JANUARY 2024 - God is with you wherever you go. Joshua 1:9

FEBRUARY 2024 - For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life. John 3:16

Our preschoolers are ready to ring in the New Year! We have been practicing songs to learn days of the week and months of the year, and we enjoy finding each friend's birthday on the bulletin board in our classroom. Each of these things help us understand how time goes by. Throughout January, our Bible focus will be on baby Jesus presented in the temple, the baptism and temptation of Jesus, and Jesus calls his disciples. We will learn about letters M, N, O, and P, and continue our focus on recognizing and writing numbers to 10. We will continue to build math concepts such as greater than/less than, patterning, and graphing through winter activities. Even though temperatures may be cold outside, we will see that January can be the warmest time of the year-warm mittens, hugs, cozy times by the fire, and making room for friends! Books such as The Mitten, The Mitten Tree, and Winter is the Warmest Season reinforce sharing, thinking of others, and giving to those in need. We enjoyed our January chapel with Pastor Brown and our children brought in an offering of hats and mittens to benefit Alaska Missions. We are also eager to celebrate Lutheran Schools Week beginning January 21! We have been memorizing the months of the year in preschool, and learning about the holidays that occur in each month. When many of us think about February, we think about Valentine's Day. What a wonderful time of year to focus on the love that God has for us! Throughout the month, we'll be focusing on Jesus' work as he began his ministry: the wedding at Cana, Jesus and Nicodemus, and how Jesus healed a blind man. We are learning names for Jesus. He is the Lamb of God, and yet he is also The Good Shepherd. We will be focusing on letters Qq, Rr, Ss, Tt, and letter sounds, numbers 6-10, comparing groups (greater than/less than/equal to), hexagons, trapezoids, and sorting pennies from other types of coins. We will also learn about past presidents, and notice them on the different types of coins we're discovering! Pastor Furgeson will lead our February chapel on February 7, and the children will be bringing an offering of toothpaste and toothbrushes. Be sure to let thoughts of God's love keep you warm through these weeks of winter! Mizzou running back and Lutheran South grad Cody Schrader won the Burlsworth Trophy in a ceremony at the University of Arkansas, recognizing him as the most outstanding former walk-on in college football this season. "My journey from high school to Truman State Division II to the University of Missouri wasn't easy. It definitely had a lot of lonely nights...But the only thing I

stayed true to was the work. The only thing that follows work is results, and I truly believe that anything you want in this life you can achieve. it just takes dedication, discipline, and you just have to love this game." Schrader finished his college career as a consensus All-American, solidifying his status as one of the nation's top players and the best running back to play for the Tigers.

Savi Butterfield was named a high school Athlete of the Week by the St. Louis Post-Dispatch! Savi returned from a month-long injury by scoring 25 points, four rebounds and four steals at a holiday tournament in Phoenix, Arizona. She then had a career-high 31 points and 10 steals in the next game, closing the tournament with 26 points, six steals, four rebounds and four assists.

Brian Lind logged his 300th career win as Lutheran South's head basketball coach. Coach Lind reached the milestone with a win against Valley Park earlier this season. Brian graduated from Green Park in 1986 and from Lutheran South in 1990. He is a former player, and has coached the Lancers for 24 years, with nine District Championships.

Senior Maddie Holland, sophomore Nathan Burbank, and freshman Mara Queen auditioned for and were accepted into the Metro 8 District Honor Band. Nathan was named to the District Concert Band on trombone, and Maddie was selected as alternate tenor sax. Mara was named to the District Jazz Band on bass.

Seniors Lindy French and Nathan Spear have been named the Lutheran Church Extension Fund fall scholar -athletes for their commitment to their classes and their sports. Lindy, who is involved in LuSo's STEM program, was first-team All-State with a batting average of .488. She was a leader on the softball team and invested in every player, exhibiting her faith on and off the field. Nathan, who is a member of the Wind Symphony and also involved in STEM, ran all four years on the cross country team. He finished his high school running career as the third fastest on the team.

There is still a significant amount of preventative trimming to be done, as well, to keep St. Trinity Cemetery beautiful, and safe, for everyone to enjoy. CHANGES TO THE ONLINE SERVICE FORMAT FOR 2024



In the new year, we are making a few changes to the uploading of our YouTube services and our system surrounding our channel. We will no longer be tracking attendance online. The reason for this is because our theology dictates the Divine Service is a physical gathering of God's people around His gifts, not a virtual one. The video of a service is not a person participating with the greater congregation, even if it is live, but is more like a devotional. We read a devotion someone else wrote and pray the prayer they wrote, but we do not confuse that with gathering with the author or praying with them. Likewise, the video is a personal and family devotion time. God still works through His word, but the two are qualitatively different.

The second aspect of that change will be the upload of the service will take place at noon, after the services are done, and the livestream will be ceased. This will help eliminate confusion regarding the theological difference between watching the service and in-person participation. We will still record and post the services, however, for later viewing as we currently offer, particularly for our homebound members. We hope this helps to clarify and emphasize the importance God places on the physical gathering of His people to receive His gifts of Word and Sacrament in His house.

I will add my sabbatical around that trip, effectively being absent from Memorial Day to Labor Day in 2024. During that time, our retired and other member pastors will be helping out here and there to assist Pastor Brown in the summer work, especially on the weekends. I and my family will be around for a couple of weddings, but that is about it. I am happy to answer any questions from anyone in the congregation regarding this event.

- 2. Pray. For them and that the Holy Spirit will help you share the Gospel of Jesus Christ with them.
- 3. Concerned you may not have the right words? Open Luther's Small Catechism with Explanation (2017) where you can learn and grow in knowledge of God's Word and how to answer some of life's tough questions.
- 4. Schedule a time to talk with someone on your list. At this meeting don't be quick to share, but instead listen and ask questions to learn what they think about Jesus. Repeat this step until you feel you really understand their position.
- 5. When asked a question or your opinion, do not argue or criticize, but say you will share with them what the Bible says on the matter.
- 6. When sharing what the Bible says, always have a Bible passage or note for them to reference later.
- 7. Lastly, always share with them that Jesus said He came to tell us the truth about God, the world, eternal life, and the great love of God for people. A truth that this true for you, as well as them.

LIFE MINISTRY - LIVE NOT BY LIES


Aleksander Solzhenitsyn was a famous Soviet dissident who coined the phrase: "live not by lies." That phrase has more meaning than ever since speaking and defending truth in our society has become a revolutionary act. As our culture rejects Christianity, it embraces and reinforces the lies of Satan. Abortion is being voted into state constitutions. Euthanasia is being peddled as "death with dignity." Traditional marriage is decreasing. Our young people question their gender identity. Addiction is at an all-time high. People are moving from major cities as crime and lawlessness increase.

Our culture declined gradually over decades because we as Christians merely accepted the changes as inevitable. The other common argument is "that's their right and their business." Yes, people have the right to do things that are morally wrong even if they are legal, but when most people accept immorality, society eventually falls apart. The Bible is full of such examples: Sodom, Gomorrah and the earth in Noah's time are extreme ones. The fall of Israel and Judah to foreign nations is a more common outcome.

It's easy to feel overwhelmed by all this, especially when Christianity is mocked and blamed for intolerance, bigotry and outdated values. It's even more difficult when co-workers, friends or relatives are the source of such mockery. Yet those are the people who need to be respectfully told God's truth and like it or not, we're the ones God can use to speak it. That's quite a challenge for many of us. We value our relationships, and we don't want to make waves. Yet every time we fail to stand up for the truth, we're allowing lies to remain affirmed and reinforced. We're reaping the consequences now.

January is a month for resolutions. How about this one? "Live not by lies." It's a challenge to live your life with integrity, not just by staying out of trouble and being a good person. It's a call to actively take a stand for what you know is right. You don't have to be aggressive or confrontational; just point out what you know to be right and let your light shine. As things get darker, that light becomes ever brighter. Live not by lies.
