#### PEACE AT 80: A CONGREGATION CHANGING THE WORLD



"A Seminary student, a sexton, and a council member walked into a bar" sounds like the start of a joke, but this is, essentially, the start of our congregation. When second-year Seminary student Harold Johnson had too much time on his hands, he asked the Missouri District if there was a nearby place where evangelism could be done. They said that South St. Louis County was beginning to grow and it might be a good place to try.

He began along Lindbergh but wasn't finding any leads. One day, he headed up Lemay Ferry Rd. to return to the Seminary and saw the light on in the office at St. Trinity Cemetery. He talked to Mr. Bill Meyer, the sexton there, who was a member of Gethsemane. He, in turn,

connected Mr. Johnson with Mr. Charles Zalaudek, a leader at Gethsemane. So the Seminary student, the sexton, and the council member met (maybe at a bar) and agreed that there was real potential for a new church to be planted to the south of Gethsemane.

They began to find Lutherans not along Lindbergh, but along Telegraph in the new streets and subdivisions going up there. After months of building up area interest, they began to meet to figure out the logistics. A meeting with all interested families became a stalemate on where to plant a church. So, they decided to plant two instead: one congregation up in the Mehlville area and another one down in the Oakville area. On the night of October 19, 1945, two church plants were born. The northern one became Peace and the southern one became Faith.

- By December 2, 1945, services were held in the basement of the Zalaudek home led by Mr. Johnson. After he graduated, Peace called Harold Johnson out of the Seminary to be her first pastor
- On April 6, 1947, on Easter Sunday, we celebrated our first service in our Telegraph church building, built from 180 tons of stone donated by the Bussen Quarry. God blessed Peace to become a growing community such that after only a decade, we had to find new land for a larger campus
- In the meantime, we engaged with our local congregations to form Green Park Lutheran School, which opened on September 5, 1961
- The sanctuary (now Sanctuary Hall) was dedicated on February 9, 1964
- Coming full circle (in one sense), we were led by conversation with St. Trinity congregation and its cemetery board to accept oversight of St. Trinity Cemetery in the summer of 2010
- Our current sanctuary was dedicated on August 24, 2014

Those are highlights of the material history of our congregation. But let's look deeper, at the part of our past which really matters: The people of our congregation and the work of God among us over 80 years. Across 13 pastors, 3 DCEs, and at least three Directors of Music, we can note some highlights:

- The first year of Peace community averaged about 45 persons each Sunday at church
- The first recorded Baptism took place November 10, 1945, for Earl Paul Mugele
- The first recorded Marriage was between Vernon and Marianne Renwick on February 25, 1948
- Our first officially recorded funeral was on May 5, 1950, for Conrad Merk
- We have performed around 2,400 Baptisms, around 1,300 funerals, over 870 marriages, brought thousands into communicant fellowship with the Body of Christ, and supported thousands of children through our Early Childhood Program, Green Park, and Lutheran South
- Over 31 years, we are entering our 29th year of the Boar's Head production which brings in over a thousand people from within driving distance to Peace, and a few beyond that
- We have broadcast on KFUO for over a quarter-century, weekly for over a decade, reaching persons with the Gospel literally around the world
- We have been in Alaska for generations of their people and touched persons in Mexico, Peru, and Hong Kong
- We have been longtime partners with Feed My People, helping hundreds of families in need, and support life ministries including work on behalf of single mothers and the work to end sex and human trafficking
- We have helped to train dozens of Seminary students, sent our youth on to become Lutheran teachers, ministry leaders, and, as we have seen and heard from them over the past year, we have sent men to become pastors.
- We have supported men from foreign nations getting their advanced degrees to become Seminary professors in their respective nations and supported missionaries who have gone over to help, such as our brother now returned stateside, Dr. Cundiff, and our congregational son Pastor Nathaniel Jensen in Germany. We helped one student, Andrew Bartelt, get his requisite pastoral ministry under his belt so he could go on to finish his doctorate and teach Hebrew to two generations of pastoral students (including Pastor Furgeson)

As the people of God whom He has gathered in Lemay, in our humble corner of South County, we have been God's instruments for His glorious purpose to make for Himself a people. Through your faithfulness, your financial support, your prayers and, most of all, your commitment to community around Word and Sacrament, around Scripture and the Confessions, God has worked through you to bring the world to Himself. As we close out our 80th year observance, may God bless us to continue to love, trust, and heed Him. May we reflect Him and His salvation into our community and world for decades and generations yet to come. Thank you, Peace, for your faithfulness.

#### WHY STEPHEN MINISTRY?



As the weather gets colder and days get shorter, many people find that they feel more isolated and lonely, and strugale with low mood. Although holiday festivities are a joyful time for many, they can also be a painful reminder of arief for those who have recently lost loved ones or those who are facing family conflicts and division. We are bringing Stephen Ministry to Peace so that we, as a congregation, can "Bear one another's burdens,

and so fulfill the law of Christ" (Galatians 6:2). Stephen Ministers are members of our congregation who receive quality training to walk alongside those who are undergoing particular burdens, like grief, loss of a job, divorce, loneliness, illness, or other life difficulties.

Stephen Ministry is a ministry that involves the whole congregation. Through Stephen Minister training, members learn to carry each other's burdens. Stephen Leaders are trained members of the congregation who are equipped to lead and guide this ministry. And of course, care receivers are members of our community as well.

#### LIFE MINISTRY- CHRISTMAS CHARACTER



Merry Christmas! Who knew that such a traditional greeting could be a source of offense to so many in our secular society? But as Christian values have declined, they've been replaced by secular ones that are directly opposite. The Christmas story presents a picture of these opposing values, ones that are at the heart of the pro-life movement.

The liturgical church year begins quietly with the season of Advent, which starts at the end of November and culminates four weeks later with the celebration of Christ's birth. It's a time of quiet reflection on the lessons of love, trust and humility displayed in the Christmas message. What a stark contrast with our secular culture's designation of June as "Pride Month" with its cheap celebration of sexual immorality of all types and its denigration of traditional Judeo-Christian values.

Joseph and Mary display the qualities of humility and trust throughout the entire account. Mary's story of conceiving a child as a virgin certainly raised a few eyebrows and Joseph was treated with scorn as well. They faced homelessness and life on the run once Herod learned of the birth of this child. Their humility and trust in God preserved them and their precious child. The wise men also displayed humility and trust in their willingness to be led by God to a poor couple with a baby. What? No wealthy family or title? Yet they worshipped this child with precious gifts.

Herod shows the other side of the coin. His pride as king and his desire to control anything that could threaten his position resulted in the deaths of innocent children and the broken hearts of their parents. It's no different today. As people reject God, they naturally seek to control their lives outside of His commandments. Unplanned pregnancies can be aborted. People desiring "death with dignity" can choose euthanasia. Life is full of challenges and hard decisions. Having the humility to trust God in these circumstances isn't easy, even for Christians. Our secular society is legalizing and celebrating decisions and lifestyles contrary to God's word.

Sadly, our culture has reduced Christmas to a time of gifts and good times without any time for reflection on the miracle of God coming to earth as a baby. The ordinary people who were in the original Christmas are often reduced to characters in a play. We seldom take time to appreciate their inner qualities: humility, trust, faithfulness, perseverance and generosity. It's easy to overlook how important their inner character shaped the Christmas story.

Our culture glorifies the superficial: looks, wealth, power and fame, but our society thrives only to the degree that we cultivate character. We overlook how God uses ordinary people dealing with everyday problems as a means of pointing others to Him. May we develop the qualities of humility, trust, faithfulness, perseverance and generosity displayed in the Christmas story. May God use us as He did the people in the Christmas story, to reach His world.

#### **SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS**



ROOTED IN CHRIST The Season of Advent is upon us and this is a wonderful time to reflect on the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ. We are doing just that in our Sunday School classes. This month, our students will hear about the birth of John the Baptist and his role as a prophet, ordained by God, to prepare the people for the coming of the Savior. They will then hear the story of the virgin Mary who received God's message that she would conceive and give birth to the Savior of the world, Jesus Christ. This news was so wonderful that when Mary later told her cousin Elizabeth, who was pregnant with John [the Baptist] at the time, the baby leapt with joy in Elizabeth's womb. Our students ultimately see the birth of Jesus in scripture and end the month with the visit of

the Magi, who brought to Jesus gifts of Gold, Frankincense, and Myrrh.

The Book of Isaiah 7:14 states, "Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son and shall call His name Immanuel." The name Immanuel means, "God with us." The entirety of Holy Scripture points to Christ and His ultimate death [for the sins of mankind] and Resurrection. After Adam and Eve sinned, Almighty God revealed in His Word what is commonly referred to as the First Gospel, i.e. the protoevangelium. Speaking to the serpent God said, "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel." (Genesis 3:15). Please encourage your children to hide God's Word in their hearts through the memorization of scripture.

"For unto you is born this day in the City of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom He is pleased!" (Luke 2:11-14).

The students have been practicing their songs for the 2025 Sunday School Christmas Service, which will take place on Wednesday, December 17, at 6:30PM. 


