**IMMEASURABLY MORE**

I know many have mentioned how last year's theme, "All for Jesus" has blessed them. I pray you will be blessed again by our 2025 theme: Immeasurably More. When I was the new Christian, I came across the Navigators wheel for Christian discipleship. It was a simple but powerful tool that helped me focus on four areas in my walk with Jesus. The wheel became an inspiration to grow as a Christ follower based on core Biblical disciplines and foundations. I am sharing the wheel and explanation here below and would encourage you to keep this page with you for the entire year and focus on the disciplines it highlights. Our January preaching series will focus on these four areas.

Immeasurably grateful for Jesus! And for your love for Him.

## Navigators Discipleship Tool

The Wheel diagram, created by Navigator founder Dawson Trotman in the 1930s, is a simple and effective way to visually explain the structure of a God-glorifying life. Sharing it can be as simple as drawing it on a napkin or notepad. The diagram challenges us to think deeply about how to be an obedient follower of Christ and each part represents a crucial component of a vibrant Christian life.



## THE WHEEL

### *How you relate to yourself*

#### THE CENTER HUB AND OUTER RIM

- **Christ:** Total surrender to Christ's authority and Lordship is not always a decision made right at conversion, but is a necessary act of the will. For the believer, the "old life" has gone and the new has come (2 Corinthians 5:17), because Christ has begun to dwell in us (Galatians 2:20). God creates within us the desire to do what He wants us to do in order to express His Lordship in our lives.

- **The Obedient Christian in Action:** Some acts of obedience to God are internal, such as attitudes, habits, motives, values and day-to-day thoughts. But even these eventually surface outwardly in our relationships with other people. Keeping His commands in obedience is our outward indication of inward health and love for Christ (John 14:21, Romans 12:1).

### *How you relate to God*

#### THE VERTICAL SPOKES

- **The Word:** God uses His word to speak directly to us, revealing not only who He is, but how He calls us to live and interact with everyone around us (2 Timothy 3:16). This means an earnest personal intake of God's Word is essential for our spiritual health and growth (Joshua 1:8). As God speaks to us through the Scriptures, we learn how to obey Him and apply the gospel to every part of our lives. We also come to know Jesus personally and find He is worthy of our steadfast allegiance.

- **Prayer:** Prayer is the natural response to God as we hear Him speak through His Word. It is sharing our heart with the One who longs for our companionship and who cares about our concerns. Prayer not only trains our hearts and minds to know the power and glory of God, but also turns His ear towards action in our lives. (John 15:7, Philippians 4:6-7).

### *How you relate to others*

#### THE HORIZONTAL SPOKES

- **Fellowship:** God has directed Christians to build each other up through interdependence and loving relationships with each other (Hebrews 10:24-25). Gathering together as the Body of Christ draws God close around us as we praise Him and encourage one another (Matthew 18:20).

- **Witnessing:** God has given believers the joy and responsibility of telling the world about the good news of Christ's work on Earth (Matthew 4:19). In fact, sharing about His amazing grace is the natural overflow of a rich, vibrant life in Christ (Romans 1:16).

**SCRIPTURE AND SONG** Please note that the church’s website has a link titled “Scripture and Song.” The selections you hear are brief, original meditations on a particular scripture and a related hymn. You can also listen to recordings that have been archived on the page.

**PRAISE THE LORD WHO REIGNS ABOVE** The above quoted is found in The United Methodist Hymnal, #96. It encourages us to make music to God with plucked and percussive instruments; although, this outward expression of praise must be matched with our inward expression of praise from the heart. Singing is a very personal way of making music. Unlike other instruments, we use our own body, our own voice to initiate sound. It may be difficult to do; yet, we all have a voice to raise! ## GROWING AS A DISCIPLE OF JESUS by Pauline Peifer

More than 50 individuals participated in our discipleship evening from October 16 through November 20. One of these classes was a membership class taught by Pastor Arun culminating on Membership Sunday. The second focused on students learning key elements in the study of the Bible taught by Jan Ocamb. The third was a class taught by Pauline Peifer that highlighted 6 biblical characters (Abraham, Naomi, the disciples Peter and John, Joseph, Moses). Each session focused on how they maintained hope in the midst of many difficulties.

Various responses were given from class comments at the end: “Jan provided several helpful resources to compliment the study” and “I learned stuff I didn’t know”; “I learned more about Pastor Arun and the church and was able to meet new people.” Responses from Pauline’s class: “Certain individuals in the Bible that God chose had problems and situations just like us.” and “I liked searching the Bible to help us learn about hope”.

Growing as a disciple of Jesus is a lifelong pursuit. Whether you are trying to figure out if Christianity is for you, or you have been a Christian for a short time or many years, these are important opportunities to increase your Bible understanding and grow as a disciple of Jesus.

The next opportunity will be The Lenten Series that begins on March 5 and concludes on April 9, 2025 held on Wednesday evenings with a meal together at 5:30 p.m. The specific subject will be announced before long. Plan to make this event part of your Lenten commitment.

## WHERE AM I NOW?

*“For My thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways My ways,” declares the Lord.  
“As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are My ways higher than your ways and My  
thoughts than your thoughts.” Isaiah 55:8-9 (NIV)*

Christian Life Assembly’s 2024 Christmas Wonderland, The Brightest Star, follows the life of the talented but often overdramatic Sandra McCall as she experiences a fall from stardom on Broadway, which ultimately leads to her directing and starring in a small-town Christmas musical in upstate New York. As the story progresses, Sandra comes to a head with feelings that have been brewing since before her arrival in town, knowing that she has no choice but to finish what she has begun but not knowing which way to turn. As the curtain closes on Act I, she sings a song entitled “Where Am I Now?” that encompasses her ongoing internal struggle with who she is, who she wants to be, and where her next step must take her:

*Where am I now, now that I’m here?  
Which way do I turn when it’s all so unclear?  
I’m standing alone with nothing but fear  
Where am I now, now that I’m here?*

How many of us can relate to Sandra on a personal level? How many of us have felt that same way at one time or another, wondering why we are in a certain situation or not knowing where to turn next? How many of us ended up in that place from following what we thought was God’s leading? These situations can be confusing enough when we get to them on our own, much less if we feel we are doing what God told us to do! Fortunately, we serve a God who we don’t always have to understand because we can trust that He is great and that He works “all things [together] for the good of those who love Him, who have been called according to His purpose” (Romans 8:28). Take comfort in the example of a few Biblical characters - Abraham praised God beneath the stars, even though he didn’t understand how he’d ever become the father of nations. David praised God in the wilderness, even though he didn’t understand why he was running for his life instead of sitting on the throne. The Israelites praised God with a mighty shout, even though they didn’t understand Jericho’s wall would fall without a fight. <sup>1</sup> You, too, can praise God without knowing your ending - just as Sandra later realizes, through all the difficulties, falls, and storms of life, God was still right by her side, and even now “[He] is still holding my hand.”


