October 6th, 2024. It is 2 a.m. in Thiruvananthapuram, India. The night is alive with the drumbeat of a torrential rain even as the State of Kerala, India, experiences a transition from the Southwest monsoon to the Northeast monsoon. To understand the force and power of an unbridled rain, you must be in one and feel its force. Torrential, non-stop rain with the determination of a charging bull.

While the night sky lights up with streaks of lightning and the tiled roof lends itself to a percussion crescendo, the mood inside the room is lightyears away. Amma (Miriam's mom) is in bed. She wakes up every now and then and looks at me. I smile and tell her "Jesus is with us." She closes her eyes and goes back to sleep. The rhythm of the rain plays a lullaby of sorts, as she slips in and out of sleep. The tumor which now protrudes out of Amma's body is a reminder of the return of cancer. At 91, mom opted for no invasive treatments. Her recent decline put Miriam's brothers who live locally on red alert and brought Miriam and me hurrying 8,000 miles across the Atlantic.

A pastor's heart is shaped by moments like these. In 35 years of serving, I have been trusted with precious bedside moments. I have held hands, prayed with and watched individuals make stunning comebacks and others make glorious touchdowns. It is clear beyond any doubt to me, that trusting in Jesus as our personal Savior, rescues us from the fear of death. Honest believers of course, will not hesitate to admit that we too can worry about how we might die. Nevertheless, there is a true fearlessness in knowing that nothing in all creation – neither death nor life can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus. Romans 8: 38-39

"Amma" (Affectionately "Mom" in the local language) as we lovingly call her, (official name : Susy Thomas) has been a star high school athlete, a very faithful wife of an Indian army officer, a dedicated, and devoted mom, a diligent student of the Bible who went through extensive theological courses tailor-made for laity in the Indian church and a mother-in-law who dotes on her son-in-law. Now the last characteristic as you well understand, made her the best!!!!!!

I believe that I do share in a sort of ‘enviable record’ of having known Miriam’s parents for 38 years - all of which have been wonderfully pleasant and sweet. When I started visiting and staying with my in-laws during vacation times after Miriam and I got married in 1990, they would take care of me in exceptionally kind and gracious ways. Amma organized every meal to be special. We had the most precious family devotions and singing times together – every morning at 5.30 am and then in the evening before supper. My father-in-law believed in my preaching so much that during our first vacation with them, he had arranged for me to speak at 7 meetings in one week. I would with mischief in my eyes, tell Miriam that I had a strange suspicion that they loved me a bit more than her!

As I sit beside Amma tonight, my mind goes back to so many memories. Memories. That’s the word I’m looking for. It will soon be Thanksgiving time in the US. It will be a time for memories.

Memories are a gift, but can also be a burden. Most importantly, memories can be a choice. It has been attributed to Charles H. Spurgeon to have noted that, “we are too prone to engrave our trials in marble and write our blessings in sand.”

Joseph, in the book of Exodus, could have exhausted his emotional strength by dwelling upon all his negative experiences. Betrayed and sold away to foreigners by his own brothers, plucked away from his home as a teenager, wrongly and falsely accused by his master’s wife, thrown into prison for no fault of his, and forgotten in prison for two years because a man who made a promise, forgot. Joseph made a choice. He decided not to live in the valley of complaints but to climb the mountain of gratitude.

When the hymn writer Johnson Oatman, Jr (1897) penned these words, “Count your blessings, name them one by one. And it will surprise you what the Lord has done”, he was expressing the same sentiment uttered by the Psalmist in Psalm 40:5 :

Many, Lord my God,
are the wonders you have done,
the things you planned for us.
None can compare with you;
were I to speak and tell of your deeds,
they would be too many to declare.

As I hold Amma’s hand and keep watch, I wish I could reverse the effects of aging upon our bodies. I wish I could go back 20 years, maybe 30. I wish we were seated as a family on the beach like we used to years ago. I wish we were back in God’s house – enjoying his presence with his people on a Sunday morning. I wish we could all sit around the table and share in a delightful home-cooked dinner as a family.

I wish. Ouch, that hurts. Unfortunately, wishing doesn’t bring back the good times. In fact, it doesn’t bring consolation, but trusting in the Lord does. Memories by themselves are like road signs. They help us travel and celebrate the journey.

Amma is fast asleep now. As time moves on, I feel a wave of sleep come over me. I don’t need to count sheep. I choose to count my blessings. I better get out of here quickly, lest my snoring wakes her up!

TO LOOK AHEAD... AND LOOKING BEHIND by Jamie Bream

“One thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and reaching forward to what is ahead, I pursue as my goal the prize promised by God’s heavenly call in Christ Jesus.”
Philippians 3:13b-14 (HCSB)

The 1937 high fantasy novel *The Hobbit* follows comfort-loving hobbit Bilbo Baggins as he joins a group of dwarves, led by Thorin Oakenshield and the wizard Gandalf, on a perilous quest to reclaim their long-lost home and treasure from the dragon Smaug. Soon after setting out, Gandalf disappears and the group is captured by a band of trolls intent on eating them. Bilbo, however, is able to stall the trolls long enough for Gandalf to reappear, who turns them to stone. When questioned by Thorin on where he went, Gandalf answers, “To look ahead”. And when Thorin asks what brought him back, Gandalf replies simply, “Looking behind.” As the quest continues on, the reader often sees Bilbo “looking behind” to the food, friends, and routines of home, especially as the dangers and uncertainties of the journey increase. However, as he “looks ahead” to the completion of the quest, he finds himself growing in courage and in determination, which allows him to fulfill his role as the ever-important “burglar” in more ways than one. At the end of the journey (spoiler alert!), he returns home, possessing both physical and emotional rewards as a result of pursuing his goal to its end, as well as a story to tell for years to come.

Just like Bilbo, our own journeys are characterized by both reflection on the past and anticipation for the future. As we navigate life’s twists and turns, however, we must be sure to balance our attention on the past with our focus on the future, or we risk never advancing or even backsliding because of settling for what is or was instead of anticipating and reaching for what could be. In the spiritual context, Paul goes so far as to say he is “[f]orgetting what is behind and reaching forward to what is ahead” as he pursues as his goal the prize Jesus has prepared for him (Phil. 3:13). Paul no longer desires the things of his old life or the comfortable things of the world - his only goal is to “know [Jesus] and the power of His resurrection and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death, assuming that [he (Paul)] will somehow reach the resurrection from among the dead” (Phil. 3:10-11). Now that’s a goal worth striving for, even if it means forgetting everything else!

If Bilbo had turned back from his ultimate goal, he would have lost fourteen potential friends, missed the adventure of a lifetime, and never had the opportunity to acquire the One Ring (which would later become the catalyst for the events of *The Lord Of The Rings*). If we turn back from our ultimate goal - the same goal Paul strived for - we risk losing so much more.

THOUGHTS TO CONSIDER:

- Read Luke 9:57-62. How does this passage relate to Paul’s goal? Do you believe Paul was influenced by Jesus’ words in these verses?
- What is holding you back from pursuing the goal(s) set before you?

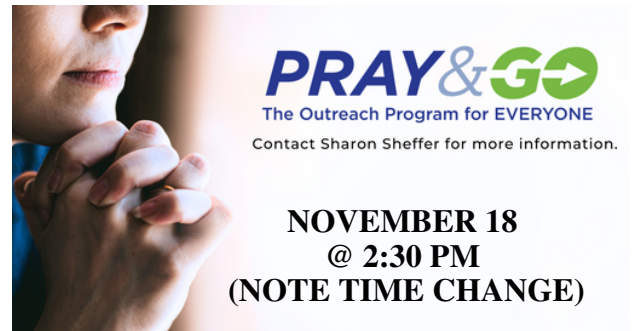
