LET'S TALK ABOUT SEX!

Middle School Parents and students,

You are invited to join our DCE, Christina Stackle, and Pastor Brown for a four-week class about sex and our sexuality. The class will be centered on how we as God's children can live sexually pure and decent lives. Each class will focus on a different aspect of sex and our sexuality. Session one is called, "God and our Sexuality (Adopted in Christ)." Session two is called, "Redeeming Puberty (Redeemed in Christ)." Session three is called, "Sanctifying our Sexuality (Sanctified in Christ)." Session four is called, "Living of Sexual Integrity."

We understand that having conversations about sex and our sexuality can often be difficult and uncomfortable, but if we are to live as Christians in all areas of our lives then it's important that we have those harder conversations too. Especially as we live in a culture that is constantly bombarding our children with messages about sex and their sexuality. So, Let's Talk About Sex, as God intended it to be in our lives.

The class dates are as follows: January 5, 12, 19, and 26 (all four Sundays in January). If you are a Middle School student, your class will meet in your usual Sunday School classroom from 9:15-10:15AM. SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS

The Season of Advent is upon us, and it is time to reflect on the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ. We are doing just that in our Sunday School classes.

This month, our students will hear about the birth of John [the Baptist], and his role as a prophet, ordained by God, to prepare the people for the coming of the Savior. They will then hear the story of the virgin Mary who received God's message that she would conceive and give birth to the Savior of the world, Jesus Christ. This news was so wonderful that when Mary later told her cousin Elizabeth, who was pregnant with John [the Baptist] at the time, the baby leapt with joy in Elizabeth's womb. Our students ultimately see the birth of Jesus in scripture and end the month with the visit of the Magi, who brought to Jesus gifts of Gold, Frankincense, and Myrrh.

The Book of Isaiah 7:14 says, "Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son and shall call His name Immanuel." The name Immanuel means, "God with us." The entirety of Holy Scripture points to Christ and His ultimate death [for the sins of mankind] and Resurrection. After Adam and Eve sinned, Almighty God revealed in His Word what is commonly referred to as the First Gospel, i.e. protoevangelium. Speaking to the serpent God said, "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel." Genesis 3:15. Please encourage your children to hide God's Word in their hearts through the memorization of scripture.

The students have already begun singing practice for the 2024 Sunday School Christmas Service, which will take place on Wednesday, December 18 at 6:30PM. Just a reminder that the official Sunday School Christmas Service practice/ rehearsal is on Saturday, December 14, at 8:00AM. May Almighty God give you and your loved ones a blessed Christmas and New Year.







LIFE MINISTRY - ALL SAINTS DAY



Friday, November 1, All Saints Day, was a sunny, beautiful fall day: perfect weather to stand in line for early voting in the 2024 election. The line at Grant's View library was long, with wait times estimated at one to two hours, but people accepted the inconvenience without grumbling or rudeness: those looking for parking places not so much.

It was also one final opportunity to present voters with the actual language of Amendment 3 if it were written into the Missouri constitution. Believe me, as a dyed-in-the-wool introvert, the last thing I wanted to do was face the line of voters and offer them my simple flyer with the actual wording. The questionable parts were circled with comments in the margins. But I knew I had to do my

I never mentioned the trigger word "abortion" as I asked people if they wanted the actual wording of this amendment. Actually, this amendment included so much more than abortion that many will be shocked at what flows out of it. Many showed me their sample ballots and said they had it already. No, they had the <u>ballot language</u>, not the <u>actual amendment</u>, but most did not want to take the time to read it for themselves even though they had at least another hour standing in line. A few said they supported abortion, as if that was the only issue in this amendment. Most already had their minds made up. After all the advertising, that was no surprise. Let's face it, people were tired of all the election hoopla, they wanted to be done with all of it, including me.

part in protecting the unborn, children and parental rights, so I gritted my teeth and moved on.

One man asked me if I thought I was going to change anyone's mind. Good question, but God doesn't call us to be successful, just faithful, so it didn't really matter. The hardest part was seeing women's faces that had sheer hatred when I approached them. Abortion must really be an integral part of their identity. How sad. What kept me going was meeting a few friendly faces of saints, Christian friends of mine who brought light to me when I needed it. Christians, saints, really are light in the face of darkness and I experienced that while working the line.

All Saints Day should inspire us to keep being a light in a very broken, hurting world. The line of people I met represented a cross-section of our culture. Many were ill-informed about the issue on which they were voting, but they assumed they were right. In the same way, many think that if they are "good people" or "spiritual" that they have no need of Jesus. They're wrong. As Christians, we may feel uncomfortable in presenting God's truth to them, but they still need to hear it through our words and actions. You are a saint. Keep shining your light.
