



*Confession and Absolution





1 Corinthians 15:1–11



PASTOR FURGESON IS GOING ON SABBATICAL: WHAT IS A SABBATICAL? As reported in an earlier newsletter, this summer, Pastor Furgeson is going on a sabbatical. It means a time of rest. A sabbatical is a time for a pastor to pause and reflect, to recenter his life spiritually and in other ways. It can also be a time to think through theological issues he has not had time to mentally engage. In Pastor's call documents to Peace, the list of duties and policies say he is supposed to take a sabbatical every 10 years. Entering now his 18th year, he thought it was probably about time to do so. He wants to emphasize a major point here: while most pastors take a sabbatical because they are "burning out" or are really struggling with some kind of issue, **that is not the case here**. He loves being at Peace, loves his job, has a happy family life, and is treated wonderfully by the congregation. He and his family will be going to see their relatives in Hong Kong. He will add his sabbatical around that trip, effectively being absent from Memorial Day to Labor Day in 2024. During that time, our retired and other member pastors will be helping out here and there to assist Pastor Brown in the summer work, especially on the weekends. Pastor Furgeson and his family will be around for a couple of weddings, but that is about it. Pastor is happy to answer any questions from anyone in the congregation regarding this event.
