
MARY MARTHA BIBLE CLASS

The Wartburg Choir celebrates the unaccompanied performance style on their annual tours, and maintains the importance of tradition by intentionally performing historical and modern masterworks, all while paving the way for the future of choral music through the performance of new compositions and uplifting emerging composers. The Wartburg Choir has appeared in many prestigious concert halls throughout the United States. The choir performed with opera star Simon Estes at Orchestra Hall, Minneapolis; Kennedy Center, Washington, D.C.; Lincoln Center, New York; and Orchestra Hall at Symphony Center in Chicago. Estes and the choir also performed two concerts with the Czech National Symphony Orchestra in Prague. The Wartburg Choir has performed solo concerts at Carnegie Hall on two different occasions.







LUTHERAN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL ASSOCIATION DINNER AUCTION



NEW CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT PETITION SEEKS TO ENSHRINE ABORTION IN THE MISSOURI CONSTITUTION

Like in Ohio last year, advocates for killing children in the womb are seeking to make abortion a constitutional right in Missouri. The petition called "Relating to Reproductive Health Care, version 10" and "The Right to Reproductive Freedom" not only seeks to remove Missouri's current abortion laws, but that the government must fund programs which promote and perform abortions. It also seeks prevent abortion providers from beina prosecuted in any way related to their abortive work.

The best way to fight this now is the three-fold initial phase of:

- first, raising awareness that "reproductive health" here means "abortion,"
- second, to refuse to sign the petition so it does not get on the ballot for a vote at all (and encourage others to refuse) and,
- third, to look up your state representatives and start already to put into their minds this is a bad idea.

Please pray for our state as abortion advocates seek to enshrine the murder of children, (calling it murder is the only biblical stance on the subject).

LIFE MINISTRY - RESPECT



Kansas City Chiefs fans saw their victory celebration turn into a mass shooting with over twenty-two people shot, one killed and several suffering serious injuries. In a time when people fail to stand for the Star-Spangled Banner, tear down statues of great American heroes and treat people of accomplishment with open contempt, such behavior is merely shrugged off as just another headline. Unfortunately, it's a symptom of a major problem in our society. We no longer fear God and we don't respect each other.

The commandments begin by telling us to honor God and honor our parents. Our society is built upon stable families whose members treat one another with respect and kindness. Honoring one another should extend to the generations that preceded us as well as to the people we encounter every day.

But this respect is being undermined by the garbage our culture embraces. Violence is an entertainment staple. Smart-mouthed kids are portrayed as being funny and cute. Fathers are demeaned as clueless adolescents. Women are reduced to objects for sexual gratification. Alternative lifestyles and gender dysphoria are glamorized. Such "entertainment" has desensitized many people into acceptance of disrespectful and immoral behavior. If we feed our minds with garbage, it eventually results in behavioral sewage. As they say: "garbage in, garbage out."

Children are encouraged to hide their thoughts and feelings from their parents, especially anything that conflicts with Christian values. The elderly are often regarded as past their prime and less valuable. The unborn are regarded as "a woman's choice" to be discarded at will. Such values destroy a society because people without respect have no self-control. The result is chaos, and in a chaotic society, people can either return to God or they can turn to a tyrannical form of government to impose order.

Ask yourself. Does my life honor God? Do I consistently show respect to myself and others? What messages have I internalized through the music I listen to and the programs I watch? What occupies my thoughts? We all face this struggle every day as we decide how we spend our time, how we treat others and how we think. 


