## A People of the Resurrection

My dear Church Family,

Recently, I attempted to save a Word document with the title “Pastoral Letter.” However, while dictating the title, it amusingly recorded it as “pastoral litter.” Sometimes, technology keeps us humble—and we hope the pastor doesn’t have a case of the litterbug! If he does, God help Trinity!

How are you doing, my friend? I hope you are well and enjoying the changing days—the glory of the sunshine and the beauty of the green grass, plants, and flowers. Signs of new life and reminders of the resurrection are always inspiring. At Trinity, we have experienced a wonderful Lenten and Easter season of worship, service, and community outreach. It is heartening to hear of how so many of you have been blessed by the music ministry of the church and by God’s word. I must also add a mention of our coffee fellowship lovers!

All glory to the Lord alone for all the wonderful things we are experiencing. God has been at work on so many levels, especially in the way He is transforming lives, one at a time. Recently, I was reminded by the Lord that while we as a church can *do* many good things to serve and care for people, we are *called* to do the single most important thing: to pray for, long for, and work for the salvation of those God brings into our lives. Jesus said, “What good will it be for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul?” (Matthew 16:26, NIV). Jesus is pointing us to the most important thing in life. In the eternal scheme of things, it’s not about how good or bad we are, or how qualified or unqualified we are, but about whose we are that matters.

Because we live amidst an ‘entitlement mindset,’ people tend to choose what they like and ignore what “doesn’t matter” to them. This can apply to how we select our clothes, the way we wear them (or don’t), and the moral, social, and spiritual choices we make. We live in a buffet-mentality culture. But when it comes to the things of God, Scripture is clear. Jesus said about the Bible He used, “For truly I tell you, until heaven and earth disappear, not the smallest letter, not the least stroke of a pen, will by any means disappear from the Law until everything is accomplished” (Matthew 5:18, NIV).

What does this mean for us? For one, it means that we must wholeheartedly commit to the conviction that God’s Word should always have the last word in our lives. The culture, climate, compromise, and even the taunting of a world that has chosen to ignore its Maker do not have a place in the lives of the faithful. On the other hand, this brings us promise. God is clear: He honors those who honor Him (1 Samuel 2:30). Scripture is full of evidence that there is abundant blessing in obeying God. While disobedience distances us from God and breaks and ruins us, obedience lifts us up, brings abundance, and gives us grace through every trial. When we obey God, we are not insulated from trials; rather, we are made Christlike through them. Pastor and author Dietrich Bonhoeffer, who was killed by the Nazis, once wrote, “Only he who believes is obedient, and only he who is obedient believes.” This profound statement reminds us that true faith and obedience are inseparable; faith is proven in action, and obedience is rooted in genuine belief. In my 37 years of being a pastor, I have been privileged to witness the genuine faith and obedience of the common people of the congregation – people who might never have stood at a pulpit or on center stage, but people who in humble, simple ways live for Jesus and shine His light.

Yesterday afternoon, I received this message from John Mickle about his mother-in-law, Doris Bernardo: “Doris is home. Doing fairly well. Her first request was for a McDonald’s lunch.” Incredible for a woman in her nineties who had a fall, fractured her hip, and was written off by some medical professionals as “done with.” But by the Lord’s mercy, Doris found a new lease on life. Having gone into surgery and rehab, with the support of her family, your prayers, and the blessing of the Lord, she was back with a bounce! In fact, when I visited Doris in rehab, we laughed for most of the visit. It was absolutely refreshing to witness her positive spirit as she celebrated her new lease on life. That’s it—a new lease on life. Each of the individuals who entered the waters of baptism on Easter at Trinity and in churches across the country are witnesses to new life in Jesus. As we continue to study God’s Word in this series titled, “A People of the Resurrection,” I pray that each of us would be so dynamically impacted by the power of the gospel that we will be on fire for God, love Him with all our hearts, and share about Him without any fear or restraint. Now is the time for salvation.

A few months ago, after Doris Bernardo was hospitalized following a previous fall, I visited her in the emergency room. A doctor entered and, rather than offering encouragement, said, “So, Doris, are you ready to die? I ask because I see that your pastor has already come.” (In my years of pastoral ministry, I have not come across people who mistook pastors for undertakers!). Doris, who had just been through a traumatic experience with her fall, didn’t hesitate in her comeback. She said, “Well, doctor, I am ready to die anytime”. I later told the doctor about Doris’s faith in Jesus and how I have seen her bounce back to life by the grace of God in the years that I have known her. Some people need spiritual treatment that only folks like Doris Bernardo can give them!

As for her choice of that McDonald’s lunch, I can live with that – but I wish she had chosen Chick-fil-A!

**WHAT'S IN A NAME?**

*“Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved.” Acts 4:12 (NIV)*

In February 2026, Elevation Worship released their thirteenth live album, *So Be It*. The project's immediate commercial success was fueled by the single "I Know A Name" and its follow-up, "Jesus Be The Name." Both tracks have quickly become staples in contemporary worship, joining the ranks of classics like "What A Beautiful Name," "All Hail The Power of Jesus' Name," and "There's Just Something About That Name." This trend highlights a profound, recurring focus among songwriters: the power of a single name. The following examples illustrate how songwriters across generations have captured this reverence:

*"You have no rival / You have no equal / Now and forever, God, You reign / Yours is the Kingdom / Yours is the glory / Yours is the Name above all names"*

*"I know a name that can silence roaring waves / I know a name that can empty out a grave / I know a name / It's the only name that saves / And it's worthy of all praise"*

*"There is power in the name of Jesus / To break every chain, break every chain, break every chain"*

*"No other name that's higher / No other name that's stronger / Forever I will praise the Name / No other name can heal us / No other name can free us  
No other name so precious / Praise the Name"*

*"Jesus, Your Name is like the morning light / The One the darkness can't deny / The Resurrection and the Life, Jesus / Jesus, Your Name can save, Your Name can heal / Your Name can make the storm be still / You never fail, You never will, Jesus"*

These lyrics, while beautifully written, all present one specific question: What exactly makes the name of Jesus so significant? To understand this, we must look at how these lyrics characterize His name as much more than a simple title.

In biblical terms, a name represents the totality of a person's character and authority. This explains why God's nature is revealed through various titles—like Jehovah-Jireh and Jehovah-Shalom—and reaches a pinnacle in the burning bush with the name "Yahweh." Perhaps the most significant of these is "I AM WHO I AM," which Franklin Graham describes as God stating that He is the infinite and personal Lord to whom everything is ultimately traced. Jesus is that very same Lord who reigns over and through all. His is the only Name above all names, before whom every knee will one day bow.

Ultimately, we sing of this Name because it carries the weight of God's redemptive promise: "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved" (Romans 10:13, NIV). In every lyric and every prayer, the name of Jesus remains the bridge between our deepest need and His infinite, saving grace.

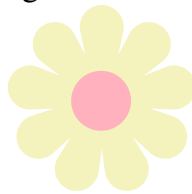


## "KIDS FOR CHRIST" AND YOUTH MINISTRIES

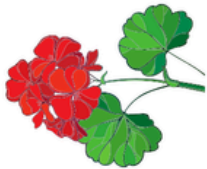
