RESTORATION WORK IN THE SANCTUARY

Our Trustees and the rest of our leadership team have taken a series of steps regarding restoration work in the sanctuary. While we cannot afford to take on other recommended jobs at this moment, we are addressing the most urgent one.

The surface of the wall behind the curtain in the altar area needs restoration. The work is scheduled to begin on January 26, 2026, and should take two weeks to complete. On Sunday, February 1, 2026, and Sunday, February 8, 2026, we will gather for our 9:15 AM traditional service in Fellowship Hall. The service will include traditional music, with the choir and bells participating. We will have our coffee fellowship as usual in Fellowship Hall at 10:30 AM, followed by worship at Revive at 11:00 AM. NEW THING by Jamie Bream, Contemporary Worship Leader

*See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?
I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland.
Isaiah 43:19 (NIV)*

*These are the days that we prayed for, a stirring of faith has begun
And I've seen so much, still I'm certain, that the best has not yet come
I see a wave of revival, preceded by justice and praise
Where young and the old run to Jesus
And all the sins that held us back are laid to waste*

Hillsong Young & Free penned these lines in their 2020 release “New Thing.” Regarding the song, worship leader Melodie Wagner said that “‘New Thing’ is very much what we would call a prophesying song. It’s taking that scripture, when it’s God saying, ‘Behold, I’m doing a new thing. Do you not see it? Do you not perceive it?’ This song is speaking into what’s beyond what we can see right now. It’s meant to be faith-building. It’s really close to my heart, and I think it could be a really incredible encouragement to anyone who’s listening.”

In 2026, Trinity Church will embark on its 153rd year of celebrating, connecting, and communicating the gospel of Jesus Christ to those who have yet to hear it. We’re living in the days that over five generations of church members have prayed for, still doing what the church’s founders set out to do in 1873. However, I think we can all agree that although we have come so far and been blessed so greatly, the best has not yet come. We still have room in our pews and empty seats in our classrooms while the lost continue on their darkened paths, heading for eternal destruction. We see revival throughout our country and world, and it begs the question: “Why can’t that happen here?” The good news is, it can! But how?

First, we must seek personal revival. In Psalm 51:10, David asks God to “Create in me a pure heart... and renew a steadfast spirit within me.” Similarly, A.W. Tozer emphasizes that revival begins with holy sorrow and personal consecration, stating that “The true man of God is heartsick, grieved at the worldliness of the Church, grieved at the toleration of sin in the Church, grieved at the prayerlessness in the Church.” Secondly, we must engage in persistent prayer and worship. Psalm 42:1 reflects this persistency: “As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for you, my God.” Evangelist J. Edwin Orr agrees, stating that “No great spiritual awakening has begun anywhere in the world apart from united prayer.” Finally, the church must be unified in its actions. In 1 Corinthians 1:10, Paul, writing to the church at Corinth, asks them to live in unity: “I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree with one another in what you say and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be perfectly united in mind and thought.” Dietrich Bonhoeffer reflects Paul’s stance, stating that “We must be one in Christ, or we will be nothing in the world.”

As we enter our 153rd year, the path to the “new thing” God is doing requires our commitment to personal revival, persistent prayer, and unwavering unity. By embracing these principles and actively seeking His way, the best is truly yet to come as we run to Jesus and reach the lost with renewed vigor and faith.

TRINITY IS MOVING TO A KEYLESS ENTRY SYSTEM

For the safety and security of our congregation and facilities, we have been through two on-campus security studies, which were conducted by an outside agency experienced in the field. One of the recommendations from the studies was to transition to a keyless entry system. We are happy to inform you that we now have the system installed and are moving towards implementing keyless entry.

How will this affect you? This change will not affect your entry for church services, programs, or events. We are grateful to all our ushers and greeters for their faithful work.

If you need to enter the building during office hours (8:30 AM to 12:30 PM, Monday to Thursday), please use the bell at our main door. Our office staff on duty will unlock the door for you. There are no changes to entering the building during normal business hours. Leaders or volunteers of ministries or programs who need after-office hours access are requested to please contact Scott Sundy or Jamie Bream. Keyless entry eliminates the risk of multiple keys being “out there” and facilitates timed access to individuals based on ministry and volunteer needs.

If you are someone who has had a physical church key, please note that the key will not open the doors once we have fully implemented the keyless entry system.
