THE GOOD NEWS OF A SAVIOR WHO COVERS OUR SIN



Old Testament Reading

¹Now the serpent was more crafty than any other beast of the field that the Lord God had made.

2 Corinthians 5:20b-6:10

Genesis 3:1-13,21

We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. ²¹For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

¹Working together with him, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. ²For he says,

"In a favorable time I listened to you, and in a day of salvation I have helped you."

THE BLESSING AND IMPOSITION OF ASHES

Psalm 69:16–18; Psalm 51:7

- Answer me, O LORD, for Your steadfast love is good; according to Your abundant mercy, turn to me.
- C Hide not Your face from Your servant; for I am in distress; make haste to answer me. Draw near to my soul, redeem me; ransom me because of my enemies!
- **P** The Lord be with you.
- **C** And with your spirit.

- O God, You desire not the death of sinners, but rather that they turn from their wickedness and live. We implore You to have compassion on the frailty of our mortal nature, for we acknowledge that we are dust and to dust we shall return.
