

Happy Thanksgiving, dear friend!

Before I wrote this letter, I paused to pray for you. My prayer was simple. It was a prayer for true contentment. I believe the prayer was inspired by the times of Bible reading and devotions that I experienced in two different settings today. First during our family prayer time earlier this morning and later, at a breakfast fellowship with "the three sinners". Well, it was a title they gave themselves and I did not have the power to contest it, so we will for the future be called "The three sinners plus one fellowship". God bless those three dear friends, Tom Bowman, Irv Kiehl, and Jed Beshore. As we sat and read the Bible passage from Ecclesiastes 5:13-20, we focused on the section in verses 19 and 20: "Moreover, when God gives someone wealth and possessions, and the ability to enjoy them, to accept their lot and be happy in their toil—this is a gift of God. They seldom reflect on the days of their life, because God keeps them occupied with gladness of heart."

As we reflected upon those rich words of promise, "God keeps them occupied with gladness of heart," we each one shared from our lives. It was a precious time with real-life insights from each one at the table. What Tom said lingers: "I don't care about money. It is there for us to use. All through my life, I did not focus on it." On the other hand, Tom focused on something simple: tomato ketchup. Yes, that's right. He loves tomato ketchup. Companies like Heinz, Hunt's, and Del Monte make it to the big business league because of tomato ketchup-loyalists like Tom. He doesn't eat without tomato ketchup. He just can't! As he reflected about the past, he told us about a restaurant out of the area that he used to visit regularly many years ago. One day, a waitress did the unthinkable: she decided that Tom Bowman was having too much ketchup and curtly removed the ketchup from his table. That waitress knew little or nothing about customer relationship management. That was the last they saw of Tom at the restaurant. Bottom line: Life is much more than just money, but make no mistake about it - ketchup counts!

As a pastor, I am privileged to learn at the table of the experienced. There was a lot more we talked about – all the good stuff. We parted with gratitude. Our waitress got a good tip. You guessed it, she had not dared to remove that ketchup bottle! Was I not blessed to be in fellowship with those three wonderful men? God had indeed kept us occupied with gladness of heart on a crisp fall morning.

Speaking of fellowship, we experienced something heartwarming in our small group on Tuesday October 7th . Just minutes into our readings from the book of James, one of our group members shared deep things from the heart. That opened the door for others in the group to feel comfortable to share from their lives as well. It ended up being one of the most authentic, refreshing, and hopeful times of Bible study and prayer. I walked away that night rejoicing in the fact that God was writing new life-stories at Trinity. It was a great way to end the 59th year of my life on the planet. In the company of people just like me. God had indeed kept us occupied with gladness of heart on a nice fall evening.

Yesterday was my 60th birthday. My parents were the first ones to call and wish me a happy birthday. They told me how blessed they felt to be able to look back sixty years in time and see the faithfulness of God. I feel equally blessed to have them in my life. Calling them every day on the telephone is a privilege that I seldom miss. It was a good day yesterday. I began the morning by taking Jeff Brinton out for breakfast. Jeff and I share the same birthday. Having been through strokes in 2019, Jeff has with faith and determination learned how to navigate through the challenges. One of the things that brings him great joy is the cards that he writes to people. As we sat at a Chick-fil-A, Jeff told me, "I can't believe people don't believe in God. How can you not believe in Him, seeing everything He does?" I was blessed by Jeff's testimony. Once again, God had kept us occupied with gladness of heart.

Later in the day, the staff at the office celebrated the day with a wonderful home cooked lunch that they put together. It was a sweet time. I thank the Lord for such a terrific team. At about 3 PM, I went and sat on the steps of the church on Bridge Street. I went there to pray for the town that I love and serve. I called upon the Lord who alone can touch lives and change them forever. I prayed for new hope, new beginnings, and new life. I also spent some time meeting people on the street and giving them invitations to the Millers Southern Gospel concert at Trinity. I experienced a diversity of responses. Here are some of them. Two people said, "No thank you." One woman said, "Oh! That's nice! I'll be happy to put this up on my church's bulletin board." Another lady said, "You can see I'm a Southern girl. I love Southern gospel music. I'll be there!" I was hoping I could share the gospel with someone yesterday, but I did not get an opportunity to. Later in the evening, Miriam and I went out for dinner.

As I came to the end of my 60th birthday, I said to myself, "I'm still recovering at the thought that I am here!" I could not have made it so far without the mercy and grace of God.

Later in the night, as we paused for family prayer, I went back to the words that I had read in the morning from Ephesians 4:1: "As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love...".

I could not have had a better reminder from the Lord. It was a beautiful day. What a blessing to know that the Lord kept me occupied with gladness of heart.

Let me close with the words I posted to my Facebook friends yesterday. Dear Friends, I cannot thank you enough for the outpouring of your love, prayers and gracious birthday greetings. I thank God for you.

## GRANDPARENTS IN PRAYER - THE TRINITY PRAYER BUDDY PROGRAM

The Prayer Buddy program is an outreach of the Grandparents in Prayer group at Trinity Church of New Cumberland. Every member of Grandparents in Prayer has a youth prayer buddy from the church whom they support in prayer. This is in addition to praying for one another's grandchildren and attempting to model a Christian life for the next generation.

The youth Prayer Buddy is part of the congregation attending either the Sunday morning service or the Wednesday evening youth group. The youth Prayer Buddy is in grade 6 through 12. We continue to pray and attempt to stay in contact with those who have graduated.

In addition to supporting our Prayer Buddies in prayer, the grandparents send encouraging cards and remember them on their birthday and special holidays, often with a small gift.

Both the adult and the youth Prayer Buddy have a card with the other's picture, address, and birthdate. The youth are also encouraged to reciprocate by praying for their adult Prayer Buddy and by sending them an occasional note or card. Prayer requests may be shared in written notes.

Personal contacts are encouraged only in group situations, such as at church or during Sunday morning Coffee Fellowship. If a youth has a special event, such as a school concert or game, and the Prayer Buddy is contacted, they are often happy to attend. One party a year is held at the church when the adult and youth Prayer Buddies have more time to interact in a group situation. We follow the Safe Sanctuary policy and do not have one on one contacts with our Prayer Buddy.

May God bless the youth and adult Prayer Buddies as they seek to know God better and commit their lives to Him.

I look forward to getting to know this congregation over the coming weeks and months, but I thought I would take this opportunity to introduce myself and tell you a little bit about me. My home is Halifax, Nova Scotia, on the east coast of Canada, and I grew up there in a wonderful Christian home where my father was a Baptist pastor and my mother shared in ministry as pianist, organist, and choir director. I came to the United States for graduate school and met a beautiful girl from Pennsylvania who eventually became my wife. Joy and I have two children Lydia (13) and Elliott (10) - who currently attend Covenant Christian Academy, and Joy is a professor at Messiah University where she oversees the choral program and teaches voice and conducting. Lydia is a passionate and voracious reader who loves playing the cello and dancing, among other things. Elliott loves to play any sport, but his favorite is baseball.
