

My dear Church Family,

Alas and did my Savior bleed, And did my Sovereign die, Would He devote that sacred head, For sinners such as I.

Was it for crimes that I have done, He groaned upon the tree, Amazing pity grace unknown And love beyond degree. 1

During this Lenten season, I desire to journey with you to Calvary. Oh! To be consumed by what the hymn writer Isaac Watts described as, "love beyond degree".

Our preaching series for March 2024 is titled, "A crazy love? But how?" We take a break from our "Remarkable" series from the Gospel of Mark, to think about God's Calvary love and how it can work its way through our lives. Join me as we inch closer to the cross "when God, the mighty maker, died for his own creature's sin." ²

The cross was a choice God made. Nothing compelled him but his love. Nothing mattered to him but you.

Many people today go around with a cross on their earrings, bracelet, or necklace. We are so used to seeing this that we are not shocked by it. We might be if we saw someone wearing a gallows or an electric chair on a chain; but the cross was just as much a form of execution. Indeed, it was one of the cruelest forms of execution known to humankind. It was abolished in AD 315, because even the Romans considered it too inhumane. ³

In describing what Jesus did the Bible declares, "and being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death - even death on a cross!" 4

Sounds crazy? Jesus left his heaven and was born like every other human being on the planet. No exceptions. He even arrived being tied to Mary with an umbilical cord! He was dead serious about doing life just like we experienced it. No divine insurance coverage exempted him from accusations, frustrations, and even temptations. He lived the ordinary everyday life that the people He created experienced. Then he took the plunge and laid his life down to pay the penalty for human sin. That's how crazy He is about you and me.

As author Max Lucado puts it, "so Jesus himself swung the hammer. The same hand that stilled the seas stills your guilt. The same hand that cleansed the temple cleanses your heart. The hand is the hand of God. The nail is the nail of God. And as the hands of Jesus opened for the nail, the doors of heaven open for you." ⁵

Oh! What a Savior!

Each stanza pens a different prayer concern for the heart. There are no less than 18 adjectives the author uses to describe the heart he prays for and earnestly desires. These include the words resigned; submissive; humble; contrite; believing; true; clean; perfect; right; pure.

During this Lenten season, we can pray these same words to seek God with a clean heart. May we seek him in prayer and Word, with thanksgiving in our heart. Lord, I do not desire to grieve you. Search me, try me. For in my trials, walk with me. My trials make me stronger to share your Word, your love, your saving grace with the world. Uphold me with your free spirit and take not your Holy Spirit from me. Restore unto me the joy of your salvation. Amen.

THAT'S WHAT LOVE IS

"No one has greater love [no one has shown stronger affection] than to lay down (give up) his own life for his friends." John 15:13 (AMPC)

Love can be a confusing topic. If I were to stand on a street corner and ask one hundred individuals what their one true love was, I would probably get a pretty wide range of answers. I doubt all one hundred answers would be the names of people, either - in fact, I'm sure I would hear responses involving work, hobbies, sports, and travel (and, depending on where this street corner was, NASCAR may even come up once or twice). In his book, Words On Worship, worship leader Charles Billingsley expresses this predicament, writing, "In a day and age where the word "love" is flippantly thrown about in reference to anything from football, to food, and family, it is sometimes hard to get a real understanding of what real love looks like" - and I agree. With so many things to love, so many people to fall for, and so many idols to draw our attention, is it actually possible to know and understand what true love is? If so, is it possible to possess and model this depth of love?

In his song "That's What Love Is", Christian vocalist David Phelps describes the emotion in question and its effects on those who possess it. The chorus reads below.

When you give until there's nothing left
And it makes you give the very best
It can make you laugh and make you cry
It can let you down and lift you up so high
When you find the only reason left to live
That's what love is

This agape love, a sacrificial love that unites and heals, is the kind that Jesus modeled for us in His death and resurrection. He gave His very best - His life - for us, pouring out His blood as a sacrifice on our behalf. Laughing and crying with us in our joys and trials, His love brought Him down to Earth before lifting Him high upon the cross. Not surprisingly, then, the greatest example of true love is narrated in John 3:16: "For God loved the world in this way: He gave His One and Only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him will not perish but have eternal life" (HSCB). That's the truest picture of love we've got! That's what love is!

THOUGHTS TO CONSIDER:

- If I were to ask you what your one true love is, how would you answer? Would you be proud of your answer? Or, would you be ashamed of it?
- Do you love others with the same kind of love that Jesus gives you?

Read and reflect on the following quote as you consider your answer.

"What does love look like? It has hands to help others. It has feet to hasten to the poor and needy. It has eyes to see misery and want. It has ears to hear the sighs and sorrows of men. That is what love looks like." - St. Augustine




