My dear Trinity Family,

As we approach another Lenten season with the celebration of Ash Wednesday on February 14th, we come to a special convergence. It will be Valentine's Day as well! Ash Wednesday reminds us of our need for repentance and Valentine's Day reminds us of our need for love. Pastor Rick Warren says, "Repentance is when you start rethinking your life in order to match how Jesus thinks." ¹ In our preaching series from the Gospel of Mark, our theme for February is, "Jesus, my Valentine." Earlier today I was listening to a Jerry Lee Lewis song which I heard as a teenager on my dad's gramophone. Here are some of the words:

One has my name, the other has my heart With one I'll remain, that's how my heartaches start One has brown eyes, the other's eyes are blue To one I am tied, to the other I am true

One that has my love and the other only me But what good is love to a heart that can't be free If I could live over, my life I would change The one who has my heart would also have my name.

Lewis captures the problem of a divided heart with song-writer precision. As in the song, so in life. The problem with a divided heart is that it is a train-wreck waiting to happen. The writing on the wall of many a celebrity life tragically highlights the pain and problems caused by divided hearts.

Love is central in our relationship with God. The God of the Bible is the only one who is as crazy as he is about you and me. It blows our minds that he did not envisage happiness without us. If he had, he would have never created us! The whole saga of the Biblical narrative is that of a God who longs for the love of his children. His social media handle probably reads, "I have loved you with an everlasting love." Jeremiah 31:3

Have you lately felt the longing of God? Have you recognized his longing to sense your longing for him? Oh, how God loves to be loved by you. How he yearns for you to yearn for him. As a loving parent delights in the love of a child, God delights in you. His word tells us that God sings and dances over his children (Zephaniah 3:17). Isn't that amazing?

NEW CHURCH SERVICE TIMES – PASTORAL COMMENTS.

Change is easy if it is not sub-zero!

That's my "two pennies worth" confession about the problem of change! I might like sub-zero temperatures in my ice-cream, but not so much in the weather. Snow yes. Below freezing temperatures...Mmm! Moving from a city (that averaged temperatures in the mid 70s to 80's much of the year), to Central PA was a change that sent the Andrews family hunting for stuff like Eskimo outfits!! You might remember seeing us in the winter of 2014, wrapped up like Egyptian mummies - layer-upon-layer. Some of you might have worried about our center of gravity because we were all bound up like Lazarus and you might have wondered, "who knows if just a strong wind might cause these new Indians to lose balance!"

We survived! And today we dress as light as we might have feared to in 2014! As I write this letter, we are facing predictions for what appears to be our coldest week thus far this winter - with temperatures lowering to the teens if not single digits in some parts of PA. We'll get through it – and even enjoy the breathtaking views of snow-clad hills, trees, and gardens. Pennsylvania did not magically morph to become a sunshine State like Florida but we as a family have grown to adapt to our context and truth be told, I might be the one who wins the "love the snow" award in the family.

Speaking of change, I think of the recent survey that we have had about the change of church service times. I do want to thank everyone who helped us go through this process, especially Beth Sider, chair of the worship team, and Shirley Sharpe, chair of the leadership team and all who serve on both teams. We are grateful to each of you who participated in the survey.

As I mentioned in our church services on January 14, we try our best in conversations like this to value everyone's opinions. We appeal to those of you who expressed reservations about the change. Please know that you are valued and loved. I pray very much and hope you will be able to cope with the change. As we look back into time, I think of two changes that Trinity experienced and of how we as a congregation have by God's grace and your graciousness moved ahead on account of them for the common good. One was in the installation of the screens in the sanctuary. I remember hearing firm resistance to such a thought in the early years of my ministry here. I had to wait and pray for about five years to see change happen. Some of you might know that I had served a church in Bangalore India, where we had screens with the latest media technology in 2001. Sometimes, waiting for change from a leader's desk can be challenging. But I was blessed to work with a leadership team that came along patiently and prayerfully to see your trust as a congregation allow us to make the changes. It was gracious of some of you (who had feared this change) to come and tell me later of how you ultimately appreciated the change in view of its benefits for our common experience of worship. I am aware even after the screens have been up that some of you will always be more of "bulletin people" and others of you will be more of "screen people", but the beauty is that when we come together, we are all still God's people.

Another significant change was the inauguration of Revive, (our contemporary worship service) in February of 2023. It has encouraged me greatly to see those of you, who have mostly been comfortable with traditional forms of worship, join us in worship at Revive. Thank you for your prayers, support, and encouragement as a congregation to this step that has brought new families and individuals to Trinity and is blessing our young people with the joy of worshiping in a music language that is close to their hearts.

Change is easy if it is not sub-zero!

I don't like the thought too much that a plowable snow is predicted tonight. Nevertheless, I am getting ready with our snow-blower, a warm pair of gloves, winter apparel, a cap, and boots. I am going to try and enjoy the snow like it is another Christmas in January.

CHANGE IN SERVICE TIMES

Thank you for your prayerful and thoughtful replies to the church survey concerning a change in the Sunday schedule and service times. 122 people replied - that counts each person, and not each survey, for some answered for multiple people in their family. 89% said you are willing to support a trial period, and 11% have reservations.

At the Worship Committee meeting this past Monday, we had a useful and detailed conversation considering the proposal in light of the surveys. At the end of the discussion, everyone supported recommending a trial period. We took the recommendation to the Leadership Team, and the Leadership Team approved the trial period.

We believe the times for the services best serve both the traditional service and Revive. The Adult Sunday School class will meet from 8:30-9:30. The traditional sanctuary worship will be at 9:30. Coffee Fellowship will be between the traditional service and Revive, from 10:30 to 11:00. Coffee Fellowship is our time to all be together and learn to know one another. There are approximately 26 people, new to Trinity, coming to Revive over the past year, and there are approximately 20 people, new to Trinity, coming to the traditional services.

All of the surveys were read and we are addressing some of your concerns within this time frame. For instance, we will be staffing the nursery during Revive and Children's SS for those children age 5 and under. Children are welcome at Coffee Fellowship and then they will go to Sunday School after Coffee Fellowship. Revive and Children's Sunday School will begin at 11:00. The nursery will be staffed during both the 9:30 and 11:00 services.

The trial period will begin the first Sunday of February, which is Feb. 4th, and continue to the last Sunday of April. At that time, we will again conduct a survey to get your feedback on the schedule.

Thank you as we strive to be a Christ-centered, Bible-believing, Community-focused, and Caring Church.


February 15th Time for pick up 10:30 AM

WHO ARE YOU WORKING FOR? by Jamie Bream

"Do you see a man skilled in his work? He will stand in the presence of kings. He will not stand in the presence of unknown men." Proverbs 22:29 (HCSB)

Michael Jordan is undoubtedly one of the greatest basketball players of all time. During his fifteen seasons playing in the NBA, he scored 32,292 points, was selected for the NBA All- Star game fourteen times, and won six national championships with the Chicago Bulls (at all of which he was named MVP, as well). In addition, he won gold medals representing the United States in men's basketball at both the 1984 and 1992 Summer Olympics. However, basketball did not always come so naturally to Jordan – in fact, he was cut from his high school varsity team when he tried out his sophomore year. Unwilling to give up, he began a vigorous workout routine that, coupled with a 4" growth spurt, enabled him to make the team the following year and eventually led him to be named a McDonald's All-American his senior year. Even after being drafted by the Bulls in 1984, he continued to work on perfecting his skills. "Jordan's defining characteristic wasn't his talent, but having the humility to know he had to work constantly to be the best" former Bulls coach Phil Jackson once stated. "When Jordan first entered the league, his jump shot wasn't good enough. He spent his offseason taking hundreds of jumpers a day until it was perfect" (Business Insider, 2012).

Michael Jordan's story embodies the concept found in Proverbs 22:29 – after working day after day and year after year to become skilled in his work, he became a household name throughout America (if not the world) and has, quite literally, stood in the presence of our country's leaders. However, there is another piece to this puzzle – the reason we work diligently at what we do. Paul gives us this reason in his letter to the church at Colossae: "Whatever you do, do it enthusiastically, as something done for the Lord and not for men, knowing that you will receive the reward of an inheritance from the Lord. You serve the Lord Christ" (Colossians 3:23-24). Fellow Christian, we will one day stand before the King of kings, but until then, we have been instructed to work skillfully and enthusiastically so that we can give God glory through the outcome of our labor. So, whatever you do, whether it be teaching, accounting, performing, or something in between, do it to the very best of your ability and to the glory of God alone.

THOUGHTS TO CONSIDER:



My mom loved her little yorkie named Bella - she was so cute (about 13-14 years of age). Mom's health began to fail in late 2022. We found a wonderful independent living apartment for her that would allow her to keep little Bella. Less than a week before her move date her heart and kidney doctors told her it was time to involve Hospice to help manage her health. With this latest information she decided "not to move" but to stay in her home. The Hospice staff was so kind and for several months mom was considered "stable" - all vitals were good. In mid-November of 2023 she started to decline quickly and was rushed to the hospital; the prognosis was not good. I was overwhelmed on so many levels, but a BIG worry was Bella. What was I going to do? I'm not home most of the time and my husband is still working. Bella was so used to having mom with her 24/7. As I was sitting with mom the next morning her Hospice Pastor called me, and her words were "if something should happen to your mom my husband and I would consider it a privilege to foster Bella. And, if it works out adopt her permanently". God's answer to my prayer was at the exact right time with the exact right person. Once again, I was overwhelmed, but this time with gratitude. I believe mom understood everything I whispered to her because it was within an hour after I told her that Bella had a home she passed away. It is working out great with Bella.
