell composition imitates the joyous ringing of a carillon and quotes the hymn, "Praise, My Soul the King of Heaven", which was written in England in 1869.

**"Hosanna to the Son of David"** TEXT: Matthew 21:9 (1st century AD), quoting Psalm 118 (ca. 500 BC); MUSIC: David Halls, England, 2006. This music sets a Biblical text that has been spoken and sung continuously in Jewish and Christian worship around the world for 2500 years!

**"Aint-a-That Good News"** MUSIC: Marianne Kim, Illinois, 2020. The original musical source is an African American Spiritual which draws on the experiences of enslaved peoples in the southern United States and folk music traditions from Africa and the Americas. Here, it is arranged for organ by a woman born and raised in Korea, now living in Chicago. The musical genealogy of this arrangement covers multiple centuries and spans half the globe!

I look forward to growing the musical heritage of Trinity on Bridge along with all of you!
