My dear Church Family,

On Sunday, February 9, 2025, we could not gather in-person because of a winter weather advisory, the possibility of freezing rain and potential black ice. But we did have the opportunity of gathering online. Worship services might be cancelled, but nothing can cancel worship!

I truly thank the Lord as your pastor for all the blessings and investments made in our online and streaming capabilities that make such moments possible. I am grateful for how the Lord used Nihal especially during the pandemic to help us establish an online and streaming ministry. We had an amazing team of trustees and leadership team members who came alongside and believed in a media vision that would keep us connected within and connecting beyond our walls. We have come a long way by the grace of God and his amazing provisions. For instance, we are grateful to have moved from the times at which we had a simple amplifier and a wooden box speaker in the sanctuary in 2014 to the equipment that we presently have. The equipment and our team help make our worship experiences more understandable and better communicable to those in Trinity and to people beyond our walls. I won't forget that good ole box speaker. Oh, how it struggled as it vibrated (or shall we say, "grumbled and grunted") frustrated with the bass in my voice! Yes, and I suspect it became a victim of language dysphoria with "the British Indian English accent" of the new pastor. It was therefore not surprising that after a few months of beginning my ministry at Trinity, both the amplifier and the speaker sighed and signed up for a funeral! They had had enough! They died!

Let me let you in on a secret. The last church I served at in India had a 32-channel audio mixer in the sanctuary with that many lines for microphones and the ability to include instruments. We had projectors for words and videos, and our Bishop had often encouraged the other pastors in our annual conference to visit and "take a look" at what we were doing in our church. He encouraged them to aspire to replicate the ideas in the churches that they were serving. He called it "the most high-tech church" in his conference. That was probably true in the Methodist Church in India in the early 2000s. We of course, preferred being known as a grateful, praying and ordinary group of people worshipping and serving an extraordinary God.

When we moved from India and began ministry at Trinity in 2014, I became aware of the audio equipment that we had – the single amplifier and that solo wooden box speaker. Oh! Did I miss what we had in India! I knew in my heart that as a new pastor, I could not ask the trustees or church Leadership Team to consider investing in a new audio system or upgrading it for that matter. I had been taught at seminary that during the first year in a new church, a pastor must only appreciate, connect with people, celebrate the church's history and serve with gladness. So, I resorted to the only weapon I had. I prayed. Each time I heard a dear senior tell me that they could not understand what I was saying on account of that amplifier, speaker and my accent, it made me pray even more. Now, I must admit that I had not imagined that the answer to my prayers would be a funeral for that old amplifier and box speaker! God's ways are indeed mysterious. And for reasons he knows best, he allowed my strange British Indian English accent to remain! I wonder how our new speakers are managing!

On another note, isn't that how new life begins in the Kingdom. The old dies. The new is born. Jesus said, "Unless a grain of wheat is buried in the ground, dead to the world, it is never any more than a grain of wheat. But if it is buried, it sprouts and reproduces itself many times over. In the same way, anyone who holds on to life just as it is destroys that life. But if you let it go, reckless in your love, you'll have it forever, real and eternal." John 12:24-25 (The Message). Pastor Rick Warren writes in the Daily Hope devotional for February 13, 2025, "Think about that. If God can raise a dead person, then he also can raise a dead marriage, a dead career, a dead dream, or a dead hope. He specializes in turning crucifixions into resurrections. God can do miracles when we hand everything over to him."

Guess what happened around the time of the funeral of our amplifier and speaker? The Lord moved Ruth Ranieli's heart and she sent Trinity a check for \$25,000. Her gift enabled us to take care of some other church needs as well as to buy a new audio system. It was during the pandemic that the Lord blessed us further with the gift from Joyce Long's estate and later with a part of Ruth Ranieli's estate. These generous gifts enabled us to get to where we are today in terms of our audio, video and streaming capabilities as a church and also in the major renovation of our pipe organ. And "Revive" became possible only by prayer. For almost eight years as your pastor, I had longed for, dreamed of and prayed for a service that would meet the spiritual longings of those for whom contemporary music speaks the language of the soul, heart and mind. I am confident that there were others who were praying as well. But when the Lord made things happen, it was simply beyond our imagination. We received a gift of \$100,000 from an anonymous donor for the project and Doris Bernardo contributed \$18,000 for the new flooring. God was indeed at work. Around the same time, my friend Pastor Kristian Walker, worship and missions Pastor at Christian Life Assembly called to say, "Arun, I think your request to me of two years is being answered. I think I have your man to lead your contemporary worship ministry. His name is Jamie Bream, a graduate of Liberty University". Only God could have timed this perfectly. The Fellowship Hall renovation project led by John Mickle and our trustees transformed our fellowship hall to what it is today. In witnessing what God was doing one of our members said, "I used to come to coffee fellowship a couple of years ago and everyone in the room was white except the pastor's family. Today, we walk into the room and there are people of color. It makes me very happy!" God used "Revive" to make that possible. As I am writing this letter, we are days away from our first immersion baptisms at Trinity in 151 years! Lives are being transformed. We thank the Lord for our Leadership Team/ Board members who were obedient to the Lord's leading and for all of you in our loving congregation who helped make these projects become realities. To God be the glory.

Projects never amount to much in God's Kingdom unless they touch people. Here are some testimonies from our online ministry. My friend Brit Warner who is a brilliant, retired recording studio engineer says, "Trinity is my online church." Dr. Ebenezer Rajkumar, from India, usually texts me on Sundays immediately after our first service to share a word of encouragement about the blessings he received while worshipping online. Did you know that if Trinity's services don't go online on YouTube on Sundays, it is not uncommon for me to start receiving messages from the other side of the Atlantic? The chief question being. "Are you not having service today?" We are thankful for our small, faithful, growing online community of worshipers from other and global locations, some of whom are very faithful and regular. The Kunder family in Delaware for instance usually don't miss joining us online on Sundays. They are a hard-working family who own and run a Purdue Chicken farm. All four boys have worked in those chicken coups and on the farm since they were little, assisting dad and mom with managing very large numbers of birds. The parents tell me that their four teenage boys stay totally focused during our services. It is their Sunday practice to talk about the sermon with dad and mom at their dinner table. How cool is that! How good! Those parents are modelling a great way to invest spiritually in our kids and grandkids.

Why am I writing this letter and highlighting these experiences?

I want to ask if you would faithfully pray for our online ministries. Let us especially pray that the ministry of God's Word will have a long lasting impact in the lives of those who worship with us. While we love music, we love our traditions, we love our worship spaces, we love all the creative stuff that we can do to make church better, Jesus did not say that our music, our traditions, our creativity (not even the pastor's raps), our technology or even our worship spaces will remain forever. But he did say two things. First, that "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away." Matthew 24:35. Second, "Very truly I tell you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life and will not be judged but has crossed over from death to life." John 5:24

Jesus is saying that two things will stand the test of time, his saving word and his saved people. Thank you for believing with me that God's Word shapes God's world. At Trinity, we are committed to living by God's Word and sharing his word in practical, personal and life-transforming ways.

Inviting your participation: Would you commit to pray more faithfully for me and all those who preach alongside me? Pray for the Holy Spirit's wisdom, hard work at the study, compassion, clarity, courage and passion. Pray that God's word from Trinity will reach people just where they need it the most. Would you be able to pray weekly on **Saturdays for our ministry of sharing God's word for God's world?**

Wow! The pastor's sermons are long, and now his letters are getting longer. Time to pull the stop. As I conclude I want to put it out there that we will be helped to optimize our media, online and technology use for the Gospel with your financial support. We have some possibilities and hopes to make things better and more effective.

Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for Us?" And I said, "Here am I. Send me!" Isaiah 6:8 (NIV)

As I write this article, I am dreading the upcoming weekend (February 15-16). Why? Because I made myself available. This weekend is the annual Hershey Chocolatetown Basketball Tournament, which is the last major tournament our officiating chapter covers for the season. Because of the popularity of the tournament, it is necessary that every possible official be able to work games to ensure that all of them are covered. So, as all good officials do, I sent an email to my assigner saying that I could work whatever games were necessary, and a few days later, I got a notification that I had been assigned ten new games, all for Saturday. Ten games! (For reference, there are fourteen games scheduled on my court with a new game kicking off every 55 minutes.) If I had known how many games I was going to be assigned, I probably wouldn't have said I was available at all! The funny thing, though, is that this is exactly what happens when we make ourselves available to God - He'll use us in ways we never could have imagined He would, and probably in ways we don't want Him to. But this is not because He has open slots He has to fill, but because He has a good and perfect plan for our lives that we, in making ourselves available to Him, have taken a step of faith to follow in.

I've heard it said that the most dangerous prayer we can pray is "Here am I - send me!" It's a blank contract and we have no idea of the terms listed on it - most of the time we wouldn't want to know, or probably wouldn't pray that prayer at all if we did know! However, history is full of great men and women who made themselves available to God. The prophet Isaiah prayed that prayer, and God used him to minister to four kings across seventy years during a period of significant political and religious change in Judah and the surrounding regions. The apostle Paul made himself available to God following his conversion on the Damascus road, which resulted in a thirty-five year ministry that included four major missionary journeys, multiple imprisonments, and the writing of approximately two-thirds of the New Testament. My eleventh-grade history teacher, Marc Anderson, prayed that prayer, and God called him out of a twenty-seven-year teaching career to campaign for and eventually serve in the Pennsylvania House of Representatives. There is no end to what God can do if we simply make ourselves available to Him!

Elevation Worship released a song a few years ago that simply states "I hear You call/I am available/I say yes, Lord/I am available/Here I am, Here I am/You can have it all, You can have it all". Missionary David Brainerd recorded a similar, though more detailed, prayer in his diary: "Here am I, send me; send me to the ends of the earth; send me to the rough, the savage pagans of the wilderness; send me from all that is called comfort on earth; send me even to death itself, if it be but in Thy service, and to promote Thy kingdom." "I wonder what would happen if all of us prayed Isaiah's prayer with full sincerity" reflects author and preacher J. Lee Grady. "What if you raised your hands and left all your fears, worries, excuses, stipulations, limitations and conditions on heaven's altar—and invited God to use your life in any way He wants? I invite you to take the risk. Pray a dangerous prayer, and see how God will use you." ¹


