My dear Trinity Family,

Love in action.

Have you seen love in the eyes of a new mother who tenderly cares for her little one? Even as that new and committed mother raises her child, she commits herself to a life in which everything (literally everything) can be altered by the little one that will journey with her. In the 35 years of being a pastor, I have listened to the heartbreak of some parents who invested much love in their children, only to be disappointed with hurt and pain. Love in action is not an easy thing.

During this season, our world will talk a lot about love. As Valentine's Day approaches, it will also be a season of gloom and pain for those who have lost loved ones, and those who have tried to scale the unreachable Everest of perfect love. Love in action is not an easy thing.

To get a rough idea about how much America spends in the pursuit of love on one single day in the year, I searched the internet with this question: How much did Americans spend on Valentine's Day 2024? Here is the answer that popped up, "In 2024, Americans spent an estimated \$25.8 billion on Valentine's Day, which is about \$185.81 per person. This was a record high and was about \$2 billion more than 2022."

Obviously, love is a much sought after longing. A June 6, 2024, New York Times Post titled "How many Americans still believe in true love", notes that, "True love is still alive as 70% of Americans believe it exists".² I went on to find out how trends in marriage (which by God's design is at the heart of human society) might have changed. To the question, "what was the divorce rate in 1950 in the United States?" this is the answer I found, "In 1950, the divorce rate in the United States was 2.5 divorces per 1,000 people. This means that less than 20% of couples who married in 1950 ended up divorced." To the question, "what was the divorce rate in 2024 in the United States?" This was the answer I found, "In 2024, the divorce rate in the United States was estimated to be 41% for first marriages, 60% for second marriages, and 73% for third marriages"

Whether those numbers are accurate or not, would it not be reasonable to conclude that little boys and girls who experience the separation of their parents, go through much pain? Not to forget, that the adults involved also face so much brokenness and sorrow. We live in a broken world. A world of broken promises, broken dreams, and broken hearts.

As the people of God, we are called to be a people of love, maybe of more love than we can imagine. In our February preaching series titled, "More love", we will keep our hearts open to what God has to say. If by the end of the series, some home would find healing from wounds, some heart would find strength to love again, it would be worth every investment of time in prayer, music practices by the Choir, the Bells, the Revive Worship Team, behind the scenes work by greeters, ushers, teachers, altar guild, coffee-fellowship, worship committee, our team of staff and the pastor's study and preparation times for sermon-crafting.

Pray with us that this will truly be a month of more love.

The first two stanzas of the text set before us a daily and very regular rhythm of daily praise and singing: “sun/moon”; “rising morn/lights of evening.” The text emphasizes all creation praising God, and in that creation, we see God and respond to Him with our songs of praise! A line to not overlook amidst the praise-filled text is that in stanza 5, “Ye who long pain and sorrow bear, praise God and on him cast your care...” This short line encourages us to find strength to praise God in the good and the bad. In conclusion, the text of “All Creatures of Our God and King” ends each refrain with a three-fold “Alleluia!” The symbolism is rich. The repetition encourages us to continue the song of praise throughout eternity.

HEALTHY TENSIONS

“But in fact God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as He wanted them to be. If they were all one part, where would the body be? As it is, there are many parts, but one body.”
1 Corinthians 12:18-21

Over the course of the last year, our Revive worship and media teams have been reading and discussing Bob Kauflin’s *Worship Matters* as a group. The book, primarily written for worship leaders and teams, is divided into four sections: The Leader, The Task, Healthy Tensions, and Right Relationships; as of this writing, we are in the middle of Healthy Tensions. Kauflin, in his introduction to this section, writes that tensions in worship are like the tension in a volleyball net: “the net [can] be set up only when there [is] a healthy tension between both poles”.¹ You see, you can’t set up a volleyball net by yourself because you need tension in the net and between the posts to keep them all upright. Without tension, the entire assembly will fall. This is a visual example of the importance of tension in worship.

Throughout the section, Kauflin covers several different sets of tensions, including Head and Heart (doctrine versus emotion), Internal and External (how people express themselves), and Planned and Spontaneous (following the plan versus going off the plan). Of course, each person or church will likely have a preference for one side of each tension, as is seen with Trinity’s two services. The Sanctuary (traditional) service usually leans towards the first term in each tension, while the Revive (contemporary) service usually leans toward the second. Of course, overemphasis on either end of the tension can end in disaster, as in the case of Head versus Heart. Overemphasis on doctrine will lead to a theologically orthodox but emotionally dead church, more impressed with doctrinal formulations than with Jesus. Overemphasis on emotion will lead to a desire for a good feeling and an experience rather than a desire for God, regardless of how it is obtained. Either way, the volleyball net has fallen. “Isn’t there a way to appreciate both perspectives - in tension together?” Kauflin asks. “Shouldn’t we think of these as both/and issues rather than either/or?”.² Of course we should!

Kauflin’s goal in examining tensions in worship is not to try and make them all perfectly balanced - rather, it is to learn to “understand, pursue, and enjoy all the ways God has enabled us to worship Him”.³ It’s the same concept that Paul writes about in 1 Corinthians 12: the body is unified, but also diversified. “If the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be?” (1 Cor. 12:17a). If all of worship were doctrine-based, where would the emotion be? “But God has put the body together” Paul writes. “There should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other” (1 Cor. 12:24b-25). The different tensions, just as the different parts of the body, must have equal concern for one another. The tensions must be kept tense so that “God [can] be worshiped and His people [can] be built up” through the many different ways He has provided, “all for His glory”.⁴

2024 YEAR-END FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Great is God's faithfulness. Trinity Church finished the 2024 calendar year financially strong, thanks to your faithfulness and generosity. The following is a summary of the 2024 year-end financial information for the General Fund:

In addition, through your generous giving through special offerings, Trinity Church was able to support various charitable organizations and individuals in need both locally and around the world. Giving to others through the Benevolence Fund for 2024 totaled \$44,676.

Because of your support, we have been able to help those in our local community through the Love Box ministry, backpack giveaway, Starfish Ministries, A.S.K. program, New Hope Ministries, Downtown Daily Bread, Vickie's Angel Walk, Neighborhood Center, Bethesda Mission, CCU-Help, New Life for Girls, the YWCA Greater Harrisburg, Everstand Mechanicsburg Home for Children, and providing assistance with food, transportation, medical costs and housing costs to 9 families.

Globally, we have been able to help others through donations to UMCOR, Mission Central, the CROP Walk, Operation Christmas Child, World Vision, Commission to Every Nation (supporting missionary John Williams Jr, son of John and Sandy Williams), OC International (supporting missionary Bruce Sider, nephew of Ron and Beth Sider), the Voice of the Martyrs, Because International (the shoe that grows), Philadelphia Dream Center, Our Daily Bread Ministries, Valley Light Programs, and support to the people impacted by hurricanes Helene and Milton.

From our financial year 2023, we tithed 10% of our year's excess income over expenditure to support missions. We will be discussing the possibility for 2024 as well. Also with our existing pending repairs to sections of our roof, air-conditioning needs, and potential costs in an older building, we would make every effort to save any excess of income over expenditure in the Memorial Funds to use for such purposes as needed.

We look forward to your faithful giving to sustain the ongoing ministry at Trinity. Thank you especially for everyone who has considered tithing 1/10 or what the Lord lays upon your heart from your incomes to the ministry of his kingdom here at Trinity. Your weekly offerings continue to add to the resources.

We thank God for all the ways he blessed Trinity Church in 2024. We will continue to strive to be good stewards of all the resources he provides to us.
