



# YOUR Questions, GOD'S Answers.

My dear Church Family,

Vision keeps the fire and flames alive. Fire doesn't always burn things down, it moves things forward. I remember traveling in steam engine driven trains in my younger years. By the time we reached our destination, in those non-air-conditioned coaches with windows open, we had soot and signs of coal on our faces and in our hair. Ask any steam engine driver who kept the coals burning to keep that train moving! Vision is to the Church what burning coals is to steam engines. The Bible warns in Proverbs 29:18 that where there is no vision, the people perish. Let me ask you a question, kindly. What do you remember quickest when you hear the words, "I have a dream"? Most people with knowledge of American history will immediately go to the famed speech by Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Of course, lovers of the music pop culture might also remember the Swedish pop band ABBA for their song, "I have a dream".

I believe you, as God's people at Trinity, are faithful to His call to love Him and to live for Him. I have witnessed as your pastor over my nearly 11 years of serving at Trinity, that the Gospel indeed finds loving hands and willing feet in the mission of Christ. This is not a church with just lip service, but with life service. I believe that the seeds sown by those who went before us, the many prayers that were raised to God, continue to yield their spiritual blessings upon our present community.

What would Trinity look like 50 years from now? What would it look like 10 years from now? How about 2 years from now?

I dream of a church which is full of kids, teenagers, youth and young adults who are nurtured in our holy and sacred faith by the authentic witness of adults and elders, who love Jesus and will do anything to please him. I dream of a kid's ministry that ministers to 70 to 100 children every week. I also dream of thriving youth, young adults, young couples and neighborhood connect groups that bond and cement our relationships with God and with one another.

So, where do we begin? Presently, our teachers in the children's ministry tell me that we have been experiencing inconsistent numbers in terms of weekly attendance. The team is faithful but few. They work hard to plan Bible lessons, crafts and snacks. Right now, in our children's ministry there is a sense of, "we don't know what it would look like next week". With parents being busy with their life-demands (and the temptation that Sunday could be a good day to sleep in and slow down), with all the pressures that kids go through (especially when parents are separated), and with the challenge of Sunday sports, getting kids into our Church doors on Sundays has been increasingly challenging.

But we have noticed that it's different with VBS. (Of course, VBS is hosted only once a year) but please think with me, nevertheless. I wonder if the parents who send all those kids to Vacation Bible school (Registration is now over 80 kids as I write) might be willing to send them to Trinity if we had a midweek program of Bible teaching and fun? For a while now, I have desired for Trinity to host the Awana Bible program here at Trinity. It is a program known to bless kids in their knowledge of the scriptures and their love for the Lord and his mission.

We can make it happen. We have a beautiful space. We have a strategic location. We have you. Yes! YOU!!!

I am requesting you to pray about this need. I believe we will need 25 to 30 volunteers on a weekly midweek basis to run a program like this. At VBS, we have almost 70 volunteers and it is just fantastic.

We need not run the program all year around. We could run it in two cycles or seasons.

Who knows? The vision-language in this case, might by God's grace, the Holy Spirit's nudging and your obedience to, "We have a dream".

If you think I am dreaming crazy, don't wake me up. This is a great dream!!!

## **FOREVER AND EVER** by Jamie Bream

*“I exalt You, my God the King, and praise Your name forever and ever.  
I will praise You every day; I will honor Your name forever and ever.”*

Psalm 145:1-2 (HCSB)

What comes to your mind when you think of the phrase “forever and ever”? For some, it may conjure up memories of vows shared on a wedding day. For others, it might represent the years since they have seen their friends from high school or college. Some may even feel it best describes how long Friday lasts before the weekend finally arrives! If I stood on a street corner and asked one hundred different people what they thought of when they heard the phrase “forever and ever”, I would probably get one hundred different answers.

David’s repetition of this phrase in the Psalms – three times alone in Psalm 145 – leaves no question as to what it means to him. Clearly, David’s interpretation of “forever and ever” translates to “eternally – in a way that continues or lasts permanently”, especially in reference to his worship. Is this the frequency with which we worship the God of all gods, the Alpha and the Omega? Or are we simply content to worship in church on Sunday and then try to make it through the rest of the week without lifting so much as a song of praise to God? Our worship should be a daily, continuous flow of praise to God in response for everything He has done for us and continues to do for us. Truly, He alone is worthy to be praised, “forever and ever”!

### THOUGHTS TO CONSIDER:

- Do we approach Sunday worship as a continuation of our praise from the past week? Or do we consider it a once-a-week, “fill-up-the-tank” kind of experience?
- How has your personal worship life been this past week? Is there something preventing you from worshipping God daily, and if so, what?

### **YOUNG ADULTS CONNECT**

We had conversations with young adults who have been coming off-and-on to Trinity. Pastor Arun especially went on campus and met Messiah University students to get their feedback. The church board invited Xavier Bryant, a Messiah student (who worships at Revive and plays drums on the worship team) for his insights. We came to one important conclusion. Young adults will be more prone to stay long in a church circle, if the church provides a Young Adults ministry for them. 
**NATIONAL NIGHT OUT** - Tuesday, August 5 from 6-8 pm
