



Hello my dear friend,

Let me wish you and your loved ones a truly wonderful season of experiencing the magic and wonder of the greatest story ever told. Christ the Savior is born! Our theme for December 2024 is, "God's business card" based on the words of Isaiah 9:1-7.

Frank Boreham's childhood included regular storytelling sessions referred to as "The Hassock Hour," held on Sunday evenings at their mother's feet. Frank and his nine siblings would kneel on hassocks beside her to listen to stories. Their favorite story was about their mother at seventeen.

She had planned with her cousin, Kitty, to visit Canterbury Cathedral. When the meeting time came, Kitty did not arrive. At ten a.m., then half past eleven, Kitty was still missing. An elderly gentleman noticed Mrs. Boreham waiting and offered a tour of the cathedral, mentioning his familiarity with its history.

The guide shared detailed stories as they toured, bringing to life events such as Augustine's arrival in the sixth century, the pilgrims of Chaucer's Canterbury Tales, and the Danes' attack on the building. At the shrine of Thomas Becket, he described the martyrdom of 1170 vividly.

Upon concluding the tour, the guide and Mrs. Boreham exchanged cards. On the train ride home, she discovered the card read: Charles Dickens. She realized she had been guided through Canterbury Cathedral by Charles Dickens himself. ¹

This Advent and Christmas time, may you be led through the "Cathedral of God's revelation" by the Lord himself.

TITHES

God's word celebrates cheerful giving. While we bring our weekly offerings to God's house, the Bible also teaches us that one tenth of all that God gives us is to be a tithe for His house. "Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the Lord Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it." Malachi 3:10

Here at Trinity and across the world, Christians have learnt the joy of obeying the Lord through their tithes. When we invest in God's work with the desire to see lives transformed by the power of the Gospel, we experience a very special joy and sense of fulfillment. Those who have learned to set aside 1/10th of their income for God, have not found it a burden, but in fact, a blessing. A LESSON FROM DAD AND MOM ON INVESTING IN THE KINGDOM

When I was growing up in India, Mom told me that my Dad always wrote his first check after receiving his salary to our local church. It was his tithe – his one-tenth. He never failed to honor that discipline – even when he left his corporate job, started his own business and sadly lost all his life’s earnings and investments. During six difficult years, when Dad was on an overdraft from the bank, was struggling to pay bills, he continued to tithe the same amount that he used to when he was earning his salary in his company job. He did that while his debt with the bank was growing. Might sound insane, but that was his commitment, and he kept it. During those years we prayed, “Lord, you are the God who promised to restore what the locusts have eaten.” (Joel 2:25)

Then I saw how God honored him. Dad was led to close his business. He had lost a lot, but God opened a new door. My Dad was given an opportunity to be in ministry. For the rest of his working years, Dad served as the Director of Human Resources and Administration in the Bible Society of India’s headquarters. It was a very big responsibility of overseeing the Society’s work for his department across the country.

My Dad is now 91 years old. Mom and Dad have been an incredible witness to us about giving. Some years ago, my parents sold their home in the South Indian City of Mangalore and now live with my brother’s family in Kolkata, India. The first thing dad did after the sale of their house was write his check of tithe to the local church. One tenth of all he got. And the next thing that Mom and Dad did, spoke to us so deeply. They sent substantial checks of love to former home-helpers (“servants” as they are called in the East) who had worked in our home since I was a kid, to some friends in need and to some of their former pastors.

Today, my brother Ashok is a much-loved pastor, and he and his family serve the Lord faithfully. My sister Asha and her husband love the Lord, and they serve by volunteering in their local church and are part of a Bible study group. As children, we see how the Lord has blessed us – and believe that the faith of our parents has made a truly big difference in our lives.

I remember, since I was a little boy, how my Dad would go to the bank and get clean currency bills for every week’s use for offerings. On Sunday morning, when we got into our car, he would give us each the money that we would individually put into the offering bag as our Sunday offerings. This was apart from the tithes he placed into the hands of God.

The lessons I learned from my parents have stayed. I have learned in simple and big ways what Jesus meant when he said, “It is more blessed to give than to receive.”

QUESTIONS FOR A NEW YEAR

“Therefore, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do everything for God’s glory.”

1 Corinthians 10:31 (HCSB)

The end of one year and the beginning of the next always gives me an opportunity for self-reflection. It is good to remember all that has been accomplished in the previous year and plan for all we hope to do in the coming year. The Trinity Calendar Makers’ Retreat, which I believe has a section in another part of this newsletter, gave our church staff and ministry leaders the opportunity to do just that (with many edits and changes, of course!) as the church prepares for 2025.

Out of curiosity, I asked Google’s Artificial Intelligence (A.I.) module what the three most important questions to ask yourself at the end of the year are. Its answer are as follows. Obviously, the answers to these questions would look significantly different depending on if they were answered from a Christian worldview or a secular worldview.

1. *What are my top three values in life, and have I aligned my actions and goals with them?*
2. *What are the key takeaways and lessons learned from the past year, and how can I apply them to improve and grow in the coming year?*
3. *What are the people, experiences, and moments from the past year that have had a profound impact on my life, and how can I cultivate and nurture those relationships and opportunities moving forward?*

We, however, are not the only ones who evaluate our lives from time to time. Proverbs 20:27 speaks of how the Lord also evaluates each person’s life, stating that His light “penetrates the human spirit, exposing every hidden motive”. Hidden motives can impede or derail our progress in a variety of areas and can cause devastating effects when they are inevitably exposed. When we evaluate our values, our takeaways, and our relationships (among other things) at the end of one year, it is appropriate to also evaluate the why of these topics. Ultimately, the why behind everything we do should be to bring God glory and to make His name known, as the reference verse states. As we enter a new year with an uncertain horizon, I trust that you will make this your primary goal, as the Westminster Shorter Catechism echoes - to “glorify God and to enjoy Him forever”.

THOUGHTS TO CONSIDER:

- Honestly answer each of the three questions according to your own life. What answers are you satisfied with? Which answers would you like to change in 2025?
- How have you seen the Lord guide you in 2024, and do you believe He will continue to do so in 2025? Are there any “hidden motives” you need to confess to Him as you prepare to enter a new year?
