SAXON LUTHERAN MEMORIAL - GOFUNDME SUPPORT



On the evening of Sunday, March 30, a storm came through Frohna, Missouri and lightning struck a tree near the visitors center of the Saxon Lutheran Memorial, catching the tree and the center on fire. Thankfully, no

one was there at the time. The center was completely destroyed and all of the historical artifacts inside are also gone. By the time the local emergency response firefighters arrived it was totally engulfed in flames.

What is the Saxon Memorial? It is an outdoor history museum which includes many buildings and artifacts from the Saxon Germans who migrated from Saxony, Germany, and settled here and elsewhere in East Perry County, Missouri. The Saxon Memorial has been a place for Peace's 6th grade VBS class to visit each summer, participating in many hands-on activities, including their favorite, making butter!

SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS

Greetings to our Sunday School parents and fellow parishioners at Peace.

It's May and we are getting ready to close out yet another school year. There are only a few more lessons for the children in Sunday School and then we move onto the summer curriculum. We cannot express how much of a privilege and honor it has been to teach your child/ren the word of God during



this school year. "Behold, children are a gift from the LORD, the fruit of the womb a reward" Psalm 127:3. Almighty God holds instructors of His word to the highest standard and we continually pray that He gives us the wisdom and knowledge to teach His full counsel through Law and Gospel.

This month the Parents and Me class will be wrapping up their study of God's word using a variety of ways applicable to our youngest students. Our Preschool and Kindergarten students will look further at the resurrection, read about Jesus' appearance to Thomas, as well as His appearances on the Emmaus Road and in Galilee. The first and second grade students will continue in the Old Testament by learning about God's people entering the Promised Land, the Fall of Jericho, as well as Deborah, Samson, and Ruth. The fifthgrade students will begin a study entitled, Not-So-Nice Bible Stories (Gory Deaths Bible Study), published by Concordia Publishing House.



Did you know the Saint Louis County Department of Revenue has an application for Senior Property Tax Freeze Program? For eligibility qualifications and requirements contact 314-615-7100 and enter prompt 2. Paperwork and appointments are necessary. Application deadline is June 30, 2025. This is a Saint Louis County Program authorized by §137.1050 of the Revised Statues of the State of Missouri, that freezes certain real estate property taxes for eligible seniors. The program does not include personal property.

LIFE MINISTRY - A GOD WHO NEVER CHANGES



Can you believe that it has been five years since we went through the Covid lockdowns? Remember how terrified people were at the thought of contracting a disease that could prove fatal or permanently disabling? How about all the businesses that closed, leaving many unemployed? Remember being unable to visit loved ones in nursing homes or hospitals? Did you miss your friends at church? Did those Zoom calls replace face-to-face contact with friends? How did your kids or grandkids do with remote learning? Did you or any of your friends feel depressed by all the isolation and anxiety?

Thank goodness these changes were lifted and life has returned to normal, but our society is on the brink of some profound *permanent* changes brought about by Artificial Intelligence (AI). Recently, Elon Musk predicted that AI could surpass human intelligence within the next five years. AI would no longer be a tool controlled by humans; it would be a self-aware entity with a 20% chance of causing the extinction of humanity. How is that for progress?

Already, some professions are seeing the effects of AI as it performs research, writing and analysis currently done by well-paid professionals. A doctor's visit might include AI recording your conversation and offering advice. Shopping could be managed by an "AI assistant" that anticipates your needs and preferences, orders your groceries and schedules a time for them to be delivered when you are home. Some people may find their social needs met by an "AI companion" that interacts as a friend. Sounds crazy, but think about how cellphones have impacted human behavior. The first iPhone came out in mid-2007. While it brought so much convenience to our fingertips, it also resulted in a loss of privacy and social skills.

These changes will be fast and hard-hitting. They will force us to ask some basic questions about what it means to be human. We find fulfillment and self-worth through work and relationships. We take pride in learning new skills and acquiring knowledge. What becomes the purpose of an education when AI can out-perform us intellectually? What happens when you lose your job because of AI? What happens when social needs start being met with AI instead of people? How will we know that information, images and voices are from humans when AI is just as believable? How does it feel to live in a society in which every detail of your life is stored in a database and such information can be used to control you? What happens when war is waged by machines guided by an AI that lacks any moral compass?

Interesting times indeed. As humans, we find change inconvenient and unsettling: rapid change even more so. But always remember, we have a God who <u>never</u> changes. "Nevertheless, I am continually with you; you hold my right hand. You guide me with your counsel, and afterward you will receive me to glory." Psalm 73:23-24.
