31st Annual Presentation of the Living Last Supper



In 1494, Leonardo da Vinci was commissioned to decorate the wall of the Church of Santa Maria Della Grazie in Milan, Italy. He chose the "Last Supper" as his topic portraying the moment just after our Lord said, "One of you will betray me." At that moment, the twelve apostles became men of twelve different moods and personalities.

On Maundy Thursday, "The Living Last Supper" will once again be presented here at Peace. The pose from da Vinci's painting will be recreated and one by one each disciple "comes to life" to share his thoughts and to wonder, "Is it I?" The Chancel Choir adds to the drama with various musical selections and the service culminates with the celebration of Holy Communion.

Come for an evening with the disciples as we begin the sacred three-day period recounting Jesus' last days from the Upper Room to the borrowed tomb. Invite your family and friends for this unique opportunity to learn about our Savior and His disciples.

CONGRATS TO OUR NEWEST EAGLE SCOUTS



The Eagle Scout Award is the highest achievement in the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) program, requiring Scouts to demonstrate leadership, service, and completion of a significant community project after earning 21 merit badges. To earn the Eagle Scout award, a Scout must:

- Earn at least 21 merit badges.
- Demonstrate Scout Spirit, service, and leadership.
- Complete a challenging service project that they plan, organize, lead, and manage.

The Eagle Scout rank represents years of dedicated effort and a long process, starting when the young man became a Boy Scout.

The Eagle Scout award is a recognition by the National Court of Honor, presented through the local council and a local court of honor.

Kyle Rainey collaborated with Christina Stackle on identifying a service project that could be utilized by the church. The need identified was making crosses that would be placed in front of church during October to represent the number of fetuses aborted during the year. Kyle led the construction of 37 blue and 38 pink crosses. The new crosses were constructed with better material for easier ground installation. The new crosses were first used in October 2024. On, June 27, 2024, Kyle participated in and passed his Eagle Board of Review to achieve the rank of Eagle Scout.

For his Eagle Project, Jonah Glessner led a team to create section markers in the historic Concordia Cemetery. He would like to thank the congregation of Peace Lutheran for their support in his journey to receiving his Eagle Scout. Jonah attended five summer camps, National Youth Leadership Training, and Philmont High Adventure Camp.

We congratulate Kyle and Jonah on receiving their Eagle Scout Awards.








THE PEACE GROUNDS CREW IS FORMING!





We give thanks to God for Sue's ministry at Peace, and look forward to celebrating her retirement. We hope you will join us!




PEACE EARLY CHILDHOOD

APRIL 2025 - I am with you always. Matthew 28:20




This is such a wonderful time of year, as we see our preschoolers' abilities continue to bloom and grow! SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS

Greetings to our Sunday School parents and fellow parishioners at Peace.

The season of Lent is upon us, and it is a perfect opportunity to reflect on the sacrifice that our Redeemer has made for us sinners. "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16). The death of Christ on the cross for



our sins and His subsequent Resurrection on Easter Day is often scoffed at by the unbelieving world. "For the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God" (1 Corinthians 1:18). It is never too late for anyone to come to repentance while still having breath in their bodies. Just read about a persecutor of the early Christian church named Saul and his miraculous conversion. His name was later changed to Paul and his conversion story can be found in Acts 9:1-31.

This month, our Parents and Me class (0-3-year-old students) will continue learning about God and His ways. Preschool and Kindergarten students will begin the month with a look at the Triumphal Entry of Jesus into Jerusalem; otherwise referred to as Palm Sunday. They will also learn about the crucifixion and Resurrection of our Savior, which corresponds with the events of Holy Week. The First and Second grade students will continue in the pages of the Old Testament studying about Moses, which will cover the bronze serpent, the 12 spies in Canaan, and the ultimate entry into the Promised Land. The Third and Fourth grade students will continue their study on how God works through prophets and kings. They will begin the month with Hezekiah and end with Jeremiah. The Fifth-grade students will continue their study of the life of Martin Luther and his role in the Reformation of the church.

On April 13, Palm Sunday, our Sunday School students and their parents/guardians will be meeting in the lower-level Sunday School area to participate in fun and games. In addition, there will be a parade around the interior of the church building wherein the children will shout Hosanna and be given palms to wave, just like the people did upon Christ's entry into Jerusalem. Plan on joining your children at the lower level at 9:15AM instead of dropping them off in their classrooms.

Please encourage your children to hide God's Word in their hearts through the memorization of scripture. "And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him" (Colossians 3:17).

God's continued blessing on you and your loved ones.





LIFE MINISTRY - IF I WERE THE DEVIL



In 1965, the legendary radio personality Paul Harvey, aired a classic piece called "If I Were the Devil." His words warned how America's culture would be gradually eroded as it strayed from basic moral standards. In 2025, ChatGPT was asked: "If I were the devil, how would I make women despise motherhood?" Here was the answer given by ChatGPT.

Promote the Idea that motherhood is a trap. Convince women that having children will ruin their dreams, limit their potential, and chain them to a life of servitude. Frame it as a loss of identity rather than a transformation.

Glorify career over family. Elevate professional success as the only true path to fulfillment while portraying motherhood as menial and unimportant. Make women believe that their worth is measured only by their productivity in the workforce, not by the love and guidance they give to their children.

Make children seem like a burden. Emphasize the hardships of motherhood—sleepless nights, financial strain, loss of freedom—while downplaying the joys, rewards, and purpose that come with raising a family.

Encourage self-centeredness. Promote a culture of hyper-individualism where personal pleasure, convenience, and self-fulfillment take priority over sacrifice, duty, and love.

Redefine feminism. Shift the feminist movement from advocating for equal rights to rejecting traditional femininity and motherhood. Convince women that true empowerment means rejecting their natural ability to nurture life.

Normalize childlessness. Push the idea that having children is just one of many equally valid lifestyle choices, and then go further—frame it as an outdated, unnecessary, or even irresponsible choice in light of environmental and economic concerns.

Destigmatize abortion while promoting contraception as the default. Make abortion seem like an easy, normal solution to an "unwanted" pregnancy, and encourage widespread contraception use in ways that separate sex from its natural consequences.

Undermine family structure. Promote unstable relationships, divorce, and casual sex while discouraging marriage and commitment. If families break down, women are less likely to see motherhood as part of a meaningful, stable life.

Mock traditional motherhood. Portray stay-at-home moms as weak, unambitious, or oppressed. Fill media with images of unhappy mothers and "cool," child-free women who are living their best lives.

Exploit the power of media and entertainment. Use movies, TV shows, and social media to glorify independence, partying, and career-driven lifestyles while making motherhood seem outdated or exhausting.

Looks like the devil has been busy. Many of the above values were promoted by radical feminists from the late sixties. A few generations later, we're seeing the consequences. Nearly forty percent of the younger generation in the United States is embracing childlessness. Most nations of the world are experiencing drastic drops in birthrates. Some countries are trying to encourage couples to have more children through economic incentives, but to no avail. It's time to stop listening to the father of lies and return to the Word of God. Our society depends on it.






