

#### St.Trinity Cemetery - Grave & Niche Decorations

A common tradition when visiting a grave is to bring something...a balloon, pinwheel, or flowers are commonly seen in many cemeteries. At St. Trinity Cemetery, there are Rules & Regulations which govern how flowers and other decorations are managed. These can be seen at the website below, and are intended to keep the cemetery looking uncluttered and beautiful. Here are the highlights of section IV, pertaining to flowers, wreaths and decorations:

- Only one flower wreath or bouquet per grave or niche is permitted.
- Containers, potted plants, baskets, balloons and other such items are not allowed.
- Funeral flowers are removed 5-7 days after an interment.
- All decorations are removed three times per year, during the weeks of February 1, May 1, and September 1, contingent on staff workload and weather conditions.

It also bears mentioning that during high winds and other weather events, decorations can "take flight" and/or be damaged such that cemetery staff is unable to replace them in their original location. 

#### SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS

Greetings again to our Sunday School parents and fellow parishioners at Peace.

January was a bit snowy and icy to say the least. In fact, as our Sunday School parents know, we had to cancel classes on Sunday, January 5, due to the inclement weather. Unfortunately, that was the first Sunday of the month and the kids missed out on their visit to the Bible bucks



store. Well, the children came back with a vengeance on January 12, and cleared out a HUGE supply of goodies. It's so much fun to watch them choose their items and count out their Bible bucks. May we continually thank Almighty God for the indescribable gift of our children.

This month, our Parents and Me class (0-3-year-old students) will continue learning about God and His ways. Preschool and Kindergarten students will hear about some of the miracles of Jesus, including how He calmed a storm on the open sea, how He healed/raised from the dead the daughter of a well-known religious leader named Jairus, and how He fed 5,000 people with five small loaves of bread and two fish. The First and Second grade students will continue in the pages of the Old Testament and study about Moses, which will cover his birth, his encounter with God at the Burning Bush, the Plagues, as well as the Passover. The Third and Fourth grade students will continue their study on King David and end the month learning about his son Solomon. The Fifth-grade students will continue their study of the life of Martin Luther and his role in the Reformation of the church.

Let the children come to Me - Mark 10:14

During the month of February, our academic skill focus is on letters Qq, Rr, Ss, and Tt. We are also working on letter sound identification, and recognizing the sight words "see" and "the." We will learn to sort and identify coins, continue writing numbers, and explore patterning with hexagons and trapezoids. The children love exploring and manipulating pattern blocks and foam shapes to create objects and designs!





Throughout the month, we will be learning about Jesus' ministry. We will marvel at how He fed the crowd of more than 5,000 people with just two fish and five loaves. We will see His kindness and mercy in the way Jesus blessed the children, and also in the story of the good Samaritan. ### LIFE MINISTRY - TWO MEN



On Wednesday morning, December 4, 26-year-old Luigi Mangione shot Brian Thompson multiple times in the back on a sidewalk in Manhattan. Thompson was CEO of the United Health Care insurance firm and Mangione intended to settle scores with a healthcare industry that he held responsible for his injured back, Meanwhile, another 26-year-old, Daniel Penny, was standing trial in a Manhattan court for the chokehold death of Jordan Neely. Neely was a mentally ill man who threatened to kill people on a subway car on May 1, 2023. Penny intended to protect the women and children who were terrorized by Neely's behavior.

The reaction to both incidents says something about our culture. Forty-one percent of young people under the age of thirty applauded Mangione as a Robin Hood hero for striking a blow against health insurance companies. Apparently, a significant portion of our population feels the ends justify the means. Murder became heroism. Penny, prosecuted for criminally negligent homicide, faced the possibility of fifteen years in prison. Fortunately, he was acquitted, but why was his heroism prosecuted as murder?

What does this have to do with the pro-life movement? Everything. These two examples illustrate the opposing world views by which people live. Mangione exemplifies a self-centered culture that applauds living life on your own terms regardless of the consequences to others. Penny's actions were guided by a conscience answerable to God. He later said that he would not have been able to live with himself if he had not intervened on behalf of the other passenaers.

These competing world views have been dominating political debates for decades. It started with banning God in public schools, legalizing abortion, gay marriage, recreational drugs and now embracing transgenderism. In the name of "separation of church and state," Christianity has been removed from our culture. This void of goodness was replaced with a modern paganism. Many times, we failed to challenge these secular values, thinking it was easier to "not make waves."


But that's not how it worked. As our society divorced itself from God, it became increasingly dysfunctional: higher crime rates, more divorce, fewer marriages, more addiction, more pornography, more profanity, more depression, and more suicide. Sadly, many have accepted this dysfunction as the "new normal." The forty-one percent of young people who approved of Mangione's actions never knew a time when society was dominated by Christian values and traditions. Fully 28% of American adults are "nones": no religious affiliation.

In another New York subway, a woman was set on fire a few days before Christmas. Bystanders recorded her death on cellphones, but did nothing to help her. Two more people were stabbed in Grand Central Station on Christmas Eve. Again, no one even lifted a finger to call 911. Why? Has human life become so worthless?

Daniel Penny didn't think so and neither should we.
