Merry Christmas, my dear Church Family.

This advent and Christmas season reminds us of the faithfulness of God. He loves us more than we can ever imagine. Since He created humankind in the garden of Eden, His heart has never stopped pursuing us. His love has never stopped yearning for us. His eye has never stopped watching out for us. On the other hand, we the people He created have forgotten, forsaken, wandered, rebelled, and broken His tender heart. WORTH THE WAIT by Jamie Bream, Contemporary Worship Leader

"For the vision is yet for the appointed time; it hurries toward the goal and it will not fail.

Though it delays, wait for it; for it will certainly come, it will not delay long."

Habakkuk 2:3 (NASB)

As referenced in previous December Tidings, I LOVE CHRISTMAS! I love the decorations, celebrating with family and friends, eggnog (only the Hood brand, though)... and of course, the music! I listen to holiday music all year round, but there is just something special about singing the songs of Christmas during the season of Christmas. Usually, a handful of songs will stand out to me each holiday season, and this year is no exception. I've found myself increasingly humming Phil Wickham's "Worth The Wait", even before Thanksgiving—the traditionally accepted time to start listening to Christmas music. Starting off with the chorus from "The First Noel", Wickham soon dives into a trio of original bridges, as listed below:

You were good on Your promise, sent Your Son to our darkness Savior of our souls, He will light the way, Jesus, You were worth the wait

This section highlights God's faithfulness in fulfilling centuries of promises by sending Jesus, the long-awaited Messiah. Jesus arrived as the "great light" that Isaiah prophesied, proving that God's timing was perfect and worth the wait.

Hear the hosts singing glory, See the star, this is holy Creator of the world in a manger laid, oh Jesus you were worth the wait

The focus here is the profound contrast between Jesus' status as the mighty King and Creator, and His humble arrival in a manger. This unexpected humility is the essence of the Christmas miracle, showing that His kingdom entrance was worth the wait.

He will heal all the broken, take back what the enemy has stolen With a fire in His eyes, and freedom in His name, oh Jesus You were worth the wait

This section explains how Jesus' earthly ministry centered on tangible redemption. He came with a restorative "fire" to reclaim what the enemy had stolen, restoring humanity's broken relationship with God and confirming that this work was truly worth the wait.

He will die so we don't have to, and then He'll rise, to make a way through Forgiven by His love and covered in His grace, oh Jesus You were worth the wait

The core message is the Gospel of substitutionary atonement. Jesus' sacrificial death and powerful resurrection create a path for reconciliation with God through forgiveness, love, and grace. This pivotal moment of history's fulfillment makes Jesus eternally worth the wait.

Every heart come and adore Him, every knee bow before Him The King of every King, forever You will reign, oh Jesus You were worth the wait

The final bridge directs attention to Jesus' second coming, when He will return to reign forever as King of all kings. We are currently in an "appointed time" of waiting, and remembering the anticipation of the first Advent reassures us that the glory of His return will be infinitely greater; Jesus is worth the wait now, just as He was then.

"A Merry Christmas to us all, and may God bless us, everyone!"

PEOPLE LOOK EAST

By the time you are reading this note, Advent will have begun, Trinity will have re-started its children's choir with a couple of rehearsals, and we will have had an orchestra participate in Sunday morning worship. However, from my perspective writing this article, none of these things have happened yet. I have no idea how they will go! I'm anticipating these events in the future, but you will be reflecting on them in the past. As I think about these two different perspectives, I'm reminded that we serve a God who is not bound by time and space, and He knows everything that has happened and everything that will happen. This is a great thing to remember as we plan for the future. We do our best to anticipate how we will use our time, talents, and resources, but ultimately, we know that God will work things out according to His will – and sometimes the outcome is very different than we were expecting! That's one of the important lessons of the Advent and Christmas season. God's people had been anticipating the coming Messiah for generations, but when God finally sent His Son to earth, it was probably not in the way that most people considered or expected.

Our choir began the Advent season singing an arrangement of the carol, "People Look East", which includes several metaphors for expectation and preparation for the coming of Christ. The first verse presents the idea of preparing your home for the arrival of a Guest. The second verse talks about a seed surviving months in the cold, barren ground as it awaits the warmth of spring to blossom into a beautiful Rose. The third verse offers imagery of a new Star piercing the darkness of night and bringing light to the people below. And the final verse is about our response: sharing the good news! Just as the angels announced the news to the shepherds, we too should share the good news of Christ with those around us. One simple way to do that is to invite a friend, neighbor, family member, or coworker to one of our special seasonal services. I encourage you to consider someone in your life whom you could invite to join us for the Christmas Musicale (Dec. 18 at 7:00 pm & Dec. 21 at 9:15 am) or one of our two beautiful Christmas Eve services (Revive at 4:00 pm and Sanctuary at 7:00 pm). We'd love to see our church full of familiar and unfamiliar faces during this special season of the year! The final lines of "People Look East" say:

Set every hill and valley humming with the news the Lord is coming. People, look East and sing today, Love, the Lord, is on the way!

I hope that, together, we can set Trinity and New Cumberland humming with the good news of Christmas.


SECRET SISTERS
