#### CHRISTMAS EVE MEMORIES from Karen Bowen

Celebrating Advent and Christmas at Trinity for me has been a life-long experience, blessing me with many precious memories. How well I remember the Children's Christmas Programs, the Yuletide Teas, Christmas Caroling with the Youth Fellowship and singing in the choirs. The Christmas trees standing tall, decorated with handmade Chrismons. Wreaths hanging on the doors, welcoming one and all to share in celebrating Jesus' birth. Poinsettias, honoring and remembering loved ones, gracing the sanctuary.

And then, it was Christmas Eve! As a youngster and teen, it was great to be able to stay up late to attend the Christmas Eve Service. Hearing Scripture recounting the Birth of Jesus, the lighting of the candles, singing Silent Night, the church bell being rung at the stroke of midnight.

So special were the years the Youth Fellowship created a living Creche across Bridge Street in Rabena's parking lot. Upon leaving the Christmas Eve Service, it was as though we, like the shepherds on the first Christmas Eve, had been invited to witness the coming of the promised Messiah, to see Mary and Joseph, and to worship the Babe in the manger.

Mary, Jesus' mother, was a young girl who demonstrated true faithfulness to the Lord. When the angel told Mary that she would be the mother of God's Son, Mary replied:

"Behold, I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word." —Luke 1:38.

And, in awe and filled with great joy, Mary said:

"My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has regarded the low estate of his handmaiden." —Luke 1:46-48

Joseph, Jesus' earthly father, was not the human progenitor of Jesus. Matthew 1:18 tells us that: Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph.

Joseph took Mary as his wife:

... but knew her not until she had given birth to a son. And he [Joseph] called his name Jesus. —Matthew 1:25.

Michael Card wrote a song about Joseph, imagining what Joseph might have been feeling as he gazed lovingly at God's Son:

Father show me where I fit into this plan of yours.

How can a man be father to the Son of God?

Lord for all my life I've been a simple carpenter.

How can I raise a king? How can I raise a king?

Jesus, the Babe wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger:

The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth. —John 1:14

During this Advent Season, may we, like the shepherds, seek the newborn King. May our prayer be that we grow to know and love Jesus more each day; that as we journey through life, our thoughts, words, and actions may shine His love so brightly, that others will come to know, to believe in, and to worship Jesus, the Messiah, the Babe in the Manger.





## **Trinity 150th Anniversary Commemorative Art** By Timothy R. Botts

#### **Psalm 40:5**

As a calligraphic artist, my inspiration comes from working with great words, so it is a special joy for me to express Scripture. The early church building is rendered in gray to remember the vision of those who began so long ago what has grown to become God's work today. I chose the Renaissance italic style of lettering because of its celebrative flourishes I associate with God's glory. To represent the phrase "Many are the wonders You have done" I gradated a variety of colors. The small gold diamonds in the Lord's name stand for the presence of His Holy Spirit working among us. A last minute addition was the small flourish which surrounds the church steeple much as His ultimate plan is behind it all.
