

My dear Friend,

A few years ago, I was walking down some steps at the Westshore Pinnacle Hospital in Mechanicsburg. I was heading from the parking lot to the reception area to visit a church member who was admitted in the hospital. As I approached the final steps, I heard my phone ring and did not resist the temptation to pick the call. That was a big mistake! Before I knew it, I heard what seemed like the cracking of a twisted ankle. I had missed three steps and had landed on it. For a moment, I thought I had broken something inside!

It was God's mercy to me that I healed well after that experience and did not need any special treatment. Nevertheless, that incident reminds me of two scriptures. Galatians 5:25 says, "Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit". In Hebrews 12:1-2, we are called to run the race marked out for us with perseverance. In that scripture, we are reminded to set aside everything that hinders us, and to keep our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfector of our faith. Amidst all the pressures of life, have you been distracted and missed a few steps, maybe more, even at the risk of breaking your spiritual ankles? I can tell you that I am as prone to faltering as you are. In a recent time of worship and quiet with the Lord, I came upon this scripture: They will receive blessing from the Lord, and vindication from God, the Savior. Such is the generation of those who seek Him. Psalm 24: 5-6.

My time of reflection led me to write a prayer. I hope it speaks to your heart even as it translates mine: Lord, I am part of a culture that seeks its own face. A selfie and selfish generation. Help me as I navigate ways with road signs that spell "self-glory", "self-obsession", "self-praise", and "self-righteousness". Lord, please forgive me and save me from myself. Help me to seek your face - really seek YOU with all my heart.

May the evidence of that seeking be witnessed in the blessings you send - countless and priceless. Help me to never hoard my blessings but to share them unreservedly - so that this generation will be inspired to seek your face. Thank you for so great a calling and so rich a blessing. All the glory belongs to YOU alone. In Jesus' name, Amen.

In his book "Replenish", pastor and author Lance Witt, who had served on the team of Saddleback Church (along with Pastor Rick Warren) as an executive and preaching pastor, writes a chapter about the problem of "approval addiction" among leaders. In the course of the chapter, he mentions about a reporter interviewing a woman from the Boston Philharmonic Orchestra. "How does it feel to get a standing ovation from the crowd at the end of your performance and then wake up in the morning to a negative review in the newspaper?" She said overtime she has learned not to pay attention to the applause of the crowd or the disapproval of the critics. She was only after the approval of her conductor. After all, he was the only person who really knew how she was supposed to perform. ¹

THANK YOU TO OUR RETIRED PASTORS



HANG IN THERE! by Jamie Bream

"Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up." Galatians 6:9

Contrary to popular belief, pursuing music as a collegiate major can be highly challenging, requiring students to balance rigorous academic and practical demands such as rehearsals, ensemble performances, individual practice sessions, and regular coursework. Composer and conductor Eric Whitacre knows this from personal experience - it took him seven years to earn his bachelor's degree from the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. "By the time I graduated", he writes in the introduction to his piece Godzilla Eats Las Vegas, "I was ready to eat Las Vegas." 1 30 years later, however, Whitacre has earned a Master of Music degree from the prestigious Juilliard School in New York, has won a Grammy Award, and has conducted concerts with renowned orchestras such as the London Symphony Orchestra and the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra. He is currently also a Visiting Composer at Pembroke College, Cambridge University, and an Ambassador for the Royal College of Music in London.² All of these successes hinged on his decision to continue on his chosen path during those seven years (difficult years, undoubtedly) at UNLV. He now shares a semi-annual reminder on social media urging music students to persevere through tough times and to recall the initial passion that drew them to music before their collegiate studies began.

The above verse comes from a passage in which Paul is instructing his readers to do good to all, reminding them that they will reap the benefits of their work if they do not give up. This is contrary to our world, which often considers giving up as its first line of defense. We give up on jobs because they ask too much or because we don't like every aspect of them. We give up on friends because they take too much time or have different views on certain topics. We give up on marriages because our partner doesn't always see things eye-to-eye with us or things "just aren't working out" after the first six months. And of course, we give up on God because we think He hasn't come though for us, doesn't care about us, or simply has forgotten about us. However, this is not what we see in Paul's instruction to the Galatians, nor often the example we see in Scripture. Rather, we see Godly individuals pressing on to follow God's leading in their lives, even when it is difficult, seems impossible, or simply does not make sense. Consider stories such as those of Moses, Elijah, David, and Joseph. How might these narratives have differed if these individuals had abandoned those that they were leading? What about if they had lost faith in God?

During one semester at Liberty, my choir director (who is now the Dean of the School Of Music) shared the following message with our class:

"Do what you must to complete the task at hand. Rest if you must - sometimes we get tired. Slow down if you must - sometimes we start out too fast. Pause if you must - sometimes we need a break. Ask for help if you must - some things we cannot do on our own. Cry if you must - sometimes we need that release to keep us refreshed. But above all, press on - you must!"

Persevering through difficult times is not always going to be easy - in fact, the term "persevere" suggests quite the opposite! But if God has led you into it, you can have faith that He will see you through it. Let us "run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before Him He endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider Him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart" (Hebrews 12:1b-3).

Discern God's leading in your life. Honor and trust God through it. And hang in there!


May 10 from 10:00 AM - 12:00 PM

I am writing to thank you for the generous gift you sent to Samaraitan's Purse for U.S. Disaster Relief. We are deeply grateful for your investment in what God is doing through this ministry.

We have teams and equipment deployed in Oklahoma, Missouri, Kentucky, West Virginia, California and Hawaii, helping families who have been devastated by storms and wildfires. In the aftermath of Hurricane Helene in western North Carolina and eastern Tennessee, we are continuing to help people recover and get back on their feet and have begun rebuilding houses destroyed by the storm. We have also ordered and received 57 replacement mobile homes so far, are working onsite preparations, and look forward to dedicating the first of these very soon for families in need.
