

Drawn to Christ and seeking God's abundance, let us confess our sin.


Silence is kept for reflection.





Through the Backpack Challenge, we will purchase, sort, and deliver backpacks and school supplies to the students at Dobie Pre-K. Principal Hart says, "The relief that comes over parents when we tell them we provide the supplies is massive because it's one less thing for them to worry about when they often have other children."

Dobie Pre-K serves preschoolers with financial challenges and/or developmental or physical disabilities. Dobie teachers often provide important school supplies from their own salaries. This year will be the last year Dobie serves as a pre-K school before it is repurposed and the pre-k services are fully assimilated into RISD elementary schools. KOG is continuing to support the students and staff at Dobie Pre-K through the 2024-2025 school year. The *Backpack Challenge* is just one of the many ways King of Glory supports the Dobie Pre-K teachers, students, and families. 
When She Loved Me






You are invited to share the bread and wine now as you hear the Pastor say:
