PRAYER - A NEW SUNDAY MORNING SUMMER BIBLE STUDY










More than 150 athletes competed in our Special Olympics track and field meet. It was a great day to share God's love!

Katelynn Karsten, Grace Prange, and Josie Winfrey had an impressive finish to win the district title.

The boys tennis team won their third consecutive District championship, defeating Windsor 5-0 in the final round. The boys track and field team are District champions! Ben Long won the triple jump,



and Andrew Wilds took first in pole vault. James McCoy is a district champ in javelin. Seven additional athletes scored, qualifying for Sectionals. Ten athletes qualified on the girls' side, including Reese Schelp, who won the 800-meter run and Tess Kasparek, who advances in pole vault. The 4X400 relay made up of Reese Schelp,

Legendary coach Roy Pfund threw out the ceremonial first pitch at the Lutheran South vs. Rockwood game as we unveiled the new baseball scoreboard bearing his name. After an alumni and student poll, the Lutheran South community decided it would only be appropriate to have a "P" in field. During his distinguished tenure, he led the Lancers to six Conference championships, six District championships, two Sectionals, and an impressive winning percentage of over 70%. 

LIFE MINISTRY - VISIBILITY

"Through the love of Jesus Christ the Life Ministry Team exists to equip Peace Lutheran Church to sanctify life at all stages"



Easter Sunday, March 31, was declared "Transgender Day of Visibility" by our blasphemous president, who later denied saying this. Nothing was mentioned about Easter and the meaning it holds for millions of Americans. The following day was the White House Easter egg roll in which children were told to not draw pictures with religious themes. Easter eggs were seen, the meaning behind Easter was ignored. Let's look at this theme of visibility and ask five questions.

The first two questions go together. What is visible? What is invisible? With June being designated "Pride Month", rainbows, slogans and parades celebrating sexual perversion will be quite visible. The spiritual warfare and demonic forces behind this aren't so visible, but they're just as real. Political advertisements for maintaining abortion rights will be highly visible. The aborted children who will be victims of such rights won't be visible, but the shedding of innocent blood is still seen by their Father in heaven.

The Ten Commandments and prayer in public schools have become invisible. Christmas break has been turned into winter break. Christmas carols have been replaced by secular songs and "Merry Christmas" is now "Happy Holidays." Easter and Good Friday are often ignored altogether. Sporting events and shopping on Sunday mornings are visible. People attending church are increasingly less visible.

The third question is "Who sees this?" Everyone can see these events taking place. Only Christians have the spiritual eyes to see the consequences of the pagan practices that are replacing Christianity in our society. In Romans 1, the phrase "God gave them up" is used three times to describe the results of pagan choices. What were they given to? Lust, perversion, a debased mind, envy, murder, strife, deceit, maliciousness, insolence, arrogance and rebellion against God. Only the spiritually blind could embrace such a lifestyle.

The fourth question is "What is the cost?" The cost of visibility is becoming increasingly high in our nation. Ask 87-year-old Eva Edl who faces eleven years in federal prison for praying outside an abortion clinic. Or Jack Phillips, the Colorado baker who has been prosecuted repeatedly by the state of Colorado for refusing to bake cakes honoring gay weddings and other occasions pushed by LGBTQ organizations.

The price of invisibility is even higher. Things might seem okay when you comply with a culture hostile to Christianity, but you will lose your integrity. If you continue down this path, you will lose your soul. Proverbs 14:12 says: "There is a way that seems right to a man, but its end is the way to death."

Here's the final question. How visible is my Christianity to those around me? As our culture becomes darker, your light as a Christian shines brighter. Make each day a day of visibility for Jesus.

THE EXTRAORDINARY ORDINARY LIFE - YOU CANNOT STAY AS YOU WERE

In most modern adventure stories, the person involved has been chosen, somehow, to have special gifts and abilities that mark that person as the Adventurer. Once their special nature is known, they are thrust by that revelation into a quest usually with great, world-ending stakes.

There are moments even in the Bible like this. We have Abraham called out of Ur. We have David anointed by Samuel. We have Elisha chosen by Elijah. Of course, we have the Twelve Disciples called by Jesus to Himself. We have persons with a calling from the womb, Samson and John the Baptist, both of whom had their work foretold to their parents. Each was set apart to serve in a particular way as recorded in Scripture.

As far as I know, no angels spoke to *my* parents, nor did God ever speak to me immediately and personally in the manner like Moses and the others. I expect these realities are true for you also. But that does not negate the reality of your calling as Adventurer.

When God called you to Himself through Baptism and His Word, the Holy Spirit also did something to you. You are no longer what you once were. You are marked and more than marked; He transformed you. This is a positive transformation unlike, for example, the Lupin of Harry Potter becoming a lycanthrope. You were a sinner, but now God has also made you His Child. You are a holy one of God.

Don't yawn yet! You are familiar with that idea, but perhaps have forgotten its implications. Nearly every time in adventures, the Adventurer is set into a world-within-a-world, given a revelation of how things *really* are versus how most *think* they are, like the simulation for Neo in *The Matrix* or Harry Potter being a wizard, or Frodo facing the world beyond the Shire.

Just like those Adventurers, you have been brought into a shift in seeing the world differently than the rest of the persons in it, and you cannot go back to your ignorance. There is not a set of gods out there demanding sacrifices to bribe them or stave off their anger. You are not a collection of atoms up from the evolutionary goo who will breathe for a while and then be food for the worms.

Rather, you have been brought into the open secret of life: we are created in the image of God and those in Christ have been caught up into His life. You are an everlasting reality caught up in a quest with eternal stakes. You are made for something greater than just existing through your days. You are now a child of the King of the Universe.

The persons of the world are constantly deferring to political powers as the highest authority. But they are not. Religions in the world claim they have secrets to life, the universe, and everything, but they are as fictitious as Neo's simulation world. Only the Bible reveals the true nature of existence, what it is for, and to where you are headed.

You cannot stay as you were. You are given the gift to speak the truths of God into the world, the gift to call good "good" and evil "evil"—to call a thing what it is in a world that cannot in its brokenness. You have the gift to forgive a world that does not, and to speak words of life in Christ into a world epitomized by death. All of this while you are on the quest of eternal life in Christ yourself, to persevere against the powers assailed against your success.

Those fallen powers are vast and formidable. Make no mistake, this road is perilous and the stakes are no smaller than eternity.
